PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by section two of the National Health Act 1955 that—

- (a) except as provided by the succeeding provisions of this section, that Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent;
 - (b) section thirteen of that Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the fourteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four;
 - (c) sections twenty-two, twenty-four and twenty-eight of that Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the twelfth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four; and

(d) sections twenty-three, twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven, thirty-two and forty-four of that Act shall severally come into operation on dates to be fixed by Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, as the date on which section forty-four of the National Health Act 1955, shall come into operation.

ONDITIONS GOVERNING RECRUITMENT AND PROMOTION OF CADET CHEMISTS, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE PRODUCTION. RECRUITMENT CONDITIONS

THE Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern recruitment and promotion of Cadet Chemists:—

1. Appointment.—Eligibility for appointment to a position of Cadet chemist will be acquired by—

(a) undergraduates who have completed one or more years of a Science or Applied Science degree at an Australian University; or
(b) students who have completed two years or stages of the Diploma course in Applied Chemistry at a recognized Technical College.

PROMOTION OR TRANSFER.—Eligibility for promotion or transfer as Cadet Chemist will be acquired by officers who have qualified for matriculation at an Australian University, or are eligible to commence the Diploma course in Applied Chemistry at a recognized Technical college, provided that in either case the officer has passed in the subjects of English, Mathematics, Chemistry and/or Physics at Leaving Certificate standard, or its equivalent.

3. Period of Elicibility.—Eligibility for appointment, promotion or transfer will terminate on the officer attaining the age of 24 years. The eligibility of an ex-serviceman derived from paragraph 1 (a) or (b) will terminate on his attaining the age of thirty-one years.

4. SALARY.—The salary range of a Cadet Chemist will be £369-£890. On attaining 21 years of age he will be paid a minimum salary of £722 per annum; provided that upon completion of a period of three years' training, if an adult, he shall be paid not less than £806 per annum, subject to evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that the diligence, conduct and progress of the officer during the period of training have been satisfactory and warrant such payment.
