IT is hereby notified, in accordance with the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1957, that a public auction of leases of the town lands described in Schedule Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 hereunder will be held at the Lands Office, Alice Springs, at 10 a.m. on Saturday, 13th December, 1958.

The lots described in Schedule No. 1 will be leased for residential purposes only, the lots described in Schedule No. 2 will be leased for business (retail shop) and residential purposes only, the lots described in Schedule No. 3 will be leased for business (industrial) and residential purposes only and the lot described in Schedule No. 4 will be leased for business (caravan park) and residential purposes only.

Leases of town lands are perpetual leases.

The annual rent payable in respect of each lot offered will be five pounds per centum of the unimproved value of the land subject to re-appraisal from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance.

Bidding will be by capital sum representing the unimproved capital value of the land. Each lot will be offered at the unimproved capital value, and, if no advance is made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser of the lease at that price; but, if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser of the lease at the price bid.

**Schedule No. 5.**

The lessee shall, within two years from the commencement of the lease, commence to erect upon the land leased an approved building to the value of not less than the sum shown in the fifth column of Schedule Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 in respect of each lot, and shall have completed the erection of the building within three years from the commencement of the lease. The said building shall be erected in conformity with the requirements of the Buildings Ordinance 1936 and the Regulations thereunder and in conformity with the requirements of any Act, Ordinance or Regulations in force. Further, the lessee shall, within twelve months from the

commencement of the lease, enclose the land with a good substantial fence to the satisfaction of the Administrator. **T**HE following promotions are provisional and subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and, where consequent upon another provisional promotion, shall be dependent upon the latter being confirmed. Appeals should be lodged, either by letter or telegram, within twenty-one days of the date of this notification, as follows:—

- (a) if the promotion is to be made in a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State;
- (b) if the promotion is to be made in the Australian Capital Territory, with the Public Service Inspector in Canberra, unless the promotion is to be made to a vacancy in the Postmaster-General's Department, in which case the officer shall lodge his appeal with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
- (c) if the promotion is to be made in the Northern Territory—
  - (i) with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane, in the case of a promotion to a vacancy in the Department of Customs and Excise;
  - (ii) with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Adelaide, in the case of a promotion to a vacancy in the Department of Civil Aviation or the Postmaster-General's Department;
  - (iii) with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra, in other cases;
- (d) if the promotion is to be made in Norfolk Island, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
- (e) if the promotion is to be made in the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane;

**Appeals not lodged with the appropriate Commonwealth Public Service Inspector within the prescribed period will not be accepted.**

Under Section 50 (7A) of the Public Service Act, the Board may regard an appeal as having been made against a provisional promotion notified hereunder by an officer who, at any time within the time prescribed for lodging an appeal, is absent on leave for war service, or is absent from Australia on official duty.

Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged in respect of each.

The grounds of appeal must be as prescribed in Section 50 of the Public Service Act, viz.:—

- (1) Where a promotion is to be made to a position prescribed in Regulation 109G, viz.:—Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Labourer, Grade 2; Lift Attendant; Line Foreman, Grade 1; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer; Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Phonogram Monitor (Female); Postal Assistant; Postal Assistant (Mail); Postal Clerk in the Fourth Division; Postal Officer; Preventive Officer, Grade 1; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Senior Postal Clerk, Grade 1; Storeman; Storeman, Grade 1; Storeman, Grade 2; Telegraphist in the Fourth Division—that the appellants is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient.

**EXAMINATIONS.**

**CONDITIONS GOVERNING RECRUITMENT AND ADVANCEMENT OF CADET EDUCATION OFFICERS.**

THE Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern recruitment and advancement of Cadet Education Officers.

1. **Appointment.**—Eligibility for appointment to a position of Cadet Education Officer will be acquired by graduates or undergraduates of an Australian university, who, preferably, have undertaken or are undertaking Arts courses, provided that the successful applicants are under 24 years of age as at the date of appointment.

Appointees should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

2. **Promotion or Transfer.**—Officers of the Service who are eligible for promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet Education Officer in accordance with this notification will be transferred or promoted pursuant to the provisions of Section 50 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958.

3. Applications by eligible officers for promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet Education Officer should be made in response to a notification published in the Commonwealth Gazette inviting such applications.

4. **Salary.**—The salary of a Cadet Education Officer will be within the range £385-£903 (S.). On attaining 21 years of age he will be paid a minimum salary of £858 (S.) per annum if a graduate, and £723 (S.) per annum if an undergraduate. A female Cadet Education Officer will be paid a minimum adult salary of £704 (S.) per annum if a graduate and £569 (S.) per annum if an undergraduate.

5. **Promotion under Section 53B.**—A Cadet Education Officer will become an Education Officer, Grade 1 (£903-£1,353 (S.)), upon successful completion of Cadetship, which entails—

- (a) satisfactory completion of a period of at least two years' training as Cadet; and
- (b) passing such examinations for advancement as are determined by the Public Service Board.

Commencing salaries for ex-cadets are: Male £1,038 per annum; Female £884 per annum.

Promotion is made under the provisions of Section 53b of the Public Service Act 1922-1958 and is not subject to appeal.

6. **Course of Training.**—Under sub-paragraph (b) of the preceding paragraph, the Board has approved of examinations for the Diploma of Education of an Australian University, and, in the case of undergraduates, the completion of an approved degree course.

7. **Failure at Examination.**—Subject to Section 67 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, if a Cadet Education Officer fails to obtain satisfactory results at the annual examinations, the Permanent Head of the Department will report to the Public Service Board as to the general efficiency and aptitude of the officer and his fitness to continue the cadetship. Upon receipt of such report, the Board will decide whether the cadetship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate.

8. **Fees.**—Refund of fees in accordance with the following scale will be allowed to Cadets in respect of subjects studied as part of their approved course of training:—
