WHEREAS by section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1947 it is enacted (inter alia) that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any plants or any parts of plants, and that the power of prohibition shall extend to authorize prohibition generally, or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas by Quarantine Proclamation No. 8r, the importation into Australia of nursery stock and cuttings and scions of same was prohibited except in accordance with the provisions of the Quarantine (Plants) Regulations:

And whereas it is desirable to make other provision in relation thereto:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) amend Quarantine Proclamation No. 8P by omitting the words-
- "8. Nursery Stock and cuttings and scions of the same."; and

 (b) prohibit, except in pursuance of a permit issued by the Director of Quarantine and in accordance with the conditions and restrictions specified in the Quarantine (Plants) Regulations, the importation into Australia of all living plant material used in a nursery including in a nursery including-
 - (i) woody plants;
 - (ii) seedlings of herbaceous plants; and (iii) slips, cuttings, layers, runners, offsets and similar material used for vegetative propa-gation of woody or herbaceous plants.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 36P.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949, I, Clifford Edwin Williamson, Controller of Prices, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 41 (A.C.T.).

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1015 is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply to the Territory accepted by the Commonwealth in pursuance of the Jervis Bay Acceptance Act 1915 and described in the Schedule to that Act.

- 4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 "ceiling date" in relation to any goods or services sold or supplied by any person on any terms and conditions means
 - (a) where that person upon the twentieth day of July, 1950, sold or supplied substantially identical goods or services, as the case may be, upon terms and conditions substantially identical with the firstmentioned terms and conditions—the twentieth day of July, 1950; or
 - (b) where that person did not upon the twentieth day of July, 1950, sell or supply substantially identical goods or services, as the case may be, upon terms and conditions substantially identical with the firstmentioned terms and conditions—the last date prior to the twentieth day of July, 1950, upon which that person sold or supplied substantially identical goods or services, as the case may be, upon terms and conditions so substantially identical;

"goods" means goods declared by the Minister by notice in the Gazette to be declared goods for the purposes of

the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949; services" means services declared by the Minister by notice in the Gazette to be declared services for the purposes of the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949;

st" in relation to goods means as regarding goods sold by any person other than a manufacturer the sum of money, or other valuable consideration, paid or furnished or agreed to be paid or furnished, for or in respect of those goods, by that person.

Ceiling prices and rates for goods and services of a kind previously sold or supplied.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price or rate, as the 5. I fix and declare the maximum price or rate, as the case may be, at which any person may sell or supply on any terms and conditions any goods or services for which a maximum price or rate is not fixed by or under any Prices Order made under the *Prices Regulation Ordinance* 1949, or by or under any notice in writing given in pursuance of any such Order to be the price or rate at which that person sold or supplied substantially identical goods or services on the ceiling date on terms and conditions substantially identical with the firstmentioned terms and conditions.

Maximum prices for goods not previously sold or supplied.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell any goods which are not substantially identical with any goods which he sold prior to the twentieth day of July, 1950, and for which a maximum price is not fixed by or under any Prices Order made under the *Prices Regulation Ordinance* 1949, or by or under any notice in writing given in pursuance of any such order to be the cost of the goods to that person: Provided that on application by any person the maximum price at which those goods may be sold by that person shall be such price as may be fixed by the Controller.

Application for maximum prices in certain cases.

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of the last preceding 7. Notwithstanding the provisions of the last preceding paragraph, any person who manufactures any goods or supplies any services, as the case may be, which are not substantially identical with any goods or services which he sold or supplied prior to the twentieth day of July, 1950, and for which a maximum price or rate is not fixed by or under any prices order made under the *Prices Regulation Ordinance* 1949, or by or under any notice in writing given in pursuance of any such order, shall not sell those goods or supply that service unless and until he has made a written request to the Controller to fix the maximum price at which those goods may be sold or the maximum rate at which that those goods may be sold or the maximum rate at which that service may be supplied and the Controller has fixed the maximum price or maximum rate accordingly.

Persons operating more than one place of business.

8. For the purposes of this Order if a person operates more than one place of business he shall in respect of each such place of business be deemed to be a separate seller or supplier.

Price or rate differences to be observed.

- 9. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a seller or supplier of any goods or services has customarily allowed any difference in price or rate
 - (a) to any person or to persons included in any class
 - (b) in respect of sales or supplies of certain quantities of goods or services or
 - (c) in respect of sales or supplies of goods or services under certain conditions of sale or supply,

the maximum price or rate fixed by or under this Order in respect of those goods or services shall, in the case of sales or supplies to any such person or persons or of such quantities or under such conditions, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Order not to apply to perishable primary products.

- 10. This Order shall not apply to declared perishable primary products including, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any goods included in the following classes of perishable primary products, which may from time to time be declared goods—
 - (a) vegetables;
 - (b) fruit.

Power to fix prices and rates by notice.

