PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section eight of the Coinage Act 1909-1947 it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor-General may by proclamation determine the dimensions of and design for any Australian coin:

And whereas it is desirable, for the purpose of commemorating the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. to Australia, that there shall be made and issued coins of the demonination of the florin, having a special design:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council do hereby determine that—

- (a) the dimensions of each florin so made and issued shall be the same as those of the Australian florin determined by the Governor-General by proclamation dated the eleventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the Gazette on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and ten;
- the Guzzeez on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and ten;

 (b) the design on the obverse side of the florin shall be the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen with the inscription "ELIZABETH II DEI GRATIA REGINA F.D."
- (c) the design on the reverse side of the florin shall be a representation of a lion and a kangaroo with the inscription "Australia Florin" and the year of the coin (in figures).

The proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the Customs Act 1901-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation appoint wharfs within ports and fix their limits.

And whereas by Section 16 of the Customs Act 1901-1953 it is enacted that wharfs may be appointed for specified limited purposes.

And whereas it is desirable to appoint a wharf, to be known as Kings Wharf, at Geelong in the State of Victoria for the purposes of loading and discharging iron and steel together with cargo in bulk including petroleum, and to fix the limits of such wharf.

Now, therefore, I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council do hereby appoint the following to be a wharf within the meaning of the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid and fix the limits as follows:—

KINGS WHARF.

"The centre of the Northern Approach to Kings Wharf commences 172 feet 8 inches in a North-Easterly direction from the North-East corner of Crown Allotment 293 Parish of Moorpanyal and thence extends 342 feet Easterly to the wharf face. The width of the Northern approach is 21 feet for the initial 274 feet thence widening on the Southerly side to 41 feet 3 inches wide at junction with the rear face of wharf.

The wharf face extends 10 feet 6 inches Northerly from centre line of Northerly approach and 510 feet 10 inches Southerly to centre line of Southern approach and thence 139 feet 11 inches Southerly from this last point. The Southern approach extends 288 feet 6 inches Westerly from the face of wharf and is 21 feet wide for the Western portion of length 220 feet 6 inches thence diverging on the Northerly side to a width of 40 feet 4 inches at rear face of wharf.

For 531 feet 10 inches from Northerly corner of wharf, the wharf is 50 feet wide, thence decreasing in width at rear of wharf to 43 feet over a length to the South of 9 feet 5 inches, thence being 43 feet wide for the remaining Southerly portion of 120 feet."

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 839 (T. & C. R.53/4452).

1. This By-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 2550.
2. By-law No. 1769 to Tariff Item 449 (A) (2), published in Gazette No. 77, dated 20th November, 1952, having reference to "Sewing machines, &c.", is hereby revoked.

3. Item 449 (A) (2) of the Customs Tariff 1933-1952 applies to Sewing machines, special purpose industrial, designed to perform all of the following operations:—Putting on buttons, making button holes, embroidery work, zig-zag stitching, shell edging (sometimes known as scarfing), and pin tucking.
