#### DRAWBACK NOTICE No. 547.

REGULATIONS 76 AND 78 OF THE EXCISE REGULATIONS AND REGULATION 130 OF THE CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

(T. & C. '50/9871.)

PRAWBACK of Excise duty paid may be allowed under the provisions of the Excise Regulations and of the Customs Regulations on spirit used in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of disinfectants and antiseptics upon exportation of such products and after compliance with the said regulations.

Provided that when required by the Collector the manufacture of the disinfectants and antiseptics shall take place under the supervision of an officer and that before drawback is allowed the Collector shall be satisfied in each case that the

drawback claimed is properly due.