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price or rate at which any goods or services specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold or supplied by any person to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Controller by notice in writing to that person to that person.

Prices orders not to be superseded.

12. Nothing in this Order shall prevent any order under the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949, operating to fix a maximum price or rate for any goods or services other than the maximum price or rate fixed by or under this Order for those goods or services.

Prescribed date.

13. I declare-

- (a) the twentieth day of July, 1950; or
- (b) where, in relation to the sale or supply of any goods or services, the seller did not on the twentieth day of July, 1950, sell or supply substantially identical goods or services—the last date prior to the twentieth day of July, 1950, upon which that person sold or supplied substantially identical goods or services—

to be the "prescribed date" for the purposes of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 30 and paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 31 of the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate Commonwealth Public Service Inspector within the prescribed period will not be accepted. Under Section 50 (7A) of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, the Board may regard an appeal as having been made against a provisional promotion notified hereunder by any officer who, at any time within the time prescribed for lodging an appeal, is absent on leave for war service, or is absent from Australia on official duty.

Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged in respect of each. The grounds of appeal must be as prescribed in Section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, viz.

PPLICATIONS are invited from officers (male and female) A of the Third Division and from officers (male and female) who have qualified for transfer or promotion to an office in the Third Division, and who will be not less than 21 years of age as at the 1st September, 1952, for transfer for training as Traffic Officer, Telephone Branch, Postmaster-General's Department.

Applicants should state fully their educational and any other qualifications, and should furnish, at the foot of the application, the following particulars:—

Designation; Standard salary scale;

Present salary and date of receipt;

Date of birth;

Date of first appointment.

Applications should be addressed to and reach the Deputy Director of Posts and Telegraphs in the capital city of the State concerned not later than 23rd November, 1950.

The number of officers to be selected for training in each State is as follows:—New South Wales 12, Victoria 15, Queensland 6, South Australia 2, Western Australia 1 and Tasmania 4.

A list of officers selected by the Department for training as Traffic Officer will be published in the Gazette. Any Third Division officer or officer qualified for transfer or promotion to

the Third Division not included therein may, within twentyone days of the date of such notification in the Gazette, lodge with the Public Service Inspector in the State in which he is located an appeal against his non-selection. An officer appealed against shall not take up duty in training pending determination of the appeals.

The following conditions will apply:-

- 1. The officers selected will be transferred as supernumerary officers of the Telephone Branch, and during the period of training will continue to be paid salary in accordance with their respective classifications at the time of transfer.
- 2. Travelling allowance will not be payable in respect of this period of training.
- 3. Practical training in telephone traffic practices and procedure will proceed for a period of fifty-two weeks, instruction in commercial practices and procedure will be given at special classes whilst the trainees are acting as Traffic Officers.
- 4. Trainees are, in conjunction with the practical training referred to in condition 3, to undertake and pursue in departmental time an approved course of study in Technical Telephony.
- 5. Trainees will be required to undergo practical, oral, and written tests on the expiration of six months' training, with a view to a determination whether satisfactory progress has been made. A trainee whose progress, conduct or diligence is, at any subsequent time or times, regarded as not satisfactory may be required to undergo supplementary tests.
- 6. Should the Department consider at any time in the course of training that a trainee is not making reasonable progress, he may be transferred to his former position or to one of similar status.
- similar status.

 7. Upon satisfactory completion of the practical training in Traffic practices and procedure and upon passing an examination in this Section of the course, the officer will be employed as an acting Traffic Officer, Telephone Branch, and paid the appropriate remuneration. Upon completion of the practical training in Commercial practices and procedure and of the approved course of study, and upon passing a final examination to be held by the Department in the Commercial and Technical subjects, the officer will be recorded as eligible for transfer or promotion as Traffic Officer. CONDITIONS OF PROMOTION OR TRANSFER AS RADIO INSPECTOR, THIRD DIVISION, POSTMASTER-INSPECTOR, THIRD DI GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT.

THE Public Service Board hereby notifies the following conditions of promotion or transfer as Radio Inspector.

- 2. Examinations will be arranged from time to time by ne Board as it deems necessary to satisfy staffing staffing requirements
- 3. OFFICERS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER.—The examination will be open to Third and Fourth Division officers who hold the First Class Commercial Operator's Certificate of Proficiency issued under the Wireless Telegraphy Regulations.
 - 4. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.
- (1) Natural Science.
- (a) Mathematics: Algebra, geometry and trigonometry; rector algebra; expression of quantities in polar co-ordinates and in complex notation; differential and integral calculus up to the determination of maxima and minima and integrations of the simpler derivatives; introduction to the development of series, use of hyperbolic functions.
- (b) Physics, Pure: Heat, Light, Sound, Properties of Matter, Mechanics, Electricity and Magnetism, Electro-Magnetic Radiation, Atomic Structure.
- (c) Physics: Applications in telecommunication; electrical transmission theory, embracing all frequencies from zero to 30 megacycles per second; propagation of electro-magnetic waves in space, on radiating and non-radiating conductors, over the earth's surface and through the ionosphere.
- (d) Chemistry: Elementary knowledge of the more common inorganic elements and their principal compounds.
- (e) Properties and strengths of materials used in telecommunication plant.

