WHEREAS by virtue of section one hundred and three of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* 1931-1948 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve, for any public purpose which he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of the Department of Civil Aviation the lands described in the Schedule hereto being Crown lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve for the purposes of the Department of Civil Aviation the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.—(D.I. 50/80).

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land situated in the Hundred of Bagot, County of Palmerston, containing an area of 36.7 perches and comprising the whole of Portion 1128; the said portion being formerly part of original Section 389, Hundred of Bagot.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the *Customs Act* 1901-1949 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by Proclamation appoint aerodromes, whether within the limits of a proclaimed port or otherwise, and fix their limits.

And whereas by section 16 of that Act it is enacted that aerodromes may be appointed for limited purposes or without such limitation.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the eleventh day of October, 1933, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 56, of the twelfth day of October, 1933, an aerodrome was appointed at Broome in the State of Western Australia for seaplanes and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the eleventh day of October, 1933, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 56, of the twelfth day of October, 1933, an aerodrome was appointed at Darwin in the Northern Territory and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the fourteenth day of November, 1934, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 75 of the fifteenth day of November, 1934, an aerodrome was appointed at Mascot in the State of New South Wales and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the fourth day of September, 1935, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 47, of the fifth day of September, 1935, an aerodrome was appointed at Essendon in the State of Victoria and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the eleventh day of January, 1935, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 3, of the seventeenth day of January, 1935, an aerodrome was appointed at Parafield in the State of South Australia and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the twenty-ninth day of June, 1938, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 39, of the thirtieth day of June, 1938, an aerodrome was appointed at Townsville in the State of Queensland and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the eighth day of June, 1939, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 37, of the fifteenth day of June, 1939, an aerodrome was appointed at Rose Bay in the State of New South Wales and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas by proclamation issued on the sixth day of November, 1946, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, No. 210, of the seventh day of November, 1946, an aerodrome was appointed at Eagle Farm in the State of Queensland and the limits of such aerodrome fixed.

And whereas it is desirable to cancel the said proclamations and appoint aerodromes at the following places:—

For Seaplanes—

- (a) Rose Bay, New South Wales.
- (b) Bowen, Queensland.
- (c) Darwin, Northern Territory.

For Landplanes—

- (a) Mascot, New South Wales.
- (b) Essendon, Victoria.
- (c) Eagle Farm, Queensland.
- (d) Townsville, Queensland.
- (e) Parafield, South Australia.

Now therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby cancel the said proclamations and appoint the following to be aerodromes within the meaning of the said Act and fix their limits as follows:—

For Seaplanes—

- (a) *Rose Bay, New South Wales.*

Firstly.—All that piece of land at Rose Bay Parish of Alexandria County of Cumberland State of New South Wales bounded as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the northeastern side of Sunderland Avenue with a northwestern side of New South Head Road and bounded thence by the aforesaid northeastern side of Sunderland Avenue bearing 144 degrees 30 minutes 25 seconds to its intersection with the sea wall and bounded thence generally northeasterly easterly and southeasterly by that sea wall to its intersection with the prolongation south westerly of the northwestern edge of the Clyde Brick Works' wharf thence by lines southwesterly approximately 17 feet and southeasterly approximately 75 feet southwesterly approximately 54 feet thence by other lines bearing 140 degrees 46 minutes 25 seconds 67 feet 2½ inches 230 degrees 46 minutes 25 seconds 131 feet and 140 degrees 46 minutes 25 seconds approximately 210 feet thence by part of a northwestern side and a northwestern side of New South Head Road bearing respectively 248 degrees 7 minutes 20 feet 4 inches and 245 degrees 38 minutes 371 feet 0½ inches to the point of commencement.

- (b) *Bowen, Queensland, for Refuelling only.*

Trading with the Enemy Act 1939-1947.

