



CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE COMPETITION FOR A DESIGN OF A JUBILEE MEDAL.

A candidate will not be regarded as having passed the examination unless she secures at least half of the full marks in each of the subjects of Spelling, English and Arithmetic.

ORDER OF APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER.—Candidates who qualify will be listed in two groups—

(i) Officers of the Service;

(ii) Candidates from without the Service.

Appointments and transfers will be effected in order of merit on the respective lists. Where two or more candidates secure the same total of marks their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained for (a) English, and (b) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal (c) by lot. The papers in Spelling will be marked first, and the papers in English of candidates who failed in Spelling will not be marked, nor will those candidates be awarded marks for Arithmetic.

Approximately one-half of the vacancies will be allotted to qualified candidates who are officers of the permanent staff of the Commonwealth Public Service, and one-half to qualified candidates who are not on the permanent staff, any shortage in one source to be made up from qualified candidates in the other source.

VACANCIES.—It is estimated that 50 trainees will be selected, to commence training early in February, 1951.

Period of Elicibility.—A candidate who qualifies will be eligible for appointment only until the expiration of twelve months commencing on the date of publication in the Commonwealth Gazette of the results of the examination.

Conditions of Appointment.—A successful candidate from outside the Service must, upon appointment, produce evidence of the date of her birth, and a medical certificate satisfying the Board in such particulars as it may determine, of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects, but she should not undergo medical examination until instructed by the Board to do so. Upon the confirmation of her appointment an officer will be required to become a contributor under the Commonwealth Superannuation Act.

Qualified candidates who upon appointment are temporarily employed, or who take up duty within fourteen days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for

seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

The rates of salary quoted above are current rates payable, but the amounts are subject to variation in accordance with the rise and fall of the index numbers of the cost of living.
