By-law No. 91.

Commonwealth Railways By-law No. 91 amends By-law No. 77, General Rules for the Conduct of the Traffic and the Guidance of the Employees in Commonwealth Railways Service.

By-law No. 77, as amended by By-laws Nos. 83, 84 and 87 is further amended as follows:—

Rule 1 (b) is amended by omitting the words "Chief Traffic Manager" from the 8th and 9th lines, and inserting in their stead the words "Chief Mechanical Engineer, Chief Traffic Manager, and Chief Civil Engineer".

Rule 1 (d) is omitted and the following rule is inserted in its stead:—

"1 (d). 'Employee' means any person employed by the Commissioner under the Commonwealth Railways Act."

Rule 1 (1) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"1 (1). 'Fireman' shall mean any employee engaged as observer or in firing on a locomotive and otherwise assisting the driver."

Rule 1 (n) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"1 (n). 'Railway' or 'Railways' or 'Commonwealth Railways' means any railway vested in the Commissioner, and, where necessary, includes all lands, buildings, works, and things connected with or appurtenant thereto."

Rule 1 (q) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"1 (q). 'Train' shall include a light engine (i.e. an engine or engines coupled, without vehicles), a rail car and motor inspection car; and shall include also a motor section car, self-propelling track maintenance machine, or similar unit when it is impracticable for it to be removed from the line by the employees accompanying it."

Rule 7 (a) is amended by adding after the word "rules" (the last word in the last line) the words—

"Members of track maintenance or special gangs to whom a copy of these rules is available in the gang trolley shed, must make themselves conversant with such rules."

Rule 10 is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"10 (a) (i). The consumption of, or possession of intoxicating liquor by an employee during hours of duty (including the time he is travelling on duty as a passenger) is prohibited.

(ii). An employee shall not report for duty under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

(iii). An employee, whether on or off duty, shall not bring intoxicating liquor on to any railway premises other than a residence for consumption thereon by himself or any other employee.

(iv). An employee, whilst on duty, shall not enter any railway premises for the purpose of obtaining or consuming intoxicating liquor.

(v). An employee breaking any of the provisions of this rule will be suspended immediately.

(vi). Where an employee occupying a position involving the responsibility of life and property is known to indulge in intoxicants to excess whilst off duty, he will be regarded as unfit for employment and steps taken to terminate his services.

(b). If an employee-in-charge or sub-charge is of the opinion at any time that an employee is unfit to perform his duties in a proper manner by reason of the consumption of or indulgence in intoxicating liquor, or the after effects of the consumption of or indulgence in intoxicating liquor, he shall suspend that employee from duty and immediately report the matter to the Head of the Branch through his officer-in-charge.

(c). Any employee who observes at any time that another employee on duty is apparently under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall report the matter to a superior officer immediately. An employee failing to report such cases will be held blameworthy in common with the employee whose wrongdoing is in question.

(d). An employee must not hand over his duties to another employee unless he is satisfied of the sobriety of the person about to relieve him.

(e). An employee, whether on or off duty, who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor, shall not remain on any railway premises.

(f). For the purposes of this rule 'railway premises' includes all railways vested in the Commissioner and all lands buildings works and things connected therewith or appurtenant thereto."

Rule 35 is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"35. A distant signal must not be lowered while the home or starting signal is at 'danger', nor until all is in order for the train to proceed into the section ahead."

Rule 37 (a) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"37 (a). When a distant signal is at 'danger' the driver of an approaching train must be prepared to stop at the next signal ahead, should it be in the 'stop' position."

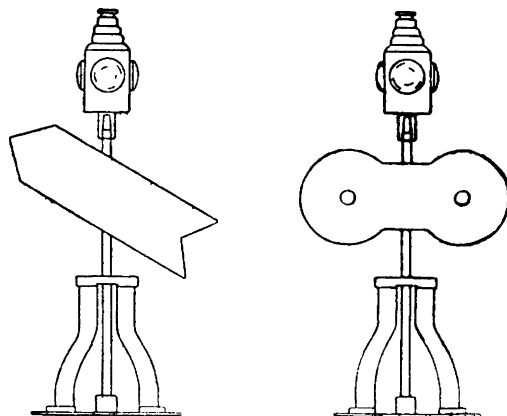
Rule 43 (a) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

"43 (a). At crossing stations and crossing sidings where no fixed signals are provided the engine driver must, when a crossing has to be made, bring his train to a stand at least 20 yards clear of the outside facing points, and must not again move his train until he receives an 'all right' hand signal, given from the facing points, by the signalman when the station is attended, or by the guard (or by the fireman where permitted under regulations), when the station is unattended, together with an intimation as to the road on which he is to run. The engine driver must satisfy himself, when moving his train forward, that the points are set for the road on which he is to run."