- (f) Electrical Measurement: Principles of instruments and methods of their use in making measurement of circuits and apparatus with-
 - (i) direct current;
 - (ii) alternating current of commercial power frequencies 15 to 150 cycles per second;
 - (iii) alternating current of audio frequencies (up to 15,000 cycles per second);
 - (iv) alternating current of line carrier frequencies (up to 150 kilocycles per second);
 - (v) alternating current of radio frequencies (up to 30 megacycles per second).
- (g) Principles of power generating and converting equipment used in telecommunication practice.
- (2) Electrical Technology.

The treatment of this subject will be general rather than mathematical and particular reference should be made to use in radio installations.

- (a) Direct Currents: Principles and operation of D.C. generators, motors and dynamotors (genemotors); commutation and commutation difficulties; necessity for earthing; insulation; transmission and distribution systems including traction services with particular reference to radio interference problems, primary and secondary betteries used in ference problems; primary and secondary batteries used in radio evstems.
- (b) Single Phase Currents: Generation of single phase (b) Single Phase Currents: Generation of single phase alternating currents; power in AC circuits; alternating current circuits including behaviour of circuits containing R., L. and C. separately or in series and parallel combinations; single phase transformers including the pilot arc welder; single phase induction and commutator motors; transmission and distribution including high tension lines with particular reference to radio inductive interference problems; single phase rotary converters; luminous discharge lighting systems with reference to radio inductive interference causation, static rectifier principles, thermionic and metal types. rectifier principles, thermionic and metal types.
- (c) Three Phase Currents: Principles of generation of polyphase currents; power in three phase balanced and unbalanced circuits; star and delta connexions, current and voltage relations; three phase transformers; three phase transmission and distribution systems including high tension transmission lines with particular reference to interference problems: three phase meters industing wound refer and problems; three phase motors, induction, wound rotor and commutation types; three phase rotary converters; three phase static rectifiers, thermionic and metal types; three phase meters and measurements.

(3) Radio Technology.

- (a) General Principles: Principles of electro magnetic wave propagation; ground wave, ionospheric and tropospheric propagation; polarization, field intensity computations; the radio spectrum; high frequency oscillations; capacitors and inductors at radio frequencies; reactance; impedance; tuned circuits; resonance; coupled oscillatory circuits; types of waves; progress of wireless telegraphy—spark; arc and continuous wave systems; wireless telephony and broadcasting, systems of modulation, production of side bands by modulation, principles of reception of radio signals.
- (b) Vacuum Tubes: Thermionic emission, types of emitters, characteristics, filament, grid and anode circuits, amplifica-tion factor; plate resistance; mutual conductance; grid biasing methods; class A, B and C adjustments; magnetic shielding, inter-electrode capacities; neutralization of circuits; shielding, inter-electrode capacities; neutralization of circuits; screened grid tubes; pentode tubes; amplifiers, tuned and untuned radio frequency amplifiers, resistance capacity coupled, choke capacity coupled and transformer coupled audio frequency amplifiers. RF and AF power amplifiers; cooling; tube losses. Oscillators—Hartley, Colpitts, Tuned Grid-tuned Plate. Meissner, Electron-coupled, grid anode and grid cathode connected quartz crystal oscillators; special types of oscillators for the higher frequencies, including the magnetron, klystron and microwave triode oscillators (e.g. "lighthouse" tubes)
- (c) Transmitting Circuits: Oscillators and drive equipment; self excited transmitters, limitations, master oscillators, types of master oscillators, stability of operation at a given frequency, buffer amplifiers, separator amplifiers, frequency multiplication, final R.F. amplifiers; modulators and modulation; amplitude modulation; Heising or choke modulation, series modulation, grid modulation, suppressor modulation, balanced modulation, frequency and phase modulation; pulse modulation; television and facsimile; radar; suppression of harmonic radiation.
- (d) Receiving Circuits: Aerial coupling circuits; (a) Receiving Circuits: Aerial coupling circuits; sensitivity, selectivity and standard output power; receiver detectors including the H.F. crystal; R.F. amplifiers; A.F. amplifiers; power amplifiers; output coupling circuits; T.R.F., regenerative, super regenerative and superheterodyne receivers; single side band and suppressed carrier receivers;

crystal filters and band pass circuits; automatic gain and frequency control circuits; circuits for higher frequencies including frequency modulation, pulse modulation and television.

