PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS.

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT AND THE NATIONAL HEALTH (PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS) REGULATIONS.

Amending Determination No. 1 of 1959

POR the purposes of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953-1958 and for the purposes of the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, Donald Alastair Cameron, Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:-

- 1. This determination will come into operation on the first day of May, 1959.
- 2. The determination made for the purposes of section 85 of the Act and for the purposes of the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations and published in the Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of February, 1959, is in this determination referred to as the Principal Determination.

NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

l'ASTORAL LANDS OPEN FOR LEASING IN TERMS OF THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE 1931-1959.

A PPLICATIONS for pattoral leases, of the lands described, and subject to the conditions set and A subject to the conditions set out hereunder, will be received at the Lands Office, Darwin, on or before 12th August, 1959.

Plans of Blocks.—These may be inspected at the Lands Office, Darwin, Lands Office, Alice Springs, and the Department of Territories, Canberra.

Application Forms.—Applications must be made in accordance with the prescribed forms which are available at the Lands Office, Lands Office, Alice Springs, and the Department of Territories, Canberra.

Deposit.—The first year's rent, together with payment for, or the first instalment, as the case may be, on Crown improvements (if any), and a lease and registration fee of £1 10s., must be deposited with each application: Provided that where an applicant elects to apply for more than one block by expressing an order of preference he will be required to deposit a sum equal to the highest rental, together with the lease and registration fee, &c.

Land Not Applied for.—Any land not applied for on 12th August, 1959, shall remain open for application as advertised and may be alloated by the Administrator to any persons who apply at the rental and subject to the conditions set out hereunder.

Date of Expiry of Leases.—Leases of all blocks will be for a term of 50 years, expiring on 30th June, 2010.

Rentals of Leases.—The rentals of the leases of all blocks shall be at the rate set out in the schedule for the first ten years of the terms of the leases and thereafter at rates determined by reappraisement every successive tenth year of said term.

Improvements.—All Crown improvements on the land to be leased shall be purchased by the successful applicant at the valuations set out in this notice. The successful applicant may if desired purchase these improvements by instalments, in which case the number of instalments and the amount of each payment will be as set out in respect of each block.

All other authorized improvements on the land to be leased shall remain the property of the present owners, and shall be purchased at a valuation to be determined by the Administrator: Provided that where the incoming lessee has agreed with the owner as to payment for the improvements no determination of the Administrator shall be necessary.

Reservations.—In addition to the special reservations and conditions specified hereunder, the lease will contain the reservations provided for in the Crown Lands Ordinance, namely—

- (a) A right of entry and inspection.
- (b) All minerals.
- (c) A power of resumption. The power of resumption can be exercised on six (6) months' notice where the land is required for public purposes, such as for the use of the aboriginal native inhabitants of the Northern Territory, defence, forest, mineral and goldmining, travelling stock, recreation and amusement grounds, roads, tramways, railways or railway stations, water conservation works, railways or railway stations, water conservation works, or other like purposes, and two (2) years' notice when the land is required for any other purpose. Note.—When the land is required for cultivation purposes, two (2) years' notice of resumption shall be given; and the land resumed shall not include the head station, or any of the leased land within five (5) miles thereof, or the principal watering place on the land.
- (d) All timber trees, and all trees producing bark, resin, or valuable substances.
- (e) In favour of the aboriginal inhabitants of the Northern Territory.

Covenants.--In addition to the special covenants and conditions specified hereunder, covenants and conditions will be inserted in the lease as follows:-

- (a) A covenant to pay the rent annually in advance.
- (b) A provision that if the rent is not paid on or before the expiry of three months from the date on which it becomes due, ar addition of 5 per cent. per annum may be made in respect of the rent overdue.
- (c) A covenant by the lessee that he will use the land only for the purpose for which it is leased.
- (d) A provision that the lessee, having paid all rent due by him, may at any time in manner prescribed surrender the lease.
- (e) A provision that the lease shall be liable to forfeiture if the rent is unpaid for six months or more.
- (f) A provision that the lease shall, subject to the regulations, be liable to forfeiture for non-compliance on the part of the lessee with any covenant or condition of the
- (g) A covenant by the lessee that he will comply with the laws in force relating to the destruction of vermin and noxious weeds.
- (h) A covenant by the lessee that he will not, without the consent of the Administrator, cut any timber trees on the leased land except for use on or in connexion with the land.
- (i) A covenant by the lessee that he will not, in clearing the land, destroy any timber or timber trees, or trees producing any valuable bark, resin, or other valuable substances, except as allowed by the regulations.
- (j) A covenant by the lessee that he will not obstruct any public roads, paths, or ways, or interfere with the use thereof by any person, and will not interfere with travelling stock lawfully passing through the leased land.
- (k) A covenant by the lessee that he will not pollute, divert, or obstruct any water flowing in a defined natural channel unless by consent of the Administrator.