Rule 43 (d) is amended by deleting the words 'signalman or guard' from the last line and inserting in their stead the words, 'signalman, guard, or fireman.'

Rule 50 (c) is amended by deleting Clause (c) and illustrations, and inserting the following in their stead:—

"50 (c). Switch stand type point indicators shown below exhibit the following aspects and indications:—

Day—Red Dumb Bell
Night—Red light

siding."

Rule 52 (b) is amended by inserting, after item 14 of the description of hand signals, the following descriptions of additional hand signals:—

- “(15) Intimation by conductor in charge of rear car of express passenger train that rear of train has arrived complete within landmark signal. Green flag in daytime, or green light at night, held steadily above the head.
- (16) Intimation to guard by conductor in charge of rear car of express passenger train that all is in order for train to proceed. White flag in daytime, or white light at night, held steadily above the head.”

Rule 53 (b). The last paragraph of Rule 53 (b) is amended to read as follows:—

“Hand lamps and flags, when used as signals, and except when they are employed for the purpose of marking an actual point of obstruction, must whenever possible be held in the hand, and not be placed upon or stuck into the ground, or fixed elsewhere.”

Rule 71 (b) is amended by deleting the number “209” from the last line, and inserting the number “214” in its stead.

Rule 72 (a) is amended by deleting the word “levels” from the eleventh line, and inserting in its stead the word “levers”.

Rule 80 is amended by inserting the word “not” between the words “when” and “on duty” in the ninth line.

Rule 94 (b) is amended by inserting the words “and the shutters or blinds must be drawn” between the words “must be closed” and “not only” in the second line.

Rule 102 (a) is amended by deleting the words “to see” from the eleventh line and inserting the words “and must see” in their stead.

Rule 111 (c) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

“111 (c). Tail discs tail lights or side lights must not be carried by engines drawing trains, or in any position other than on the rear vehicle.”

Rule 111 (d) is amended by deleting the word “brake-van” from the first line and inserting the word “vehicle” in its stead.

Rule 112 is amended by omitting clauses (a), (b), (c) and (e) relating to the exhibition of signals to indicate the running of following or opposing special trains.

Rule 134 (i) is amended by deleting the word “steam” from the fourth line and inserting the word “power” in its stead.

Rule 136 is amended by deleting the word “steam” from the eighth line and inserting the word “power” in its stead.

Rule 154, as amended by By-law No. 87, is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

“154 (a). The signal for starting a train must be given by the guard showing the prescribed hand signal, and, when necessary, blowing his whistle. The guard's signal must be a green flag in the daytime, and at night a green light, held steadily above the head, the signal to be exhibited until acknowledged by the driver sounding the engine siren, or whistle.

(b). At an attended station the guard, before signalling the driver to start, must obtain an intimation from the Stationmaster that all is right for the train to proceed. The Stationmaster's intimation that all is right to proceed must be given by a hand signal in the daytime, as illustrated in Rule 53 (c), and at night by a white light held steadily above the head.

(c). On express passenger trains, when the conductor in charge of the rear car is on duty the guard, before signalling the driver to start, must exchange signals with that conductor.

The conductor concerned must, under such circumstances, give the guard an intimation that all is right so far as he is concerned, by a white flag in the daytime, and at night by a white light, held steadily above the head. This signal must be exhibited until the guard's signal to start is acknowledged by the driver.

Where the station is attended, these signals must not be exchanged until the guard has received an intimation from the Stationmaster that all is right to proceed, in accordance with Clause (b) hereof.

(d). When the train has started, the guard must, as soon as practicable, signal to the driver that he is in his van and the train is following complete. This signal must be a green flag in the daytime, and a green light at night, waved outwards from the brake-van, and must be exhibited until acknowledged by the driver sounding the siren or whistle. (See Rule 52 (b)(6).)

On express passenger trains, when the conductor in charge of the rear car is on duty, the guard, before signalling the driver that the train is following complete, must again exchange signals with that conductor. The conductor concerned, if he is in his car and the train is following complete, must indicate accordingly to the guard by repeating the signal prescribed in Clause (c) hereof, which must be exhibited until the guard's ‘train complete’ signal is acknowledged by the driver.

(e). At the commencement of a journey, or when re-starting a train after being stopped from any cause whatever, the driver must receive the prescribed signal to start, and also the ‘train complete’ signal, each of which must be acknowledged by sounding the siren or whistle.