LICENCE.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the *Trading with the Enemy Act 1939-1947*, it is provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in that Act, the Governor-General may by licence under his hand, exempt any particular transaction or class of transactions from the provisions of that Act:

And whereas by licences dated the twenty-ninth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and the twentieth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, respectively, the classes of transactions therein specified were exempted from the provisions of that Act:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said Licences and to exempt from the provisions of that Act the classes of transactions specified hereunder:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) revoke the said Licences dated the twenty-ninth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and the twentieth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven; and
- (b) exempt from the provisions of the *Trading with the Enemy Act 1939-1947*, the following classes of transactions, namely:—
 - (i) Communications with any persons or body of persons of whatever nationality (and, if incorporated, wherever incorporated) resident or carrying on business in Japan;
 - (ii) Trade with or for the benefit of any government, public or other authority in Japan, with or for the benefit of any individual resident in Japan, or with or for the benefit of any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business in Japan, in pursuance of an agreement or contract made or entered into after the date of this Licence;

- (iii) The transfer on or after that date by or on behalf of any such authority, individual or body of persons of any securities, being annuities, stocks, shares, bonds, debentures or debenture stock registered or inscribed in any register, branch register or other book kept in the Commonwealth of Australia or in a Territory of the Commonwealth, which, on or after the date of this Licence, come into the ownership of any such authority, individual or body of persons;
- (iv) The allotment or transfer on or after that date of any such securities to or for the benefit of any individual who is an enemy subject resident in Japan, or any body of persons constituted or incorporated in or under the laws of Japan;
- (v) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the paying, transmitting or receiving, on or after that date of money, negotiable instruments, or securities for money to or for the benefit of or from any such authority, individual or body of persons:

Provided that nothing in this Licence shall be construed as authorizing any trade (except in the case of anything done under an authority, given generally or specially by the Minister of State for Trade and Customs, or an officer thereto authorized by that Minister) in respect of any property situate in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in a Territory of the Commonwealth, belonging to or held or managed at the date of this Licence on behalf of any such authority, individual or body of persons and as regards any property arising presently or at any future time out of that property.

For the purposes of this Licence—

- (i) "Japan" means all territory which was under Japanese sovereignty on the seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one; and
- (ii) "property" means real or personal property, and includes any estate or interest in real or personal property, any negotiable instrument, debt or other chose in action and any other right or interest, whether in possession or not.

FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE THIRD DIVISION OF THE COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE AS CLERK OR AS CADET.

Part A.—General Conditions of Examination.

A COMPETITIVE examination for appointment to the Third Division of the Commonwealth Public Service as Clerk or as Cadet will be held in conjunction with the Public Examinations in 1950, viz., the Leaving Certificate Examination in New South Wales, the Matriculation and the School Leaving Examinations, including Certificate from Class A Schools, in Victoria, the Senior Public Examination in Queensland, the Leaving and Leaving Honours Examinations in South Australia, the Leaving Certificate Examination in Western Australia, and the Matriculation and Schools Board Examinations in Tasmania.

A successful candidate will qualify for appointment in the State in which the examination is attended, and will also be eligible for consideration for appointment in any other State, and in the Australian Capital Territory, and in the Northern Territory. A candidate who undergoes examination in the Australian Capital Territory will be examined in the papers set for the Leaving Certificate Examination of New South Wales.

EXAMINATION CENTRES.—Candidates will be examined in each capital city and at each other centre or school where the public examinations in 1950 are held.

PERSONS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER.—(a) Males and unmarried females not on the permanent staff of the Commonwealth Public Service who are British subjects, and who were born not earlier than 1st March, 1927, (b) male and unmarried female former members of the Forces under the age of 51 years, and (c) permanent officers of the Service.

HOW TO MAKE APPLICATION.—Applications must be made on printed forms, which will be obtainable late in August and during September from the Secretary, Commonwealth Public Service Board, Canberra, and the Commonwealth Public Service Inspectors, Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth and Hobart.

In addition to lodging an application with the Secretary to the Commonwealth Public Service Board, Canberra, direct, every candidate is required to lodge, for the purposes of the State authority, a separate application with the authority controlling the Matriculation, Leaving, Senior Public or Schools Board Examination, not later than the date fixed by that authority for the receipt by it of applications.

A candidate in Victoria who desires to be examined only for appointment to the Commonwealth Public Service should include a statement accordingly in the separate application (without fee) which he is required to lodge with the Registrar of the University of Melbourne.

A candidate in South Australia who enters the Leaving Honour Examination is required by the State authority to enter also the Leaving Examination if the candidate desires to be examined in subjects of that examination, in addition to Honours subjects, for Commonwealth Public Service candidature.