- (l) A covenant by the lessee that he will observe and comply with the regulations under the Crown Lands Ordinance for the time being in force.
- (m) A covenant by the lessee that he will comply with the requirements of the lease as to developmental work and improvements, and, during the continuance of the lease, maintain developmental work and improvements on the land comprised in the lease to the satisfaction of the Administrator. (The requirements as to develop-mental work and improvements are listed in the schedule hereunder.)
- (n) A covenant by the lessee that he will stock the land in accordance with the provisions of the lease and keep the land so stocked during the continuance of the lease, provided that if a notice is served on him under section 39A of the above Ordinance he will comply with the requirements of the notice.
- (o) A provision that the lease shall not be transferred during the first five years except in the case of the death of the lessee, or of his being taken with an illness which in the opinion of the Administrator will render him unable to manage the lease and comply fully with the conditions.

Liverpool and Campbell streets;

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this pur-If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

Applicants must be permanently residing in Australia or eligible for entry to Australia for permanent residence.

Non-attendance at Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

Change of Address.--Any change of address must be notified immediately.

Subjects of Examination.—Unless otherwise specified in the notification of a particular examination, the subjects and syllabuses of examination will be-

(a) Spelling.—To be judged from the candidate's transcription of misspelled and/or incomplete but readily recognizable words and/or from dictation. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 108.)
(b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition,

traction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bank-ruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their

order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there

be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations.--The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers,-A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. ful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

Successful candidates who, at the date of application, were not British subjects, must, on request, produce evidence of their British naturalization in the form of a certificate or in such other form as the Board may determine.

3. Manipulative Tests.-

(a) Reception by ear for a period of three (3) minutes for each section of the test, and recording by type-writer or teletypewriter, of code groups at a speed

writer or teletypewriter, of code groups at a speed of 16 groups per minute and text in plain language at a speed of 20 words per minute.

Code groups shall be variously of five (5) letters and five (5) figures, one figure group corresponding for the purpose of counting to two (2) complete letter groups. The plain language test shall be in English with punctuation and shall average five (5) characters to a word. Punctuation will be restricted to the full stop and the fraction bar, both of which shall count as two (2) characters.

(b) Transmission by means of a Morse key or an approved semi-automatic sending device of messages in code groups at a speed of 16 groups per minute, and plain language text at a speed of 20 words per minute.

The duration of these tests shall not be more than three (3) minutes.

Counting and composition of groups and plain language text shall be as prescribed in (a) above.

Candidates will be given the opportunity of indicating which test or portion of a test they would prefer to do first.

Telegraphy Test.—One hundred marks will be allotted to each item of the receiving and transmitting test. Deduction of marks will be made for any uncompleted portion of the test, errors and operating faults and the marks obtained will be determined as follows:—

1. Receiving.—Three marks will be deducted for each uncorrected error with a maximum deduction of 9 marks for any word or group. The marks obtained are determined by deducting the total of the marks deducted from 100.

To pass in this test, a candidate must obtain at least 70 marks in each item of the test.

2. Transmitting.—Three marks will be deducted for each uncorrected error, one mark will be deducted for each

uncorrected error, one mark will be deducted for each incompletely corrected error. One mark will be deducted for each badly formed character. One mark

will be deducted for each incorrect space.

A maximum of ten seconds will be allowed over the 3 minutes test period to compensate for time taken to effect corrections during test.

The marks obtained are determined by deducting the

How to Make Application.—Applications must be made on printed forms which may be obtained, either upon written or personal request, from the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, 119 Phillip-street, Sydney. When obtaining this form, applicants must state whether they are—

- (a) permanent officers; or

Order of Selection.—Qualified candidates will be selected for entry to the Class for training in Stenography or Typing in order of merit which will be based on the results of subject (b) above. Where two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained for (a) English and where those marks are also equal (b) by lot.

Order of Promotion or Transfer as Typist (Female).—In pursuance of the Board's determination under section 53 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, officers of the Service who complete the Typist-in-training course and mass the end-of-course examination in Typewriting or Typewriting and Shorthand shall be eligible for promotion or transfer to an office of Typist (Female).

In pursuance of Section 53a of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, the Board hereby determines that candidates who pass the end-of-course examination specified in the previous paragraph shall be eligible for promotion or transfer to an office of Typist (Female), in accordance with their order of merit at that examination.

Conditions of Engagement and Subsequent Appointment.-Qualified candidates, to the number required, will be engaged under exemption as Typists-in-training, and will be trained in the work of the position of Typist (Female). Before commencement work of the position of Typist (Female). Before commencement of training each successful selected candidate will be required to undergo a medical examination to determine fitness for permanent appointment but should not undergo examination until instructed to do so.
