AUSTRALIAN MILITARY FORCES.

For outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty:

GEORGE CROSS. (Posthumous.)

Private Benjamin Gower Hardy, N.103951. Private Ralph Jones, N.244527.

On the night of the 4th-5th August, 1944, the above soldiers were on duty at the No. 12 Prisoner-of-War Camp, Cowra, as members of a Vickers M.G. Crew guarding the

Compound in which were interned the Japanese Prisoners-of-War.

There were over 1,100 Japanese prisoners in the Compound at the time, and they staged a mass outbreak never before witnessed in the history of the British Empire.

Privates Hardy and Jones displayed outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty in their fight to death against an overwhelming onslaught of fanatical Japanese who stormed out over the perimeter armed with knives, baseball clubs and other weapons and bore down on the M.G. crew. Privates Hardy and Jones stood their ground and continued to work their gun until bashed to death by the Japanese who were worked up to a state of frenzy with the objective of either wiping out the Garrison or getting wiped out themselves.

These soldiers met their deaths in the true British spirit of sacrifice for their country.

ONDITIONS GOVERNING RECRUITMENT AND ADVANCEMENT OF CADET DRAFTSMEN (PHOTO-GRAMMETRIC), FORESTRY AND TIMBER BUREAU, DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR. CONDITIONS

Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern recruitment and advancement of Cadet Draftsmen (Photogrammetric):-

- 1. APPOINTMENT.—Eligibility for appointment to a position of Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) will be acquired by candidates who have passed the examination for appointment to the Third Division of the Commonwealth Public Service as Clerk or Cadet, based on the Leaving, Senior Matriculuation and Schools Board Examinations in the various States; with passes in the subjects of English, Mathematics, and Drawing.
- 2. PROMOTIONS OR TRANSFER.—Eligibility for promotion or transfer as Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) will be acquired by officers who have-
 - (a) passed an examination held under the Commonwealth Public Service Act and Regulations for appointment, promotion or transfer to the Third Division as Clerk or Cadet; or
 - (b) passed the Leaving, Senior or Schools Board Certificate Examination of an Australia State or an examination which qualifies for matriculation in an Australian university,

provided that in either case the officer passes in the subjects of English, Mathematics, and Drawing.

Promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) of officers who are eligible in accordance with this notification will be effected pursuant to the provisions of section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1948.

Applications by eligible officers for promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) should be made in response to a notification published in the Commonwealth Gazette inviting such applications.

- 3. Period of Elicibility.—(i) Except as provided in paragraph 3 (iii), eligibility for promotion or transfer will terminate on the expiration of a period of three years, or on the officer attaining the age of twenty-four years, whichever is the earlier: Provided, however, that in the cases of officers who, prior to attaining the age of twenty-four years, commenced leave of absence for war service, eligibility will continue for a period of three years commencing on the date of termination of the leave of absence for war service, or until the officer attains the age of twenty-four years, whichever is the later, subject in cases in which the period of leave of absence for war service is less than three years to limitation of extension of the normal period of eligibility to the period of the leave of absence for war service.
- (ii) The period of three years prescribed in paragraph 3 (i) means
 - respect of an examination for the Leaving Ceror the Senior Public Examination, three years commencing on the first day of January of the year next following that in which the examination was held, or in respect of a supplementary examination, the first day of January preceding that examination. that examination.
 - (h) In respect of the Leaving Certificate, Matriculation or Schools Board Certificate or Senior Public Examination passed by attendance at two or more examinations held at intervals of twelve months or longer, three years commencing on the first day of January of the year next following that in which the first examination was attended.
 - (c) In respect of an examination for appointment to the Commonwealth Service based on the Leaving Certificate, Matriculation, or Schools Board Certificate or Senior Public Examination, three years com-mencing on the first day of January of the year next following that in which the examination was held.
 - (d) In respect of other prescribed examinations, three years commencing on the first day of the month following that in which the results of the first examination in the acquisition of eligibility were published.
- (iii) The Board may extend the period of eligibility if, while it is current, an officer has completed or is pursuing at a University or a Technical College a course of study which in its opinion warrants the grant of such extension, but in no case will eligibility be extended beyond the day preceding the twenty-fourth anniversary of the officer's birth, except as provided in paragraph 3 (i).
- 4. SALARY AND ADVANCEMENT.—The salary range of a Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) will be £130-£381. On attaining 21 years of age he will be paid the minimum salary of £291 (standard) per annum.
- A Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) will become a Draftsman (Photogrammetric), Grade 1 (£381-£606), upon—
 - (a) satisfactory completion of a period of five years'
 - training as Cadet; and
 (b) passing such examinations for advancement as are determined by the Public Service Board;
- 5. Course of Study.—Under sub-paragraph (b) of the preceding paragraph, the Board has approved the examinations in the following:-
 - (a) The following subjects of the Survey Certificate Course at Sydney Technical College:—

First year-Diploma Mathematics I. Applied Science for Surveyors. Second year-Surveying for Engineers I. Forestry. Plotting and Plan Drawing.

Fourth year—Land Surveying I.
Fifth year—Land Surveying II.

- 6. FAILURE AT EXAMINATION.—Subject to section 67 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, if a Cadet Draftsman (Photogrammetric) fails to obtain satisfactory results at the prescribed examinations, the Permanent Head of the Department will report to the Public Service Board as to the general efficiency and aptitude of the officer, and his fitness to continue

the cadetship. Upon receipt of such report, the Board will decide whether the cadetship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed

7. FEES.—Refund of fees in accordance with the following scale will be allowed to Cadets in respect of subjects studied as part of their approved course of training:—
