PRICES ORDER No. 255 (A.C.T.).

Furniture, Retail-Australian Capital Territory.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949, I, Clifford Edwin Williamson, Controller of Prices, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 255 (A.C.T.).

Revocation.

2. Prices Order No. 163 (A.C.T.) is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. This Order shall not apply to Jervis Bay.

Definition.

4. In this Order "cost" in relation to any furniture means 4. In this Order "cost" in relation to any furniture means the amount paid or agreed to be paid to the furniture manufacturer by the seller by retail for that furniture plus any expenses actually incurred by that seller and recorded in his books of account for finishing, fitting or completing the manufacture of that furniture but not including any expenses incurred in the packing or transport of that furniture.

Maximum retail prices.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which furniture may be sold by retail in the Australian Capital Territory to be the sum of the following:—
 - (a) (i) the manufacturer's selling price for that furni-ture in a finished, completely fitted and completely manufactured condition; or
 - (ii) if purchased from a manufacturer in other than a finished, completely fitted and completely manufactured condition—the cost of that furniture;
 - (b) Sales Tax paid or payable;
 - (c) an amount equal to 40 per centum of the sum of (a) and (b);
 - (d) the amount (if any) actually charged by the supplier of such furniture to the seller by retail for packing that furniture;
 - that furniture;

 (e) in respect of furniture purchased from a furniture manufacturer whose place of business is situated outside the Australian Capital Territory—an amount equal to the cost of the transport of such furniture. Provided that no amount shall be included for cost of transport in the computation of any maximum price in pursuance of the provisions of this paragraph, unless full details of the cost of such transport are recorded by the retail seller in his books of account.

Fixation of maximum price by notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I declare the maximum price at which any article of furniture specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by retail in the Australian Capital Territory by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Controller by notice in writing to that person.

COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109.

In the event of the failure of the officer to obtain a pass in the subject or subjects at the supplementary or deferred examination, or refusal by the University of permission for him to sit at a supplementary or deferred examination in any subject, the Board may, if it thinks fit, require as a condition of the continuance of the free place that any further expenditure in respect of the subject or subjects in which a pass was not obtained shall be borne by the officer; or, if it decides that the circumstances so warrant, the Board may approve of the inclusion of the subject or subjects in a subsequent year's programme of study under free place conditions. In no circumstances, however, will expense be borne by the Commonwealth in fees in respect of a subject for more than two years of the course.
