## PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, the Governor-General has proclaimed the existence of war:

And whereas by section 112 of the Customs Act 1901-1949 it is enacted that in time of war the Governor-General may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of any goods:

And whereas by the Proclamations specified in the schedule hereto the exportation of certain goods was prohibited unless the consent in writing of the Minister to the exportation of the goods liad first been obtained:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said Proclamations:

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations.

Appeals should be lodged, either by letter or telegram, within twenty-one days of the date of this notification, as follows:—

(a) if the promotion is to be made in a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State;
(b) if the promotion is to be made in the Australian Capital Territory, with the Public Service Inspector in Canberra, unless the promotion is to be made to a vacancy in the Postmaster-General's Department, in which case the officer shall lodge his appeal with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
