## NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS Nos. 59/5026-5519 UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Denham Henty, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1957, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

4. Exemption Provisions.—(a) A candidate who has passed at an examination for promotion or transfer as Radio Inspector in any of the subjects prescribed above within five years of the date of the examination he wishes to contest, may claim exemption re-examination in the corresponding subject(s) at that examination.

The five year period should be calculated from the date on which the results of the examination concerned appeared in the

- (b) A candidate who has passed, not more than five years before the commencement date of the examination concerned, in any subject at an approved technical college or university which he considers to be equivalent to one of the subjects of this examination, may apply to the Controller (Radio), Postmaster-General's Department, Melbourne, for recognition of the subject as one which entitles him to claim exemption in the appropriate subject prescribed under these conditions.
- (c) A candidate who has passed in English at a standard equiva-lent to that for entry to or inclusion in the Third Division of the Commonwealth Service may claim exemption in the subject of English.
- 5. Period of Eligibility.—Five years immediately following Gazettal of the results of the examination. However, eligibility may be extended if, within the period of eligibility, the candidate:--

## 7. Syllabus of Examination.

## (i) English.

Paper A (essay, précis writing, punctuation, letter writing, and appreciation of prose): 3 hours.

Paper B (analysis, and use of words): 1 hour.

# Paper A.

Paper A will consist of three sections. Candidates will be required to study all sections.

#### Section 1.

Essay Writing.—Essays are a means of testing candidates' knowledge and also of assessing their capacity of self-expression. Essay writing requires the development of an adequate vocabulary and also certain techniques or skills.

They are either of the personal type as in the subject of English or are the means frequently adopted for reporting facts or developing arguments as in History and Economics. It is with the personal type of essay that students are concerned in this examination. Candidates will be given a choice of subjects, so that each may write on a theme within his own field of interest.

The essay requires the student after selecting his subject-

- (a) to collect his thoughts and opinions on the subject, expressing his ideas correctly (grammar and syntax), and suitably (vocabulary);
- (b) to arrange his thoughts, grouping sentences together which deal with one phase of the subject (paragraphs);
- (c) to develop his treatment of the subject in a logical sequence so as to arrive at a conclusion.

#### Preparation will require study and exercises in-

- (a) Vocabulary building, including the recognition of prefixes and affixes, simple Latin roots; grouping of words according to endings (affixes), e.g., -able, -ible, -ary, -ous, eous, &c.; singulars and plurals, especially borrowings from other languages now in common use; collective nouns as names of groups, e.g., shoal, bevy, committee; synonyms, antonyms and homonyms.
- (b) Rules of syntax.

- (c) Punctuation, keeping in mind, after learning the use of the stops, that over-punctuation should be avoided and that the function of punctuation is to show up the meaning and not to patch up faulty composition.
- (d) Grammar.—Parts of speech as follow should be understood and readily recognized:-

Nouns: proper, common, abstract and collective. Pronouns: personal, relative, demonstrative, interrogative, and possessive.

Adiectives: descriptive, numeral, demonstrative,

interrogative, and indefinite.

Adverbs: of time, place, manner, and degree.

Verbs: finite, infinite, transitive, intransitive, active, and passive.

Conjunctions: co-ordinate and subordinate.

#### The examination will also require candidates to develop their powers of expression-

- (a) Expression depends upon the word, the sentence, and the paragraph. When writing an essay students should:— aim to use the right word in the right place; choose apt adjectives and strong verbs; where necessary use explanatory phrases to enhance meaning and description.

  To avoid the use of the wrong word, students should study words likely to be confused, e.g., allusion, illusion; eligible, illegible; credible, creditable, &c.
- (b) Variety in sentence construction is also important, short sentences and long sentences being suitably blended, due regard being paid to balance, emphasis, and unity.
- (c) Paragraphs should be real, sentences dealing with one phase or aspect of the subject being grouped together; students should also use variety in the beginning of paragraphs.
- (d) Finally, in their essays, candidates should always aim at clearness of expression and simplicity of style; they should plan before writing and know clearly what they have to say.

