CUSTOMS PROCLAMATION No. 985.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1957 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamaamongst other things, appoint boarding stations for the boarding of ships by officers:

And whereas by proclamation published in the Gazette No. 51, dated the twentieth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and four, at page 976, such a boarding station was appointed for the port of Brisbane, in the State of Queensland:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke that proclamation and to make other provision in its stead:

Now therefore, I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby

(a) revoke that proclamation; and
(b) appoint all those waters described in the schedule to this proclamation to be a boarding station within the meaning of that Act for the boarding of ships by officers.

THE SCHEDULE.

Limits of Boarding Station, Port of Brisbane, Queensland.

All those waters of the Brisbane river in the State of Queensland within the following boundaries, viz: commencing on the right bank of that river at the mouth of Crab Creek and bounded thence by a line across that river bearing 306 degrees to its left bank; thence by that left bank south westerly and upstream to the easternmost corner of portion 21 Parish of Toombul County of Stanley; thence by a line across that river bearing 118 degrees to its right bank as defined by Gibson Island; thence by that right bank as defined by that island; thence by a line across the mouth of Aquarian passage connecting the north eastern end of that island to a retaining wall known as Lytton Wall; and thence by that wall north easterly and downstream to the point of commencement.

ORDER OF GENERAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AS TO VEHICLES.

N pursuance of Regulation 47 of the Explosives Regulations, I, A Shane Dunne Paltridge, Minister of State for Shipping and Transport, hereby make the following order:—

1. This order is of general application.

2. I direct that Commonwealth explosives may be loaded on and transported by a vehicle which is an approved vehicle within the meaning of Part II of the Second Schedule of the said Regulations with the exception that the fuel tank may be fitted in a position wholly mounted on the part of the vehicle known as the "prime mover" in such a manner that portion of the fuel tank is directly below that part of the body which carries the load.



The Public Service Board hereby notifies under section 34 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, that the following general conditions shall apply to the examinations for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth notified hereunder.

Hobart-First Floor, Farmers and Graziers Building, cnr. Liverpool and Campbell streets;

Canberra-Barton Offices.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

Applicants must be permanently residing in Australia or eligible for entry to Australia for permanent residence.

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candi-dates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations. -The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which

a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of

persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

Successful candidates who, at the date of application, were not British subjects, must, on request, produce evidence of their British naturalization in the form of a certificate or in such other form as the Board may determine.
