- (a) to write out passages of continuous prose and/or sentences, containing misspelled and/or partially spelled but readily recognizable words, spelling correctly the misspelled words, and spelling fully and correctly the partially spelled words; and
 - (b) to spell fully and correctly in the spaces provided on the examination paper partially spelled words in a printed list.

In both (a) and (b), comprehension as well as the candidate's ability to spell will be tested, as the recognition of the word must precede the actual spelling.

To assist the candidate in (b) and where appropriate in (a), the meaning will be given (in brackets) after each partially spelled word.

Generally, however, the candidate's ability to cope with the examination in spelling will depend upon his being able to spell and use correctly the words contained in the spelling lists of the prescribed text-books.

In their preparation candidates should not only learn to spell these words; they should also know their meaning. Constant use of a dictionary is therefore essential.

As an aid to comprehension, particular attention should also be given to the sections of the prescribed text-book (Foster & Bryant: "A Graded Word-Book for Australian Schools"), which deal with homonyms, antonyms, nouns and their adjectives, verbs and their nouns, plurals, masculine and feminine forms of nouns, and verbs and their principal parts.

2. ENGLISH.

- uration 4 hours—Paper A (essay, 3 hours' précis writing, punctuation, letter writing, and appreciation of prose). Paper B (Analysis, and use of words) I hour. (i) Duration 4 hours-
- (ii) Maximum marks, 400 (Paper A, 300; Paper B, 100). Pass marks, 240.

(iii) To obtain a pass in English, candidates must obtain an overall total of at least 240 marks.

Introduction.—Words are the tools of trade for the student of English. He should become word-conscious. The more extensive his vocabulary and the greater his ability to put words together (grammar, syntax, &c.), the more easily will he be able to express his thoughts clearly and interestingly. Wide reading will increase his range, aid his understanding and keep his interest in his language fresh and alive.

PAPER A.

Paper A will consist of three sections. Candidates will be required to study all sections.

- Section 1.

Essay Writing—Essays are a means of testing candidates' knowledge and also of assessing their capacity for self-expression. Essay writing requires the development of an adequate vocabulary and also certain techniques or skills.

They are either of the personal type as in the subject of English or are the means frequently adopted for reporting facts or developing arguments as in History and Economics. It is with the personal type of essay that students are concerned in this examination. Candidates will be given a choice of subjects, so that each may write on a theme within his own field of interest.

The essay requires the student after selecting his subject-

- (a) to collect his thoughts and opinions on the subject, expressing his ideas correctly (grammar and syntax) and suitably (vocabulary);
- (b) to arrange his thoughts, grouping sentences together which deal with one phase of the subject (paragraphs); and
- (c) to develop his treatment of the subject in a logical sequence so as to arrive at a conclusion.

Preparation will require study and exercise in-

- (a) Vocabulary building, including the recognition of prefixes and affixes, simple Latin roots; grouping of words according to endings (affixes), e.g., -able, -ible, -ary, -eous, &c.; singulars and plurals, especially borrowings from other languages now in common use; collective nouns as names of groups, e.g., shoal, bevy, committee; synonyms, antonyms and homonyms.
- (b) Rules of syntax.
- (c) Punctuation, keeping in mind, after learning the use of the stops, that over-punctuation should be avoided and that the function of punctuations is to show up the meaning and not to patch up faulty composition.
- (d) Grammar.—Parts of speech as follows should be understood and readily recognized:—

Nouns: proper, common, abstract and collective. Pronouns: personal, relative, demonstrative, interrogative, and possessive.

Adjectives: descriptive, numeral, demonstrative, interrogative, and indefinite.

Adverbs: of time, place, manner and degree.

Verbs: finite, infinite, transitive, intransitive,

active, and passive.
Conjunctions: co-ordinate and subordinate.

The examination will also require candidates to develop their powers of expression-

(a) Expression depends upon the word, the sentence, and the paragraph. When writing an essay students should:—aim to use the right word in the right place; choose apt adjectives and strong verbs; where necessary use explanatory phrases to enhance meaning and description.

To avoid the use of the wrong word, students should study words likely to be confused, e.g., allusion, illusion; eligible, illegible; credible,

creditable, &c.

- (b) Variety in sentence construction is also important, short sentences and long sentences being suitably blended, due regard being paid to balance, emphasis, and unity.
- (c) Paragraphs should be real, sentences dealing with one phase or aspect of the subject being grouped together; students should also use variety in the beginning of paragraphs.
- (d) Finally, in their essays candidates should always aim at clearness of expression and simplicity of style; they should plan before writing and know clearly what they have to say.

Section 2.

PRÉCIS WRITING.-

- (a) Candidates should understand the meaning of précis writing, its use, and what is necessary to prepare a précis, including the value of an extensive vocabulary.
- (b) Dictionary work is essential; so too are exercises in the substitution of words for phrases, &c. Candidates should use their knowledge of grammar to aid them in discrimination; they should use principal clauses to give the main points and subordinate clauses to add the detail.
- (c) Rough notes are important as a guide in preparing a précis.
- (d) Précis of correspondence: use of an index should take the place of rough notes; précis should be written from an index.
- (e) Précis of minutes of meeting: use an index on similar lines to précis of correspondence.

Section 3.

A. Punctuation.

Direct questions will be set which require the candidate to punctuate sentences or short passages of continuous prose.

