LIVING ALLOWANCE.--A candidate who, on appointment, is obliged to live away from home will be paid an allowance, in addition to salary, sufficient to provide a net remuneration of approximately £137 per annum after deductions have been made for suitable board and lodging, superannuation and other expenses. The allowance will be reduced by the amount of any increase in salary granted subsequent to appointment.

ADVANCEMENT.—(a) Technician-in-Training.—A technician-in-training shall become a Technician upon the satisfactory completion of the five years' prescribed course of training.

Current electricity. Action of a current on a magnetic needle. Heat and light from a current. Simple explanation of terms volt, ampere, ohm. Applications: telephone, electro-plating; immersion heater.

Chemistry Section.

Combustion in air of carbon, sulphur, phosphorus and magnesium.

Characteristics of physical and chemical changes.

Removal of oxygen from air by burning phosphorus.

Nitrogen. Composition of the air. Water vapour and carbon dioxide. Preparation and properties of oxygen.

Metals and non-metals. Oxidation, slow and rapid.

Oxides, basic and acidic.

Properties of common mineral acids.

Preparation and properties of hydrogen.

Composition of water by synthesis and by analysis.

Action of heat and acids on calcium carbonate.

Preparation and properties of carbon dioxide. Uses of carbon dioxide. Air conditioning.

Basic hydroxides and neutralization by common mineral acids.

Preparation of salts; acids on metals; acids on bases; acids on carbonates.

Solubility: hard and soft waters.
Purification of water; filtration; softening; sterilizing by boiling and by chlorination; distillation.

VICTORIA.

nergy.—Sources; varied forms; transformation of energy; simple ideas of force, and work. Use of fuels for heating and operating engines; internal combustion energy (only to the extent of illustrating a general principle).

Human inventions for doing work; simple machines; the lever, balance, single fixed and movable pulleys; machines operated by wind, water, fuels. Friction as a help and as a hindrance; means of reducing or of increasing friction; common applications.

Electricity and magnetism: Elementary examples and applications within the experience of the majority of people. Magnetic force and electromagnetic force. Current producing heat and light. Sources of energy—coal, water. State power schemes in broad outline; their purpose in having work done throughout the State in transport systems, factories, farms, homes. Natural magnets, artificial magnets, how to make a magnet; like and unlike poles; difference between soft iron and steel in making a magnet. Magnetic compass and its uses. The earth as a magnet. Electric current; common appliances in the home and in industry; magnetic effects; conductors and insulators. insulators.

Chemistry Section.

Burning of substances in air, chemical changes; release of energy; common fuels and conditions for combustion; products of combustion. Air as a mixture; chemical characteristics of main constituents of air. Preparation and properties of oxygen, nitrogen, carbon dioxide. Importance of air for living things. Burning of sulphur, phosphorus, carbon, magnesium, iron in air. Acidic and basic oxides.

Acids; formation of salts by neutralization with a base. Crystallization from a solution of a soluble salt. Salts from acids and carbonates. Action of acids on metals. Hydrogen, its preparation and properties. Burning of hydrogen to form water.

Radiation; dull and polished surfaces in radiation. Vacuum flask.

Capillarity; simple illustrations.

Magnetism. Properties of a magnet. Like and unlike poles: methods of magnetizing; differences in magnetic properties of iron and steel; magnetic field; the earth as à magnet.

Electric current; magnetic effects of current; electric bell, electric telegraph; heating effects of a current; electric irons, radiators, cookers, &c. Use of electric fuse. Elementary ideas of ampere, volt, ohm.

Element, mixture, compound.

The atmosphere; its chief constituents.

Oxygen and hydrogen; their properties and common uses: oxidation, combustion, rusting, expiration, &c., metallic oxides, e.g., common ores.

Water: composition of water.

Acids, bases and salts: (simple study only); neutralization.

Carbon: its forms and occurrence; presence in food and fuels; simple study of coal.

Sulphur, phosphorus, lime, ammonia: their properties and common uses: superphosphate: quick lime and slaked lime.

TASMANIA.

Physics Section.

States of matter; solids, liquids, gases.

Mass and density.

atmospheric pressure. Flotation: applications. Liquid pressure.

Force, illustrated by push or pull; friction; weight; "force of gravity"; simple machine; levers and lever action; energy.

Heat: expansion due to heat; thermometers; transference of heat; conduction, convection, radiation; change of state; steam engines; internal combustion engines.

Magnetism; magnets and magnetic field; the earth as a magnet; compass needle; magnetizing iron or steel; electromagnet; telephone; electric current; heating and chemical effects; motor, dynamo, microphone.

Chemistry Section.

