Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the sixth day of April, Whereas by Proclamation dated the sixth day of April, 1942, and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette on the ninth day of April, 1942, an area of the Pacific Ocean off Stradbroke Island, Queensland which area is described in the said Proclamation and shown therein on the plan entitled "Air Gunnery Area, Stradbroke Island, Queensland", was declared to be an air gunnery area for the purpose of the Air Force Regulations:

## PROCLAMATION

APPOINTMENT OF WHARFS IN TASMANIA.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Common-wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the Customs Act 1901-1949 it W is enacted that the Governor-General may by Proclamation appoint wharfs within ports and fix their limits.

And whereas by Proclamation issued on the 21st day of September, 1921, and published in the Commonwealth Gazette, No. 74, of 22nd September, 1921, King's Wharf, in the Port of Devonport, Tasmania, was appointed and the limits of such wharf were fixed.

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said proclamation and appoint wharfs in the following places:—

 (a) King's Wharf, Devonport, in the State of Tasmania;
 (b) Alexandra Wharf, Launceston, in the State of Tasma**n**ia.

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal 5754.—No. 68.—Price 6D.; Quarterly, 8s. 2d.; Half-Yearly, 16s. 3d.; Yearly, 32s. 6d.

Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation and appoint the following to be wharfs within the meaning of the said Act and fix their limits as follows:—

(a) King's Wharf, Devonport.

(b) Alexandra Wharf, Launceston.

Commencing at a point on the Esplanade distant 13 feet north-westerly from the north-east angle of 14 acres 2 roods 33 perches granted to the Launceston Marine Board and bounded on the north-east by 212 feet 11½ inches south-easterly in three bearings along the esplanade aforesaid

on the south-east by 426 feet south-westerly along portion of 14 acres 2 roods 33 perches aforesaid on the south-west by 210 feet 7½ inches north-westerly again along portion of that land to the North Esk River and thence on the north-west by 433 feet 5½ inches north-easterly in two bearings along the North Esk River aforesaid and across Alexandra Wharf area to the point of commencement.

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 777 (T. & C. 50/6908).

#### ORDER

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Air Force Regulations it is prescribed, inter alia—

(a) that the Governor-General may by order declare any area to be an air fighting, gunnery, bombing or similar practice area:

(b) that a ship, boat, aircraft or person shall not come or remain within any area so declared while any air fighting, gunnery, bombing or similar practice, as the case may be, is in progress, or remain in any position so as to obstruct such practice.

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be an air gunnery and bombing area for the purpose of the said Regulations.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

#### Queensland.

All that area of sea, being part of the Pacific Ocean adjacent to the eastern coast of Stradbroke Island, which is bounded by a line commencing at a point at latitude 27 degrees 27 minutes 20 seconds South, longitude 153 degrees 32 minutes 00 seconds East thence in an easterly direction to a point at latitude 27 degrees 29 minutes 07 seconds South, longitude 153 degrees 37 minutes 32 seconds East, thence in a southerly direction to a point at latitude 27 degrees 37 minutes 21 seconds South longitude 153 degrees 34 minutes 19 seconds East, thence in a westerly direction to a point at latitude 27 degrees 35 minutes 35 seconds South, longitude 153 degrees 28 minutes 50 seconds East, thence in a northerly direction to the point of commencement.
