Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS a proposed law entitled "An Act Relating to the Royal Style and Titles" has been passed by both Houses of the Parliament of the Commonwealth:

And whereas, upon the proposed law being on the eighteenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, presented to me for the Royal Assent, I declared that I reserved the proposed law for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure:

And whereas the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure has been communicated to me:

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and make known that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the proposed law.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this twenty-eighth day of April in the (L.S.) year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and in the second year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

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By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section eight of the Coinage Act 1909-1947 it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor-General may by proclamation determine the dimensions of and design for any Australian coin and may alter any proclamation previously made:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the eleventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and ten, as altered by Proclamations dated respectively the nineteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, the tenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and the sixth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, the Governor-General determined the dimensions of and designs for Australian coins:

And whereas, by reason of the accession of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., it is desirable to make a further determination in respect of the designs for certain Australian coins in variation of the determination made by the said Proclamation as so previously altered (hereinafter in this Proclamation referred to as "the said Proclamation"):

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby alter the said Proclamation by determining that, in lieu of the design for the obverse side of the half-penny, penny, threepence, sixpence, shilling and florin determined by the said Proclamation, the design for the obverse side of those Australian coins shall be the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen with the inscription "ELIZABETH II. DEI GRATIA REGINA" enclosed within a beaded circle.

 $\rm This\ Proclamation\ shall\ come\ into\ operation\ on\ the\ seventh\ day\ of\ May,\ One\ thousand\ nine\ hundred\ and\ fifty-three.$

WHEREAS by section 63 of the *Defence Act* 1903-1952 as applied to the Royal Australian Air Force by the *Air Force Act* 1923-1952 and regulation 11 of the Air Force Regulations it is, amongst other things, provided that the Governor-General may, subject to the provisions of the first-mentioned Act, do all matters and things deemed by him to be necessary or desirable for the efficient defence and protection of the Commonwealth or any State:

And whereas by Order published in the Gazette on the twenty-ninth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, the Governor-General ordered that the Air Officer Commanding No. 11 Group, Royal Australian Air Force, should have and might exercise certain powers in relation to the units under his command:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the aforesaid Order:

Now therefore 1, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby revoke the aforesaid Order.—(Ex. Min. No. 41.)

REVOCATION OF AUTHORITY

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by regulation 59 of the Air Force Regulations, it is provided that the Governor-General may authorize an officer in command of any part of the Air Force which is beyond the limits of the Commonwealth to appoint any person to be an officer, promote an officer to temporary rank or appoint an officer to acting rank in the Air Force:

And whereas by an Authority published in the Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Australian Air Force Overseas Head-quarters, was empowered to appoint persons as officers and to promote officers to certain ranks and to appoint officers to certain acting ranks:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the aforesaid Authority:

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby revoke the aforesaid Authority.— (Ex. Min. No. 42.)

SUPPLY AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS. DECLARATION OF PROHIBITED AREAS.

WHEREAS by sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 90 of the Supply and Development Regulations it is provided that if it appears to the Minister that, with respect to any place used or intended to be used as or for the purposes of an undertaking or for carrying out operations for the testing of war material, it is necessary or expedient in the interests of the safety or defence of the Commonwealth that special precautions should be taken to prevent the entry of unauthorized persons into that place, he may, by notice published in the Gazette, declare that place to be a prohibited area for the purposes of those Regulations:

And whereas each of the places described hereunder is a place used or intended to be used as or for the purposes of an undertaking or for carrying out operations for the testing of war materiel:

And whereas it appears to me that it is necessary and expedient in the interests of the safety and defence of the Commonwealth that special precautions should be taken to prevent the entry of unauthorized persons into each of those places:

Now therefore I, Eric John Harrison, Minister of State for Defence Production, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 90 of the Supply and Development Regulations hereby declare each of the places described hereunder to be a prohibited area for the purposes of the Supply and Development Regulations.

DESCRIPTION OF PLACE.

All that piece of land containing an approximate area of 3774 acres 3 roods and 34 perches in the Parishes of Woornyalook and Murtcaim County of Grant State of Victoria being the land acquired by the Commonwealth by notification in Gazette No. 8 dated 7th February, 1952.

All that piece of land containing an approximate area of 559 acres and 3 perches in the Parish of Murtcaim County of Grant State of Victoria being the land acquired by the Commonwealth by notification in Gazette No. 38 dated 29th



- (i) An allowance at the rate of £36 per annum will be granted to an officer under the age of 21 years on evidence to the satisfaction of the Board of the passing of a prescribed advancement test.