Composition of the air; burning and rusting; preparation of oxygen and carbon dioxide; composition of water; preparation and properties of hydrogen solubility; filtration and distillation.

Study of flame. Wood, coal, coke, gas, oil as fuels; lime burning—chemical effects of heat on limestone; gas

Mineral acids: neutralization of acids; salts; the use of litmus; bases, oxides and hydroxides.

Throughout this course, the emphasis is to be on applications; frequently applications correlated with other branches of science, e.g., geology, physiography and biology.

ALL STATES.

English.—Composition, meaning of words, construction of sentences to illustrate the meanings given, and spelling. (Maximum marks, 100; pass marks, 50.)

The subject of English will, however, not be taken into account in determining the order of merit of candidates who are successful in qualifying at the examination.

General.—Candidates will also be required to sit for a general paper which will be qualifying and not competitive. No preparation is necessary for this paper.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but a booklet containing papers set for a past examination may be obtained from the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in each State. No previous General Papers are available.

PASS CONDITIONS.—To pass the examination a candidate

- (a) Obtain at least the number of pass marks shown against the subjects of Elementary Mathematics, Elementary Science, and English; or
- (b) pass in English and the General Paper and, in addition, obtain an aggregate of not less than 300 marks in the subjects of Elementary Mathematics and Elementary Science. His marks either in Elementary Mathematics or in Elementary Science must, however, be not less than 120.

VACANCIES.—The following is an estimate of the number of Technician-in-training vacancies in the Postmaster-General's Department which will be filled by candidates who qualify:—New South Wales, 230; Victoria, 180; Queensland, 80; South Australia, 53; Western Australia, 48; Tasmania, 25.

It is expected that vacancies for Technician-in-training will exist in the Department of Civil Aviation in all States and that vacancies for Apprentices will exist in the Postmaster-General's Department and the Department of Civil Aviation in some States. Full details of these vacancies will be published at a later date.

Appointments and transfers to the number required will be made at about the end of December, 1955.

ORDER OF APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER.—Candidates who qualify will be listed in two groups—

- (i) Officers of the Service.
- (ii) Candidates from outside the Service.

Appointments and transfers will be made in order of merit on the respective lists. The order of merit in each list will be determined by the total number of marks obtained in Elementary Mathematics and Elementary Science. If two or more candidates obtain the same total number of marks in those subjects, their order of merit, respectively, will be determined by lot. Approximately one-half of the vacancies will be allotted to qualified candidates who are officers of the permanent staff of the Commonwealth Public Service, and one-half to qualified candidates who are not on the permanent staff, any shortage in one source to be made up of qualified candidates in the other source.

Two distinct orders of merit will be published for each of groups (i) and (ii) above, one for those who satisfy paragraph (a) of the Pass Conditions and one for those who qualify under paragraph (b).

ELIGIBILITY.—Candidates who qualify will be eligible for appointment or transfer for twelve months commencing on the date of the publication of the results of the examination in the Commonwealth Gazette.

RESULTS OF EXAMINATIONS.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment or transfer shall be published in the Commonwealth Gazette.

MARKS.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

REPORTS ON EXAMINATION PAPERS.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Secretary of the Public Service Board of the sum of ten (10) shillings for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his English, Elementary Mathematics and Elementary Science papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

CONDITIONS OF APPOINTMENT.—A qualified candidate from outside the Service must, upon appointment, produce evidence of the date of his birth, and a medical certificate satisfying

the Board in such particulars as it may determine of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects. He should not undergo this medical examination until instructed by the Board or a Public Service Inspector to do so. Upon confirmation of his appointment, after probation, an officer will be required to contribute to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund. A qualified candidate upon confirmation of appointment as Apprentice will, in addition, be expected to sign an Indenture.

Appointees will be given appropriate training in the Postmaster-General's Department. They will be required to attend classes at a technical college or other institution approved by the Board as part of their training. On appointment each Technician-in-training will be informed of the conditions under which his tuition fees will be paid by the Department. The conditions of the training course for Apprentices will be set out in the Indenture referred to above.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951, precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

REFUSAL BY THE BOARD TO APPOINT SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES.—The Board may, upon sufficient evidence of an adverse nature respecting the conduct, character or ability of a successful candidate or upon sufficient evidence that a successful candidate has knowingly made a false statement in respect of his application to sit for an examination for appointment, direct that that successful candidate shall not receive appointment.

REFUSAL OF APPOINTMENT.—If a successful candidate declines to accept an appointment, or fails to reply within seven days to a communication from the Board, the Public Service Inspector, or the Director of Posts and Telegraphs, respecting nomination to the Public Service, the candidate's name may be removed from the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment".
