

UNIVERSITY FREE PLACES FOR THE STUDY OF THE INDONESIAN LANGUAGE.

IT is anticipated that courses in the Indonesian language at undergraduate level will be available at the Universities of Sydney and Melbourne and the Canberra University College in 1956. Applications are invited from officers of the Commonwealth Public Service possessed of the qualifications listed herein for Free Places to undertake a part-time course in this language.

Eligibility.—Eligibility is restricted to officers who were appointed not later than the 1st September, 1955, who are—

(a) Third Division officers; or

(b) Fourth Division officers who are qualified for transfer to the Third Division.

These conditions are subject to any prerequisite educational qualifications which may be imposed by the university concerned

VACANCIES FOR UNIVERSITY GRADUATES IN THE COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

APPLICATIONS for appointment to the Commonwealth Public Service are invited from British subjects who have obtained a degree at an Australian university or who will be taking their final examinations for a degree in 1955, and who were born not earlier than 1st March, 1930. Applications from ex-servicemen and ex-servicewomen over this age limit will also be considered.

SALARY.—The actual rate of salary on appointment for an adult graduate is £848 per annum for a male and £694 per annum for a female. After a year's service, this salary will be increased to £890 for a male and £736 for a female, if service is satisfactory. Advancement beyond these rates will be by promotion to a vacant office having a high salary scale.

How to Make Application.—Application should be made in the applicant's handwriting on forms obtained from Commonwealth Public Service Inspectors and university Registrars. Under question 7, on the form, particulars of any war service (length, nature, locality) should be included.

Early application is desirable. The receipt of applications will be acknowledged. Applicants who do not receive this acknowledgment within fourteen days should inform the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS.—An applicant should at any time after applying inform the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector of any change in his or her address.

SELECTION.—The final selection of applicants will be made by the Commonwealth Public Service Board. Applicants will be required to present themselves to a local selection committee for interview soon after application.

PERIOD OF ELIGIBILITY FOR APPOINTMENT.—Except in the cases of former members of the Forces, candidates who qualify will be eligible for appointment within the period of twelve months commencing on 3rd February, 1956, or until they reach the age of 26 years, whichever is the earlier. The eligibility of qualified candidates who are former members of the Forces will continue until they reach the age of 51 years, but will cease on attainment of that age.

Conditions of Appointment.—Every appointment will be on probation for six months (which may be extended to twelve months) and confirmation of appointment will be dependent upon conduct, diligence, and efficiency during probation. An appointee must produce evidence of date of birth and attend for medical examination as required by the Board. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the appointee's health and physical fitness for appointment. Upon confirmation of appointment, an appointee will be required to contribute to the Superannuation Fund.

Applicants should note that the National Service Act 1951 precludes employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under that Act and who have failed to register.