#### Section 2.

# Précis Writing.-

- (a) Candidates should understand the meaning of précis writing, its use, and what is necessary to prepare a précis, including the value of an extensive vocabulary.
- (b) Dictionary work is essential; so too are exercises in the substitution of words for phrases, &c. Candidates should use their knowledge of grammar to aid them in discrimination; they should use principal clauses to give the main points and subordinate clauses to add the
- (c) Rough notes are important as a guide in preparing a précis.
- (d) Précis of correspondence: use of an index should take the place of rough notes; précis should be written from an index.
- (e) Précis of minutes of meeting: use an index on similar lines to précis of correspondence.

#### Section 3.

## A. Punctuation.

Direct questions will be set which require the candidates to punctuate sentences or short passages of continuous prose.

In their preparation, it will be necessary for candidates to study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with punctuation, and, through practice, to acquire facility in applying accepted principles regarding the use of stops.

Candidates should aim at a clear understanding of the function of each stop. For example, the appropriate use of a hyphen in (b) changes the meaning of the following words:—

- (a) Old gold braid = old braid of a gold colour.
- (b) Old-gold braid = braid of the colour known as "old-gold".

# B. Letter Writing.

Your ability as officers of the Commonwealth Public Service to write concise, clear, complete, correct, and courteous letters is a distinct advantage; on the other hand your inability to do this is a serious handicap.

As recommended in Section 3A (Punctuation), candidates should study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with letter writing, noting those conventions which make for correctness, and also those qualities that make a letter attractive as well as correct.

In their preparation, candidates should aim to acquire facility in writing Business Letters, Official and Semi-official Letters, and also Social Letters.

## C. Appreciation of Prose.

Candidates will be required to read carefully a passage of prose and to answer direct questions on the content.

If appropriate to the passage, questions will also be set to test the candidate's ability to recognize figures of speech. These, though met with more frequently in poetry than in prose, are devices employed to achieve the effect of vividness and to hold the attention. In prose, figures of speech are generally used quite naturally and are part of the writer's style.

Candidates should study carefully the chapters of the prescribed text-books which deal with figures of speech.

#### Paper B.

Paper B will consist of two sections, both of which are compulsory.

#### Section 1.

Analysis.—Analysis should be regarded as the dissection of sentences to show the functional relationships which exist among parts of the sentences.

These parts are of three kinds:-

- (a) Words.
- (b) Phrases.
- (c) Clauses.

Candidates will not be asked to deal extensively with words or phrases in analysis but are advised to study the types and functions firstly of words and then of phrases in order that they may clearly understand the kinds and functions of clauses.

There is no easy road to success. Analysis calls for the exercise of reason and not the application of memorized "rules". Candidates are strongly advised, when preparing for the examination, to adopt a questioning approach. They should ask "Is this a clause?" "Why is this a clause?" "What duty or function does this clause perform?" Only in this way will candidates develop confidence and certainty in analysis. The syllabus and the examination papers emphasize the functional approach.

The essential factor in analysis is the ability to identify clauses and this skill is best achieved through the study firstly of words and then of phrases.

- (a) Words: The identification and description of words is called "parsing". Questions will be set within the following range of topics:—
  - (i) Nouns-Proper and common, including person, number, gender and case.
  - (ii) Pronouns—As for nouns; also personal and relative pronouns.
  - (iii) Verbs—Transitive and intransitive, including person, number and tense (present, future and past only).
  - (iv) Adjectives—Including ability to state the noun described by an adjective.
  - (v) Adverbs-Including ability to state the verb, adjective, or adverb modified by an adverb.
  - (vi) Prepositions-Including ability to state the noun or pronoun governed by a preposition.

Note.—Difficult or complicated questions will not be set. object is to encourage candidates to acquire an understanding of parsing as a preparation for the proper study of analysis.

