By His Excellency the Governor-
General in and over the Common-
wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things provided that the Governor-General may appoint such times for holding the Sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, in the exercise of the power conferred by the said Constitution, do by this my Proclamation appoint Tuesday, the seventeenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, as the day for the said Parliament to assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and all Senators and Members of the House of Representatives are hereby required to give attendance accordingly in the building known as Parliament House, Canberra, at the hour of ten-thirty o'clock in the morning on the said seventeenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this twentieth day of January (L.S.) One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine and in the seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1957 of the Northern Territory of

Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for such purposes in relation to the Northern Territory as he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purpose of a site for a commemorative memorial the land described in the Schedule hereto being Crown land which is unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, the Administrator aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of a site for a commemorative memorial to be known as Reserve Number 1020.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

All that piece or parcel of land being Lot 1021 Alice Springs, in the Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 15½ perches more or less and more particularly delineated on Survey Plan C.11 lodged in the Lands and Survey Office, Darwin.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this fourteenth day of January, in the year of our (L.S.) Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine and in the seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

DEPARTMENT OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE.**CONDITIONS GOVERNING SELECTION AND TRANSFER AS INVOICE EXAMINING OFFICER-IN-TRAINING.**

THE Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern selection and transfer as Invoice Examining Officer-in-training:—

Applications.—Applications under these conditions will be invited in the Gazette from time to time from officers wishing to undergo training as Invoice Examining Officers.

Applications should be addressed to the Collector of Customs in the State in which the Training Course will be held, and should state fully the applicant's educational and other qualifications as well as the following particulars:—

Designation.
Standard salary scale.
Present salary and date of receipt.
Date of birth.
Date of first appointment.

Applicants should have had experience in the Department of Customs and Excise and be closely acquainted with Customs procedures and practices.

Duties.—Detailed Examination of Customs Entries and associated documents to ensure that—

Correct Customs Duty, Primage and Sales Tax are paid;

Import Licensing Regulations and provisions relating to Value for Duty, Preferential Tariff Rates and Rates of Exchange are complied with:

Statistical classification and quantities are accurate; and
Departmental Orders, Confidential Instructions, Inspectors' Orders &c., are complied with.

Selection.—A departmental committee will select—
the group of officers for training, and
one or two officers as reserves against the contingency of any of the officers selected for training becoming unavailable before the course begins.

The names of the officers selected for training and the reserves will be published in the Gazette. Any Third Division officer may, within 21 days of the date of such publication, lodge with the Public Service Inspector in the State in which he is located, an appeal against his non-selection. Protective appeals are not necessary as the case of a selected officer will be considered as a matter of course, against all appellants and against each of the other officers selected for training.

The Training Class will not commence until the results of all appeals are determined by the Board.

If an officer selected as a reserve is not included in the course, his selection as reserve does not give him any guarantee of selection for a later course.

Salary.—(a)(1) Officers of the Department of Customs and Excise who apply for training in a State other than that in which they are located will, if successful, be temporarily transferred at their substantive classifications (subject to (b) below) for the period of training. Travelling allowance will be paid. On completion of the course, officers will be required to accept permanent transfer at departmental expense at their substantive classifications to the State in which training is undertaken. Officers should keep in mind that courses will be held from time to time in all States except Tasmania.

(2) Officers from other Departments who apply will, if selected be temporarily transferred at their substantive classifications (subject to (b) below) to the Department of Customs and Excise for the period of training. Endeavours will be made to absorb these officers on completion of the course.

(b) Officers selected will be temporarily transferred to the Invoice Room—

- (1) During the earlier part of the course salary will be paid in accordance with officers' substantive classifications at the time of transfer.
- (2) At an appropriate stage of the course following the commencement of practical work officers not already receiving a higher actual salary will be paid at the minimum of the range for Invoice Examining Officers. Any additional payment will be made only until completion of training.
- (3) Any higher duty allowance will continue throughout the course provided that—
 - (i) The officer concerned would have continued acting except for the training selection;
 - (ii) Officers who were acting on the date of selection on a classification higher than that for a position of Invoice Examining Officer, will be considered as acting in a position classified at the level of Invoice Examining Officer.

Training.—Officers selected will be required to undergo a course of training not exceeding 24 weeks. During the initial part of the course, instruction will be given in the theoretical and procedural background to the examination of Invoices and in the relevant Acts, Regulations and Orders. Practical training will follow.

Examinations.—Officers will be required to undergo practical, oral and written tests from time to time to ensure that they are making satisfactory progress. If the Department of Customs and Excise, at any time in the course of training, considers that an officer is not making satisfactory progress he may be transferred to his former position or to one of similar status.

Recognition of Training.—Officers who complete the course satisfactorily will be regarded by the Department as having obtained the minimum standard of efficiency required to perform the duties of Invoice Examining Officer. The Public Service Board hereby notifies, under section 34 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, that the following general conditions shall apply to the examinations for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth notified hereunder.

How to Make Application.—Applications must be made on printed forms which are obtainable from, and should be lodged with, the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector—

Hobart—First Floor, Farmers and Graziers Building, cnr. Liverpool and Campbell streets, Hobart;
Canberra—Barton Offices.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. (b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations.—The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.
