AUTHORITY

Commonwealth of Australia. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Defence Act 1903-49 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Force, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval, military or air-force exercises or purposes.

And whereas by the said section it is provided that com-pensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use.

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as shall be directed in writing by the officer who shall at any time during the continuance of this Authority he helding the office or professions the during the Canaral be holding the office or performing the duties of the General Officer Commanding Northern Command to enter upon the lands in the State of Queensland described in the schedule hereto and use them for training, manœuvres or other military exercises or purposes on the sixteenth and seventeenth days of September, 1950.

And I direct that all claims for compensation for damage or loss alleged to have been sustained by reason of any such entry and use shall be submitted in writing to the General Officer Commanding Northern Command, Victoria Barracks, Queensland, within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss.

THE SCHEDULE.

All those pieces and parcels of land being vacant Crown land between towns of BROADBEACH and NORTH BURLEIGH, in the Parish of GILSTON, County of WARD in the State of QUEENSLAND, bounded on the NORTH, but not including Sections X, IV, 11 fronting BRITTANIA AVENUE; on the SOUTH, but not including, Sub divisions of Portions 55; on the WEST by Pacific Highway; on the EAST by PACIFIC OCEAN.

PRICES ORDER No. 26 (A.C.T.).

Eggs in Shell-Sales by Retail-Australian Capital Territory and Jervis Bay.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Ordinance* 1949, I Clifford Edwin Williamson, Controller of Prices, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 26 (A.C.T.).

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3407 is hereby revoked insofar as it applies to the Australian Capital Territory and Jervis Bay.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-"Jervis Bay" means the Territory accepted by the Commonwealth in pursuance of the Jervis Bay Acceptance Act 1915, and described in the agreement set out in the Schedule to that Act;

 "wholesale prevailing price" means, in relation to the
 - sale by retail of any kind and quality of eggs in shell in the Australian Capital Territory or in Jervis Bay, the price payable, at the time of such sale, for that kind and quality of eggs in shell to the Egg Marketing Board for the State of New South Wales.

Maximum prices-Sales by retail.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which eggs in shell may be sold by retail to be the sum of-

 - (a) the wholesale prevailing price;(b) the margin as specified in the Schedule to this Order; and
 - (c) an allowance of 2d. per dozen to cover cost of transport incurred in conveying the eggs in shell to the retail seller's store.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which eggs in shell specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by retail in the Australian Capital Territory or Jervis Bay by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Controller by notice in writing to that person.

(b) the date of the delivery of that footwear into his store;

(c) the name and address of the person from whom he purchased that footwear; and
(d) (i) in respect of specified footwear purchased from a source within the Commonwealth of Australia, the point of delivery and the cost of that footwear: or

(ii) in respect of specified footwear imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia by the retail trader, the landed cost of that footwear:

Tasmania.—Males under the age of 21 years at at 1st January, 1951 (provided they have attained their 15th birthday) who have satisfactorily completed the third-year course of secondary education.

The examination will be restricted to persons who are British subjects.

APPLICATION FORMS .- Applications to enter for the Commonwealth Bank Entrance Examination must be made on printed forms which may be obtained from any branch of the bank, or from Principals or Headmasters of schools presenting candidates for the Public Examinations.

COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109.

THE following promotions are provisional and subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and, where, consequent upon another provisional promotion, shall be dependent upon the latter being confirmed. Appeals should be lodged, either by letter or telegram, within twenty-one days of the date of this notification, as follows:—

(a) if the promotion is to be made in a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State;
(b) if the promotion is to be made in the Australian Capital Territory, with the Public Service Inspector in Canberra, unless the promotion is to be made to a vacancy in the Postmater-General's Department, in which case the officer shall lodge his appeal with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;

(c) if the promotion is to be made in the Northern Territory—

(i) with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane, in the case of a promotion to a vacancy in the Department of Trade and Customs

- 6. Promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet Engineer of officers who are eligible in accordance with this notification will be effected pursuant to the provisions of section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1948.

(a) satisfactory completion of a period of six years training as Cadet; and
(b) passing such examinations for advancement as are

determined by the Public Service Board;

provided that in the case of successful applicants who have already satisfactorily completed one or more years in the Faculty of Engineering of an Australian University or in the case of successful applicants whose eligibility for appointment was gained under paragraphs 1 (e) or 2 (c) above, those who have already satisfactorily completed two or more years of the course prescribed for the Fellowship Diploma in Chemical Engineering, Melbourne Technical College, or equivalent qualifications, the period of training may be reduced accordingly.
