Every agent for a principal, whether resident or non-resident, is required to furnish a return, demanded of his principal.

Every company is required to furnish in addition to the return of income, separate statements to accompany the return showing-

 - (d) the name and address of each non-resident person to whom dividends and/or interest in excess of £50 was paid or credited and the amount paid or credited to each during the year ended 30th June, 1950;
 - (e) the total amount of dividends and the total amount of interest paid or credited to non-residents during the year ended 30th June, 1950;
 - (f) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the period covered by the return, to non-resident debenture holders on money secured by debentures of the company, and used in Australia, or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in Australia, and to non-resident depositors on money lodged at interest in Australia with the company, after deducting-
 - (i) interest paid or credited outside Australia to non-residents on debentures issued outside Australia;
 - (ii) unless the Commissioner otherwise directs
 —interest paid or credited to a nonresident company carrying on business in
 Australia, which has a public officer duly
 appointed under the Income Tax Assessment Act; and
 - (iii) interest of £104 or less paid or credited to each non-resident not being a company;
 - (g) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the period covered by the return, in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Commissioner. to the Commissioner.

A further return is hereby required to be furnished by every company which, subsequently to the furnishing of the return and before the expiration of six months (or in the case of a non-resident company—nine months) after the close of the year of income, has paid or credited any dividend out of the profits of the year of income. Such further return is required to be furnished in the form provided for the purpose, on or before the expiration of seven months (or in the case of a non-resident company—ten months) after the close of the year of income, and shall show the following particulars:—

- (a) the amount of the dividend paid or credited;
- (b) the class of shares on which the dividend was paid or credited;
- (c) the date on which the dividend was declared;
- (d) the date on which the dividend was paid or credited;
- (e) the profits out of which the dividend was paid or credited;
- (f) the terms of the resolution under which the dividend was declared.

A statement showing the name and address of each depositor to whom interest in excess of £50 was paid or credited, and the amount of interest paid or credited to each during the year ended 30th June, 1950, is hereby required to be furnished by every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Australia.

Where the total income from all sources in Australia was derived solely from sources in the Northern Territory, the return is required to be furnished to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation for the Northern Territory, State Savings Bank Building, King William-street, Adelaide.

COUNTRIES TO WHICH THE INTERNATIONAL LOAD LINE CONVENTION APPLIES.

WHEREAS an International Load Line Convention (hereinafter referred to as "the Load Line Convention") was signed in London on the fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty:



LIVING ALLOWANCE.—A candidate who, on appointment, is obliged to live away from home, will be paid an allowance in addition to salary, sufficient to provide a net remuneration of approximately £91 per annum (in the case of Canberra £143 per annum) after deductions have been made for suitable board and lodging, superannuation, and other expenses. The allowance will be reduced by the amount of any increase in salary granted subsequent to appointment.

EXAMINATION.—After submitting applications, applicants will be required to undergo a competitive examination at short notice.

Spelling.—The candidate will be required to spell correctly 30 mis-spelled words. (Maximum marks, 180; pass marks, 108.)

Arithmetic.—First four rules, including British standard weights, measures and money. (Maximum marks, 180; pass marks, 105.)

A candidate will not be regarded as having passed the evamination unless he obtains a pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained for (a) Arithmetic, (b) Spelling, and where those marks are also equal (c) by lot.

ELIGIBILITY.—A successful candidate will be eligible for appointment at the centre at which he has qualified, and at other examination centres in that State, where vacancies exist after the appointment of such candidates as are successful at that centre. Eligibility will continue until the expiration of twelve months commencing on the date of publication in the Commonwealth Gazette of the results of the examination.

APPOINTMENT SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of the date of his birth, and a medical certificate satisfying the Board in such particulars as it may determine of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. Upon the confirmation of his appointment after probation an officer will be required to become a contributor under the Commonwealth Superannuation Act.