# (b) Phrases

Candidates will not be directly examined on their knowledge of phrases, but are strongly advised to study the use of adjectival and adverbial phrases. This will assist in the recognition and separation of clauses in analysis.

# (c) Clauses

- A clause is a group of words which contains one finite verb-
  - (i) Principal Clauses. (These make complete sense on their own. They are like small sentences. There must be at least one principal clause in a sentence.)
  - (ii) Noun Clauses. (These do the work of a noun.) Required to know-
    - (a) Noun clause subject of a verb-That he will be late is certain.
    - (b) Noun clause object of a verb-
      - I know that he is efficient.
    - (c) Noun clause object of a participle.
      - He stood there wishing that they would arrive.
    - (d) Noun clause object of a preposition—
      That is different from what I was told.

## (iii) Adjectival Clauses

An adjectival clause adds meaning to a noun or to a noun clause.
That is the man whom I saw.

Adjectivel clauses are introduced by a relative pronoun, frequently "who", "whom" or "which".

Candidates should learn that other words can be used as relative pronouns, e.g., "where" (That is

the house where I was born) and "that". In particular, students should learn to distinguish between adjectival clauses and noun clauses both of which can be introduced by "that".

Required to know

Adjectival clause introduced by who, whom, whose, which, that, where, as (after "such" or "some") and other relative pronouns.

Relative pronouns—

(a) Subject of a verb.

(b) Object of a verb.

(iv) Adverbial Clause

Adverbial clauses, like adverbs, add meaning to verbs, adjectives and other adverbs.

Required to know-

- (a) Adverbial Clause of Reason: e.g., introduced by conjunctions like "because", "since", "as", "for".
  (b) Adverbial Clause of Purpose: e.g., introduced by conjunctions like "in order that", "so that", "lest", "that".
  (c) Adverbial Clause of Time: e.g., introduced by conjunctions like "when", "while", "after", "before", "till", "until", "since", "as", "as soon as".
  (d) Adverbial Clause of Manner: e.g., introduced
- (d) Adverbial Clause of Manner: e.g., introduced by "as".
- (e) Adverbial Clause of Place: e.g., introduced by "where".

Candidates are warned against memorizing the conjunctions which usually introduce the various clauses. It will be observed that "as" can introduce adverbial clauses of reason, time and manner. Relying on rote memory instead of examining the func-tions of clauses will lead to incorrect answers.

At the examination the analysis will be submitted on a special form contains columns for the following information which:-

Clause.—The clause is to be entered in full.

Kind of Clause.—e.g., Principal, noun, adjectival, adverbial (of time, purpose, &c.).

Function—e.g., qualifying or modifying part of sentence (to be stated). Noun clauses should be stated as "subject of . ." or "object of . . .". No entry is required for a principal clause.

Verb.—Finite verbs only should be entered.

Subject-i.e., the subject of the verb entered in the previous

The set passage will be a short piece of continuous prose. Parenthetic matter will not be included.

#### Section 2.

Use of Words.—Candidates' preparation in this section will require study and drill as well as exercises in the following:—

- (i) Antonyms (including the use of prefixes in the formation of antonyms), synonyms, homonyms.
- (ii) Nouns and the adjectives derived from them, e.g., choir, choral
- (iii) Verbs and their corresponding nouns; e.g., propose, proposal.
- (iv) Plurals of nouns, including irregular plurals and plurals of foreign words in common use, plurals of compound nouns, plurals which are the same as the singular, words with two plurals of different meaning.
- (v) Genders of nouns.
- (vi) Rules for the possessive case.
- (vii) Verbs and their principal parts.
- (viii) Preposition idioms.
- (ix) Correction of faulty sentences (with reasons for corrections).
- (x) Recognition of redundant words, &c.
- (xi) Recognition of the shades of meaning in groups of words similar but not the same in meaning, e.g., announce, intimate, inform, advise, &c. The use of such words in sentences so as to reveal the particular shade of

In the study of words, especially synonyms and antonyms, the student should use his dictionary and note well the distinctions between words of similar meaning; synonyms have the same general meaning, not the same meaning, e.g., efficient—able, qualified, competent, satisfactory, &c. This does not mean that any one word may be substituted for any other word. Each has its peculiar use. Strive for the word rather than a word.