EXAMINATION FEE.—No fee for Commonwealth Public Service candidature is payable by an applicant who is a candidate also in the Matriculation, Leaving, Class A Schools Certificate, Senior Public or Schools Board Examination.

A candidate in Victoria who is being examined only for admission to the Commonwealth Public Service must, however, remit a postal note for five shillings with the entry form required to be lodged with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Melbourne.

APPLICATIONS CLOSE.—Applications which must be sent to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector of the State in which the candidate is contesting the examination will be received at any time prior or subsequent to the examination, except in the case of applicants for Cadetships for whom the closing date for receipt of applications is 31st December, 1950. Applications should be lodged early.

The receipt of applications will be acknowledged. Applicants who do not receive such acknowledgment within twenty-one days should communicate with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector of the State.

Advancement of Clerks from commencing salary to £517 per annum in the case of males, £410 per annum in the case of females, is by annual increments, and thereafter by promotion. The salaries quoted elsewhere in this notification are applicable to males only. The following combinations of subjects are not permitted:—

- Commercial Practice I. with Commercial Practice II.;
- Shorthand I. with Shorthand II.;
- Technical Drawing A with Technical Drawing B.

PASS CONDITIONS.—Four subjects must be passed, including English. If the candidate has passed in English at a previous examination of this nature, any other subject may be substituted to make up the minimum of four required to qualify.

A candidate who passes in four subjects at this examination, but fails in English, may apply to the Inspector for recognition as a successful candidate if a pass is obtained in such compulsory subject at any supplementary examination conducted by the State authorities.

Candidates may take one or two, but not more than two, additional subjects with a view to advancing their positions on the list of successful candidates. The maximum number of subjects is six.

In Tasmania a candidate at the Schools Board Examination must also satisfy the requirements of the Schools Board of Tasmania for the grant of a Schools Board Certificate.

In Victoria, candidates from Class A Schools will acquire eligibility for appointment by gaining the Headmaster's Certificate, provided that the subjects passed comply with the specified requirements.

HONOURS SUBJECTS.—At the examinations in New South Wales and South Australia, where separate Honours papers are set, a candidate who passes in the Honours papers will be given extra credit for Honours work. In New South Wales the Honours subjects which a candidate may take will be limited to the number allowed by the rules governing the Leaving Certificate Examination in that State.

A candidate in Victoria or Tasmania who passes in a subject or subjects in the Matriculation Examination selected for Commonwealth Public Service candidature will be given extra credit for each worked paper in such subject.

PERIOD OF ELIGIBILITY FOR APPOINTMENT.—Except in the cases of former members of the Forces, candidates who qualify will be eligible for appointment within the period of twelve months commencing on the date of publication in the *Commonwealth Gazette* of the results of the examination or until they reach the age of 24 years, whichever is the earlier. The eligibility of qualified candidates who are former members of the Forces will continue until they reach the age of 51 years, but will cease on attainment of that age.

ESTIMATE OF APPOINTMENTS.—The number of appointments proposed to be made to the position of Clerk is 1,500.

ORDER OF APPOINTMENT.—Qualified candidates who are former members of the Forces will be given preference as prescribed for appointment. Subject to that preference and to the requirement that a candidate cannot be appointed under the age of sixteen years, appointments as Clerk will be made from the lists of qualified candidates in order of merit, males and females respectively. If two or more candidates are bracketed as equal in examination results, their order of merit on the list of successful candidates in relation to each other is determined by lot; as are also candidates from Class A schools in Victoria.

APPOINTMENT SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS.—Appointments will be made on six months' probation. An appointee must produce evidence of the date of birth and a medical certificate, satisfying the Board, in such particulars as it may determine, of the appointee's sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects. Upon confirmation of appointment an officer will be required, if eligible, to contribute to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund. Appointment as cadet will be conditional on the appointee furnishing an undertaking to pursue to completion the course of instruction prescribed for the particular cadetship.

Qualified candidates who, on appointment, are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within fourteen days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

COST OF CONVEYANCE TO PLACE OF APPOINTMENT.—An appointee will be required to defray the cost of fares to the place of appointment, but any expense on fares (second class by railway) in excess of £3 incurred may be refunded by the department upon the expiration of three months from the date of commencing duty.

