PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS, under the definition of "active service" in regulation 4 of the Air Force Regulations, a member of the Air Force or other person subject to Air Force law is, for the purposes of the application of the disciplinary provisions of the said Regulations and the Air Force Act, deemed to be on active service whenever he is attached to or forms part of a force during any period in respect of which the Governor-General from time to time declares that force to the on active service or whenever he is satisfied in a time and the Air Force and the control of the cont be on active service, or whenever he is serving in any area in respect of which the Governor-General from time to time declares that the persons subject to Air Force law serving in that area are "on active service":

And whereas, by Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, the Governor-General declared that, in respect of all areas outside the mainland of Australia and Tasmania persons subject to Air Force law serving in those areas were "on active service":

And whereas, it is desirable to revoke the aforesaid Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the aforesaid Proclamation.

Defence Act 1903-1953. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1.) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Force, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval, military or air-force exercises or purposes, and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1.) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the demote or loss. of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby



authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the General Officer Commanding Western Command to enter upon the lands in the State of Western Australia described in the Schedule to this Authority and use them for training, manœuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period commencing on the eighth day of May, 1955, and ending on the twenty-ninth day of May 1955, and indicate the General Officer Commanding Western Command, in the State of Western Australia, as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted. submitted.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

NON-ATTENDANCE AT Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

(b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime Numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy—as treated in "A New 'Shilling' Arithmetic" by Pendlebury and Robinson (Bell and Sons, London) or any elementary text-book used in Aus-London) or any elementary text-book used in Australian schools which covers the syllabus. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained for (a) Spelling and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment. current employment.