When a new word is learned, the student should learn its opposite, its extensions to include the different parts of speech, e.g., change verbs, nouns, adjectives, into participles, abstract nouns, &c.

The student should study rules of syntax in conjunction with grammar. He should make one help the other. Rules are set out in the text-books recommended. Sentences for correction should be constantly revised. When a student has learned some new fact in grammar he should apply it to his general English so as to

  - (iii) alternating current of audio frequencies (up to 15,000 cycles per second);
  - (iv) alternating current of radio frequencies.
- (b) Principles of power generating and converting equipment used in telecommunication practice.
- (c) Direct Currents: Principles and operation of D.C. generators, motors and dynamotors (genemotors); commutation and commutation difficulties; necessity for earthing; insulation; transmission and distribution systems including traction services with particular reference to radio interference problems; primary and secondary batteries used in radio systems.
- (d) Single Phase Currents: Generation of single phase alternating currents; power in A.C. circuits; alternating current circuits, including behaviour of circuits containing R., L. and C. separately or in series and parallel combinations; single phase transformers; single phase induction and commutator motors and rotary converters; transmission and distribution including high tension lines, the pilot arc welder and luminous discharge lighting systems with particular reference to radio inductive interference problems relating thereto; static rectifier principles, thermionic and metal types.
- (e) Three Phase Currents: Principles of generation of polyphase currents; power in three phase balanced and unbalanced circuits; star and delta connexions, current and voltage relations; three phase transformers; three phase transmission and distribution systems including high tension transmission lines with particular reference to interference problems; three phase motors, induction, wound rotor and commutation types; three phase rotary converters; three phase static rectifiers, thermionic and metal types.

[Note.—Officers contesting the examination in this subject are advised that a knowledge of mathematics at no lower than matriculation standard is desirable.]

# (iii) Radio Technology.

- (a) General Principles; Principles of electro magnetic wave propagation; ground wave, ionospheric and tropospheric propagation; polarization; field intensity computations; the radio spectrum; high frequency oscillations; capacitors and inductors at radio frequencies; reactance; impedance; turned circuits; resonance; coupled oscillatory circuits; types of waves; progress of wireless telegraphy—spark, arc and continuous wave systems; wireless telephony and broadcasting—systems of modulation; production of side bands by modulation; principles of reception of radio signals.
- (b) Vacuum Tubes: Thermionic emission; types of emitters; filament, grid and anode circuits; amplification factor; plate resistance; mutual conductance; magnetic shielding; inter-electrode capacities; neutralization of circuits, screened grid tubes; pentode tube; amplifiers, tuned and untuned radio frequency amplifiers, resistance capacity coupled, choke capacity coupled and transformer coupled audio frequency amplifiers. R.F. and A.F. power amplifiers; cooling; tube losses. Oscillators—Hartley, Colpitts, Tuned

Grid-tuned Plate. Meissner, electron-coupled, grid anode and grid cathode connected quartz crystal oscillators; special types of oscillators for the higher frequencies, including the magnetron, klystron and microwave triode oscillators.

