PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section two of the Air Navigation Act 1920-1950 that that Act shall commence in relation to the several States and Territories on such days as are respectively fixed by Proclamation:

And whereas it is desirable that that Act shall commence in relation to the Territory of Christmas Island on the tenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine.

Now therefore I, Sir Wililam Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby fix the tenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, as the day on which the Air Navigation Act 1920-1950 shall commence in relation to the Territory of Christmas Island.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this 28th day of February, in the (L.S.) year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fiftynine and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

CUSTOMS PROCLAMATION No. 984.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1957 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation, amongst other things, appoint wharfs within ports and fix their limits:

And whereas by Customs Proclamation No. 850 published in the Gazette, No. 47, dated the fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, "Bretts Wharf", within the Port of Brisbane, in the State of Queensland, was appointed to be a wharf and its limits were fixed:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke that proclamation and to make other provision in its stead:

Now therefore, I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) revoke Customs Proclamation No. 850;
- (b) appoint the said "Bretts Wharf" to be a wharf within the meaning of that Act;

(c) fix the limits of that wharf in accordance with the description set out in the schedule to this Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Limits of Bretts Wharf in the Port of Brisbane, Queensland.

All that piece of land in the Parish of Toombul County of Stanley State of Queensland containing an area of 9 acres 2 roods 8.9 perches more or less being Portions 31, 267, 268 and 543, part of Portion 274, part of Portion 313, Resubdivision 1 and part of Resubdivision 3 of Subdivision 1A of Allotment 9 of Portion 2, part of a road, part of Crown land and a wharf constructed beyond high water mark: commencing on a south-western boundary of Crown land (known as Harbour Road) at the easternmost corner of Portion 264 (R. 1567, Recreation Reserve), Parish of Toombul, and bounded thence by part of the said southwestern boundary of Crown land (Harbour Road) and a line bearing in all 122 degrees 36 minutes 20 seconds 767.87 links; thence by another line bearing 85 degrees 54 minutes 35 seconds 100.94 links; thence by part of the western boundary of Portion 269 and a line along the western side of the adjoining Cold Stores wharf bearing in all 187 degrees 45 minutes 30 seconds 278.77 links; thence along the Quay line by lines bearing respectively 274 degrees 40 minutes 20 seconds 629.37 links, 357 degrees 27 minutes 45 seconds 170.21 links and 266 degrees 33 minutes 10 seconds 183.17 links; thence by another line bearing 344 degrees 41 minutes 15 seconds 22 links to Kingsford Smith Drive; thence by part of a south-eastern side of the said Kingsford Smith Drive bearing 66 degrees 42 minutes 20 seconds 240.23 links; thence by part of the south-western boundary of Resubdivision 3 of Subdivision 1A of Allotment 9 of Portion 2 Parish of Toombul, a line and part of the north-eastern boundary of the said Resubdivision 3 bearing respectively 157 degrees 35 minutes 20 seconds 20.1 links, 67 degrees 30 minutes 20 seconds 21.62 links; thence by part of another south-eastern side of the aforesaid Kingsford Smith Drive bearing 66 degrees 42 minutes 20 seconds 463.77 links; thence by lines bearing respectively 93 degrees 13 minutes 30 seconds 100.41 links, 180 degrees 11 minutes 30 seconds 29.23 links, 135 degrees 29 minutes 10 seco

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS Nos. 59/4255-4630 UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honourable Denham Henty, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act Pently, in pursuance of section 2738 of the Customs Act 1901-1957, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.



The Public Service Board hereby notifies under section 34 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, that the following general conditions shall apply to the examinations for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth notified hereunder.

How to Make Application.—Applications must be made on printed forms which are obtainable from, and should be lodged with, the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector-

Melbourne-Commonwealth Centre, cnr. Spring and Latrobe Streets;

Brisbane—Commonwealth Offices, Adelaide-street; Adelaide—Sixth Floor, Da Costa Building, 68 Grenfell-street; Perth—Third Floor, Commonwealth Bank Buildings, Forrestplace:

Hobart-First Floor, Farmers and Graziers Building, cnr. Liverpool and Campbell streets;

Canberra-Barton Offices.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

Applicants must be permanently residing in Australia or eligible for entry to Australia for permanent residence.

Non-attendance at Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

Change of Address.—Any change of address must be notified immediately.

-Unless otherwise specified in the notifi-Subjects of Examination.cation of a particular examination, the subjects and syllabuses of examination will be

- (a) Spelling.—To be judged from the candidate's transcription of misspelled and/or incomplete but readily recognizable words and/or from dictation. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 108.)
- (b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.) schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Caudidates from Examinations.—The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.