- (e) Radiating Systems and Aerial Coupling: Half and quarter wave aerials and radiation patterns; ground effects; driven and parasitic arrays; long line aerials, Vee and rhombic aerials; transmission lines and feeders; methods of coupling transmission lines and feeders to aerials and to transmitters; suppression of harmonics.
- (f) Broadcasting Services.—Frequency control; frequency checking and measuring; field intensity studies and service areas; contour maps; fading and distortion; selection of station sites; methods of monitoring; modulation performance; landline operating levels in dbs and VUs; landline troubles and location of faults; power transfer efficiencies; outside amplifiers and pick ups; studio amplifiers, microphones and acoustics; other studio equipment; mixers and line pads; attenuators; shared channel broadcasts; synchronized broadcasts; short, medium and long wave broadcasting; duties of station engineers.

(4) Radio Equipment.

- (a) Broadcast Station Equipment.—Installations used for broadcast purposes including frequency modulation, facsimile and television; frequency monitors; audio monitoring.
- (b) Point to Point and Miscellaneous Services.—Installations utilized in coast stations, land stations, aeradio stations and other stations licensed for communication and other purposes within the Commonwealth.
- (c) Mobile Service.—Installations on vehicles, ships, lifeboats and aircraft including navigational aids; e.g. direction finders, automatic alarms, radio beacons, altimeters, radar and emergency equipment.
- (d) Power Supply and Auxiliary Equipment: Power supply control equipment; prime movers; generators and emergency plant; rectifiers; valve cooling systems.
- (e) Measuring and Test Equipment: Safety first principles observed in high tension DC low frequency and radio frequency circuits; measurement of output power by indirect methods; measurement of R.F. power including power in lines and aerials; measurement of impedance in R.F. and A.F. circuits; modulation measurements; fidelity, noise and distortion checks; measurement of frequency, field strength, and metreamps; measurement of audio characteristics in db.

(5) Drawing and Design.

- (a) Elementary principles of engineering drawing with particular reference to radio circuits and use of standard symbols.
- (b) Ability to read all or any part of radio receiving or transmitting circuits, to produce a written description of such circuits or parts and to trace portion of any circuit; to apportion a radio circuit into block schematic form and to trace and label dangerous parts such as those carrying high voltage, D.C., A.C. and/or R.F.
- (c) Ability to produce a neat circuit drawing from details supplied, layout, symbols and lettering to follow standard drawing practice.
- (d) A general knowledge of principles underlying the design of radio equipment and installation in terms of suitability, weakness or merit of choice of circuits, components, radiating systems, feeders lines, earthing systems, station sites, safety of operation as applied to transmitters; circuit components, aerial and earth systems, and sites as applied to receivers. The ability to compare alternatives in terms of merits and demerits.
- 5. Text-books.—No text-books have been prescribed, but the Departmental (Postmaster-General's) Course of Technical Instruction is recommended for reference insofar as it relates to the subjects of examination. A booklet of the papers prepared for a past examination may be obtained from the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth and Hobart.
- 6. EXEMPTIONS FROM EXAMINATION.—(a) A candidate will be exempt from re-examination in any subject in which he has passed at an examination for Radio Inspector held not more than five years previously.
- (b) A candidate who has passed, not more than five years previously, in any subject on the syllabuses notified in Gazette, No. 66, of 10th November, 1938, or Gazette No. 62 of 25th August, 1949, will be regarded as having passed in the same subject on the syllabus shown in this notification. A

pass in Radio Technology on the syllabus notified on 10th November, 1938 will be regarded as a pass in both Radio Technology and Radio Equipment. A pass in one or two sections only of the subject Natural Science on the previous syllabus will not entitle a candidate to any exemption.

- (c) A candidate will be granted exemption from re-examination in Natural Science if he has passed in that subject at an examination for promotion or transfer as Engineer, Postmaster-General's Department, held not more than five years previously.
- (d) A candidate who produced to the Public Service Board evidence that he has passed, not more than five years previously, at a recognized university or approved technical college in any subject shown in paragraph 7 or in any other subject which is deemed by the Board to be equivalent to one of the subjects of examination will be exempt from examination in the corresponding subject of examination.

8. ELIGIBILITY FOR TRANSFER OR PROMOTION.—The eligibility of officers who qualify will be continued so as to endure for a period of five years from the date of publication in the Commonwealth Gazette of the results of the examination, and will then terminate, provided that a successful candidate under the age of 21 years will not be eligible for promotion or transfer to Radio Inspector until he attains that age. Should a qualified candidate in the course of his eligibility be engaged for a period of not less than three months continuously in the full-time performance of the duties of Radio Inspector in an acting capacity, and obtain a Certificate of Competency from the Chief Inspector (Wireless) in respect of that service in an acting capacity, eligibility will continue until the expiration of a period of five years commencing on the date of completion of such period of acting service as Radio Inspector.
