PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by virtue of section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1948 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, resume the whole or any portion of lands reserved in pursuance of that Ordinance:

And whereas by Proclamation dated 17th July, 1946, and published in *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* No. 129, dated 18th July, 1946, certain lands in the Northern Territory of Australia described in the Schedule thereto were reserved for the purpose of Travelling Stock Reserves:

And whereas it is desirable to resume portion of the lands reserved by the said Proclamation, insofar as the said reservation extends to the area of land described in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby resume that portion of the said land reserved by the said Proclamation insofar as the said reservation extends to the area of land described in the Schedule hereto.—(D.I. 50/164.)

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land situated in the Northern Territory of Australia and containing an area of 557 acres more or less: Commencing at a point on the south-western side of the Stuart Highway bearing 295 degrees 9 minutes 45 seconds and distant 7,616 feet from No. 8 Bore (Kulamindini) on the Newcastle Waters to Queensland Stock Route (this commencing point also bears 303 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds and is distant 2,510 feet from the most easterly corner of Lot No. 20, Elliott Townsite); thence on a bearing of 213 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds for 2,260 feet; thence by a line bearing 123 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds for about 8,668 feet to its intersection with a line bearing 213 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds from the most easterly corner of Lot No. 62 Elliott Townsite; thence on a bearing of 33 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds by the lastmentioned line and its north-easterly prolongation and passing through the most easterly corner of Lot No. 62 for 2,800 feet; thence on a bearing of 303 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds for about 8,668 feet; thence on a bearing of 213 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds for 540 feet to the point of commencement.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by virtue of section 111 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1948 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, constitute and define the boundaries of new counties, hundreds and towns and distinguish each by a name:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, set apart as town lands any Crown land within the boundaries of a town:

And whereas it is desirable to constitute and define the boundaries of a new town and to distinguish the said new town by the name of Elliott and to set apart the Crown land within the said new town as town lands:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare that all that portion of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto shall from the date hereof be constituted a new town to be called the Town of Elliott and that the boundaries of the said new town shall be as defined in the said Schedule:

And I do further declare that all Crown land within the said new town shall be set apart as town lands.—(D.I. 49/1861.)

- (a) if the promotion is to be made in a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State;