In their preparation, it will be necessessary for candidates to study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with punctuation, and, through practice, to acquire facility in applying accepted principles regarding the use of

Candidates should aim at a clear understanding of the function of each stop. For example, the appropriate use of a hyphen in (b) changes the meaning of the following

(a) Old gold braid = old braid of a gold colour.
(b) Old-gold braid = braid of the colour known as "old-gold".

and then

B. Letter Writing.

Your ability as officers of the Commonwealth Public Service, to write concise, clear, complete, correct, and courteous letters is a distinct advantage; on the other hand your inability to do this is a serious handicap.

As recommended in Section 3A (Punctuation), candidates should study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with letter writing, noting those conventions which make for correctness, and also those qualities that make a letter attractive as well as correct.

In their preparation, candidates should aim to acquire facility in writing Business Letters, Official and Semi-Official Letters, and also Social Letters.

C. Appreciation of Prose.

Candidates will be required to read carefully a passage of prose and to answer direct questions on the content.

If appropriate to the passage, question will also be set to test the candidate's ability to recognize figures of speech. These, though met with more frequently in poetry than in prose, are devices employed to achieve the effect of vividness and to hold the attention. In prose, figures of speech are generally used quite naturally and are part of the writer's style

Candidates should study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with figures of speech.

Paper B will consist of two sections, both of which are compulsory.

Section 1.

ANALYSIS.-

(a) Analysis should begin with the recognition of the types of sentences which make up the passage.
(b) Then follows the division of each sentence into clauses, each clause consisting of a subject and predicate and the presence of a finite verb deciding the cristopes of each sentence along.

the existence of each separate clause.

(c) To complete the general analysis of the passage, candidates should state, the kind of clause (principal, noun, adjectival, adverbial) and the relationship of each clause to the principal or some other clause in the sentence.

(i) Principal,
(ii) Noun—Subject of verb, object of participle, object of preposition;
(iii) Adjectival—introduced by relative pronoun (N.B. "as" is a relative pronoun when it follows "such" or "same"); "where" when it means "at which", "in which", "during which", &c., introduces an adjectival clause;

"during which", &c., introduces an adjectival clause;

(iv) Adverbial—of time, place, manner, reason.

(N.B.—Adverb clauses of reason are subdivided into clauses of condition, concession, result, and consequence, and each is introduced by particular conjunctions.)

The tendency to-day is to eliminate such distinctions and to call all such clauses Adverb Clauses of Reason.

(d) Particular or detailed analysis should show the subject and predicate with the predicate further sub-divided into the verb, complement, object, and extension or adverbial adjunct.

extension or adverbial adjunct.

Nate: The simple subject is usually one word; extensions of the subject are usually adjectives and phrases; objects follow the same pattern. Extension of the predicate usually expresses time, manner, place, reason.

Complements are words or phrases that complete the sense of the verb, e.g., They elected him Mayor. ("Mayor" is complement of "elected".) Tom is ill. ("Ill" is complement of "is".)

complement of "is".)

Candidates should differentiate between direct and indirect objects, e.g., Tom killed the snake. "Snake" is the direct object of killed. He gave his son presents. Really means: He gave presents to his son. "Presents" is the direct object of "gave". "His son" is the indirect object of "gave". N.B.—At one time "his son" would have been parsed as "objective case governed by 'to' understood". This form is not now used though it is seen in old grammar books which are considered obsolete. considered obsolete.

Notes to Candidates.—(1) The general analysis section of the answer to the question on analysis should be submitted in two columns, i.e., (i) Clause, (ii) Kind and Relationship. Particular analysis should be presented on the ruled standard form provided at the examination.

(2) The passage set for analysis at the examination will be a short piece of continuous prose. Parenthetic matter will not be included.

Section 2.

Use of Words.—Candidates' preparation in this section will require study and drill as well as exercises in the following:

(i) Antonyms (including the use of prefixes in the formation of antonyms), synonyms, homonyms.

(ii) Nouns and the adjectives derived from them, e.g.,

choir, choral.

(iii) Verbs and their corresponding nouns, e.g., propose,

proposal.
(iv) Plurals of nouns, including irregular plurals plurals of foreign words in common use, plurals of compound nouns, plurals which are the same as the singular, words with two plurals of as the singular, different meaning.

(v) Genders of nouns.

(vi) Rules for the possessive case. (vii) Verbs and their principal parts.

(viii) Preposition idioms.

(ix) Correction of faulty sentences (with reasons for corrections). (x) Recognition of redundant words, &c.

(xi) Expressing metaphorical phrases, &c., in plain speech.

(xii) Recognition of the shades of meaning in groups of words similar but not the same in meaning, e.g., announce, intimate, inform, advise, &c. The use of such words in sentences so as to reveal the particular shade of meaning.

In the study of words, especially synonyms and antonyms, the student should use his dictionary and note well the distinctions between words of similar meaning; synonyms have the same general meaning, not the same meaning, e.g., cfficient—able, qualified, competent, satisfactory, &c. This does not mean that any one word may be substituted for any other word. Each has its peculiar use. Strive for the word rather than a word.

When a new word is learned, the student should learn its opposite, its extensions to include the different parts of speech, e.g., change verbs, nouns, adjectives, into particles, abstract nouns, &c.

The student should study rules of syntax in conjunction with grammar. He should make one help the other. Rules are set out in the text-books recommended. Sentences for correction should be constantly revised. When a student has learned some new fact in grammar he should apply it to his general English so as to retain it.