- (c) Transmitting Circuits: Oscillators and drive equipment; self excited transmitters, master oscillators, stability of operation at a given frequency, buffer amplifiers, separator amplifiers, frequency multiplication; final R.F. amplifiers; modulators and modulation—amplitude modulation; frequency and phase modulation; pulse modulation; generation and suppression of harmonic and spurious radiations.
- (d) Receiving Circuits: Coupling circuits; sensitivity, selectivity and standard output power; detection; R.F. amplifiers; A.F. amplifiers; power amplifiers; T.R.F., regenerative, super regenerative and superheterodyne receivers; single side band and suppressed carrier receivers; crystal filters and band pass circuits; automatic gain and frequency control circuits; circuits for higher frequencies including frequency modulation, pulse modulation and television
- (e) Radiating Systems and Aerial Coupling: Aerials and radiation patterns; ground effects; driven and parasitic arrays; long line aerials; Vee and rhombic aerials; V.H.F. and U.H.F. aerials; vee and momoic aerials; v.H.F. and O.H.F. aerials; transmission lines, feeders and wave guides; methods of coupling to aerials and to transmitters; suppression of harmonics.
- (f) Broadcasting Services: Frequency control; frequency checking and measuring; field intensity studies and service areas; contour maps; fading and distortion; selection of station sites; methods of monitoring; modulation; landline operating levels in dbs and VUs; landline troubles and location of faults; power transfer efficiencies; outside amplifiers and pick ups; studio amplifiers, microphones and acoustics; other studio equipment; mixers and line pads; attenuators; shared channel broadcasts; synchronized broadcasts; short, medium and long wave broadcasting; duties of station engineers.
- (g) Radio Navigational Aids: Non-directional Beacons; Primary Radar; Secondary Radar; Instrument Landing Systems; Visual-aural Range; Hyperbolic Navigation Systems; V.H.F. Omni-direc-tional Range; Direction Finding Systems.
- (h) Television: Fundamental principles; analysis and synthesis of images; fundamental optics; electron optics; camera tubes; picture tubes; pulse techniques; television waveform generation; transmission of video signals; video amplification; carrier transmission of video signals; television transmitting equipment; studio techniques and equipment; outside broadcasts.

[Note.—Officers contesting the examination in this subject are advised that a knowledge of Mathematics at no lower than matriculation standard is desirable.]

#### (iv) Radio Equipment.

- (a) Broadcast Station Equipment; Installations used for broadcast purposes including frequency modulation, facsimile and television; frequency monitors; audio monitoring.
- (b) Point to Point and Miscellaneous Services: Installations utilized in coast stations, land stations, aeradio stations and other stations licensed for communication and other purposes within the Commonwealth.
- (c) Mobile Service: Installations on vehicles, ships, lifeboats and aircraft including navigational aids; e.g. direction finders, automatic alarms, radio beacons, altimeters, radar and emergency

- (e) Measuring and Test Equipment: Safety first principles observed in high tension DC, low frequency and radio frequency circuits; measurement of output power by indirect methods; measurement of R.F. power including power in lines and aerials; measurement of impedance in R.F. and A.F. circuits; modulation measurements; fidelity, noise and distortion checks; measurement of frequency, field strength; measurement of audio characteristics
- (f) Television Station Equipment: Broadcasting installations including studio, control, monitoring, microwave link and transmitting equipment.

# (v) Drawing and Design.

- (a) Elementary principles of engineering drawing with particular reference to radio circuits and use of standard symbols.
- (b) Ability to read all or any part of radio receiving or transmitting circuits, to produce a written description of such circuits or parts and to trace portion of any circuit; to apportion a radio circuit into block schematic form and to trace and label dangerous parts such as those carrying high voltage, D.C., A.C. and/or R.F.
- (c) Ability to produce a neat circuit drawing from details supplied, layout, symbols and lettering to follow standard drawing practice.
- (d) A general knowledge of principles underlying the design of radio equipment and installation in terms of suitability, weakness or merit of choice of circuits, components, radiating systems, feeder

lines, earthing systems, station sites, safety of operation as applied to transmitters, circuit components, aerial and earth systems, and sites as applied to receivers. The ability to compare alternatives in terms of merits and demerits.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed for the subjects of Electrical Technology, Radio Technology, Radio Equipment and Drawing and Design. However, the following are recommended for reference:---
