### COMMONWEALTH REFORTING BRANCH RULES. Short title.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Commonwealth Reporting Branch Rules.

### Definitions.

2. In these Rules unless the contrary intention appears-"Department" includes any branch of a Department and

any authority under the Commonwealth.
"Permanent Head" includes the Chief Officer of any
Branch of a Department or of any authority under the Commonwealth.

"The Branch"
Branch. means the Commonwealth Reporting

"The Secretary" means the Secretary to the Attorney-General's Department.

Services not available except in accordance with Rules.

3. The services of the Branch shall not be available to any Department, except in accordance with these Rules.

### Applications for reporting.

(4.)—(1.) Any Department which desires the services of the Branch shall apply in writing to the Secretary.

(2.) Each application under this Rule shall be lodged with the Secretary, (except in cases of great urgency) not less than fourteen days prior to the date upon which the services of the Branch are required:

Provided that, where the Secretary is satisfied that in any case, owing to the urgency of the matter it is impossible to make the application at least fourteen days prior to that date, the Secretary may deal with an application lodged with him less than fourteen days prior to that date.

- (a) full particulars of the services required;
  (b) the probable period during which the services required;

## Grant of application

5.—(1.) The Secretary shall consider any application lodged with him which accords with the last preceding rule and may grant the application in whole or in part or refuse it. (2.) In granting any application under these Rules the Secretary may attach to the grant such conditions as he thinks fit as to the number of copies of reports to be supplied and the persons who may receive such copies.

## Payment for copies.

6. Payment shall be made to the Attorney-General's Department for reports at the rates fixed from time to time by the Attorney-General, full particulars of which shall be furnished by the Secretary on request:

Provided that the Secretary may waive payment for reposupplied in cases falling in his opinion within any class cases specified by the Attorney-General as proper for supply of transcript without charge. class of the

## Unauthorized supply of copies

7. No Permanent Head, Department or officer shall supply or promise to supply copies of reports to any person unless payment is made therefor to the Attorney-General's Department at the rates ruling in respect of reports supplied by the Branch to the public.

## Reports not to be copied.

8. No Permanent Head, Department or officer shall make, or cause or permit to be made, any copy of any report supplied to him or it in pursuance of an application granted under these Rules.

REGULATION 130 OF CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

(T. & C. 48/8920.)

(This used in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of suspension railways upon exportation of such suspension railways and after compliance with the said regulations.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate Commonwealth Public Service Inspector within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Under Section 50 (7a) of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, the Board may regard an appeal as having been made against a provisional promotion notified hereunder by any officer who, at any time within the time prescribed for lodging an appeal, is absent on leave for war service, or is absent from Australia on official duty.

Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged in respect of each. The grounds of appeal must be as prescribed in Section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, viz.:—

- (1) Where a promotion is to be made to a position prescribed in Regulation 1090, viz.:—Assistant, Grade 1—female; Assistant, Grade 2—male or female; Labourer; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Line Foreman, Grade 1; Mail Officer; Postal Officer; Postal Assistant (Mail); Postal Clerk (Fourth Division); Senior Postal Clerk, Grade 1; Assistant Storeman; Storeman; Grade 1; Storeman, Grade 2; Telegraphist (Fourth Division); Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Searcher and Watchman—that the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient.
- (2) In other cases
  - (a) Superior efficiency; or
  - (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
- \* Cost of Living adjustments payable pursuant to Regulation 106A-
  - (a) Adult male officers, married minors (male) in receipt of allowance under Regulation 87B, and minors (male) occupying positions
  - for which no minor rates are prescribed—£136 per annum;

    (b) Adult female officers, officers 19 and 20 years of age and minors (female) occupying positions for which no minor rates are prescribed—£91 per annum;

    (c) Minors (female) and unmarried minors (male) under 19 years of age—£68 per annum.