REFUSAL OF APPOINTMENT.—If a successful candidate declines to accept an appointment or fails to reply within seven days to a communication from the Board or a Public Service Inspector, or the Chief Officer, addressed to the last known place of residence, respecting the nomination for appointment to the Public Service, the name may be removed from the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment".

Part B—Cadetships.

Persons seeking appointment as Cadet must comply with the general conditions of the examination set out in Part A.

Eligibility for appointment as Cadet will be acquired by candidates who satisfy the pass conditions and whose passes include the subjects or provide the qualifications shown against the respective designations.

Cadet Architect.—English, Mathematics, Physics and Drawing.

Cadet Biochemist.—English, Mathematics and Chemistry.

Cadet Draftsman (Postmaster-General's Department and Interior).—English, Mathematics and Physics.

Cadet Draftsman (Supply and Development).—English, Mathematics and preferably Physics.

Cadet Engineer (Supply and Development and Works and Housing).—English, Mathematics and Physics. Matriculation in Engineering at an Australian University.

***Cadet Engineer** (Postmaster-General's Department).—English, Mathematics and Physics.

Cadet Geologist or Cadet Geophysicist.—English, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. Matriculation in Science at an Australian University.

Cadet Meteorologist.—English, Mathematics and Physics. Matriculation in Science at an Australian University.

Cadet (Personnel).—The University Courses make Matriculation desirable.

Cadet Quantity Surveyor.—English, Mathematics and Physics.

Cadet Radio Inspector.—English, Mathematics and Physics.

Cadet Survey Draftsman.—English and Mathematics.

Cadet Surveyor.—English, Mathematics (including Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry) and Physics.

* A candidate for an Engineer Cadetship must be eligible to attend lectures and examinations at the University in Mathematics and Physics (or Natural Philosophy) as prescribed for the course in Engineering or Science. Matriculation is desirable.

SALARIES AND CONDITIONS OF ADVANCEMENT.

Salaries payable to Cadets are set out in Part A. Upon completion of three years training and subject to satisfactory diligence, conduct and progress during training, a Cadet, if an adult, is paid £472 per annum. The salary range upon completion of the Cadetship is shown against the respective Cadetships.

A Cadet Architect upon completion of a period of five years' training and a University degree course or Technical College diploma course in Architecture, will be designated Architect, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Biochemist, upon fulfilment of the prescribed requirements in respect of training (five years, unless an appropriate University degree course has been completed), course of study and examinations, will be designated Biochemist, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Draftsman will, upon satisfactory completion of five years' training and a prescribed course of study at a Technical School or other institution approved by the Board, in conjunction with evidence of efficiency and aptitude for the work of Draftsman, be designated Draftsman, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Engineer, Department of Works and Housing, upon completion of a period of five years' training, and a full-time University degree course in Engineering, will be designated Engineer, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Engineer, Department of Supply and Development, upon completion of a period of six years' training, and a full-time University degree course in Engineering, will be designated Engineer, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

Cadet Engineer, Postmaster-General's Department, upon completion of a period of four years' training and having passed the requisite examination, will be designated Engineer, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Geologist or Cadet Geophysicist will, upon fulfilment of a period of four years' training and completion of a full-time University degree course in Science, be designated Geologist, Grade 1, or Geophysicist, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Radio Inspector will, on satisfactory completion of four years' training, and having passed the requisite examinations, be designated Radio Inspector, Grade 1 (£517-£792).

A Cadet Meteorologist, upon completion of a period of four years' training, and having passed the requisite examinations, will be designated Meteorologist, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet (Personnel) upon completion of a period of four years' training and passing the requisite examinations, will be designated Personnel Officer (£562-£652).

A Cadet Quantity Surveyor upon completion of a period of five years' training and a Technical College diploma in Quantity Surveying, will be designated Quantity Surveyor, Grade 1 (£517-£742).

A Cadet Surveyor, upon completion of a period of five years' training, and the examinations conducted by a Board of Surveyors of an Australian State for a Certificate of Competency as a Surveyor, will be designated Surveyor, Grade 1 (£517-£742).