If the signal to start, or the ‘train complete’ signal, is received by the fireman, he must immediately communicate it to the driver.

(f). On a railcar having no fireman, the intimation to the driver to start must be given by the guard, either verbally in the driver's cab, or by a single stroke on the electric bell or buzzer given from the guard's vestibule. When the guard is not riding with the driver, the ‘train complete’ signal must be given by a further single stroke on the bell or buzzer. Each bell or buzzer signal must be acknowledged by the driver sounding the siren.

In the event of a failure of the bell or buzzer, the guard's signals must, when necessary, be given in accordance with Clauses (a) and (d) of this Rule.”

Rule 166 (c) is omitted and the following Rule is inserted in its stead:—

“166 (c). When trains are to cross at a station where there is no resident staff on duty, both trains must be brought to a stand 20 yards outside the outermost facing points, or at the home signal where provided.

The guard (or, where so prescribed in the regulations, the fireman) of the train which arrives first must satisfy himself that the road is clear and correctly set for the train which, in accordance with any regulations on this subject, is to be admitted first; and he must then lower the home signal or give an ‘all right’ hand signal from the facing points to the driver to admit that train to the station. After that train has come to a stand clear of the fouling points at both ends or, if this is not possible, has been protected as required in Clause (b) above, its guard (or fireman, where so prescribed) must in the above-mentioned manner admit the second and any subsequent train.

If two trains arrive at or about the same time, the guards must come to a clear understanding as to the working to be adopted.

The guard of the train which leaves last must satisfy himself, before it leaves, that all signals are in their normal position; that all points, choke-blocks and derailleurs in the running lines are set and secured in their normal position, and that everything is left in proper order.”

Rule 173 is amended by inserting “(a)” following the figure 173, thus: “173 (a)”; and by inserting an additional clause, (b), as follows:—

“173 (b). Any mechanical post-hole borer or like equipment with a lifting portion similar to a jib, before being conveyed by train, must be similarly inspected and secured before despatch. It must also, when practicable, be so placed that the lifting portion points towards the rear of the train.”

Rule 178 is amended by inserting the word “it” between the words “deliver” and “to” in the fourth line.

Rule 190 (b) is amended by inserting the words “it is” between the words “If” and “possible” in the tenth line.

Rule 191 (b) is amended by inserting the word “and” between the words “trucks” and “the sending” in the twelfth line.

Rule 207 (a) is amended by deleting the second sentence, reading:—

“It must not, under any circumstances, be attached to a train, and when not in use must be taken off the rails, placed well clear of the line and road approaches, and, unless locked in the trolley shed, the wheels must be secured with chain and padlock.”

and inserting the following sentence in its stead:—

“It must not, under any circumstances, be attached to a train. When not in use, it must be taken off the rails, and be placed at least ten (10) feet clear of the centre of the line and of road approaches, and, unless it is locked in the trolley shed, the wheels must be secured with chain and padlock.”

Rule 208 is amended by omitting the words “trolley or section car” from the third and fourth lines, and inserting in their stead the words “motor section car, motor quadricycle, hand tricycle, trolley or similar manual or power propelled vehicle . . .”.

Rule 209 (b) is amended by inserting the word "red" between the words "cases" and "flags" in the twelfth line.

Rules 212(c), 214(1) (a) (c) (e) (g), 220(a), 225 and 229(b) are amended by deleting the words "the Head of the Branch controlling Way and Works operations" wherever occurring and by substituting in lieu thereof the words "Chief Civil Engineer".

Rule 212 (d), as amended by By-law 87, is omitted, together with the diagram referred to therein, and the following Rule and diagram are inserted in their stead:—

"212 (d) The signals referred to in (c) are of two designs, and are constructed of posts with boards or discs for day signals, and with lamps for night signals, as shown hereunder:—

(i) Warning signal:

By day—A board, fishtailed at each end, painted yellow with the word "WARNING" in black letters thereon in front, and painted green at the back. A number plate, indicating in miles per hour the permissible speed over the restricted section, will be fitted to the front of the board.

When one temporary speed restriction is followed immediately by another temporary restriction of higher speed, the warning board at the end of the first restricted section must be fitted on its reverse side with an additional number plate, indicating in miles per hour the permissible speed over the further restricted section still ahead. This additional plate will be facing towards the driver of a train which is about to enter the second restricted section.

By night—Two lamps, fixed one on each side of the post, approximately one foot below the warning board. Each lamp, when lighted, will exhibit a purple light to the front and a white back light.

(ii) Caution signal:

By day—A disc, painted yellow with the word "CAUTION" in black letters thereon in front, and painted green at the back.

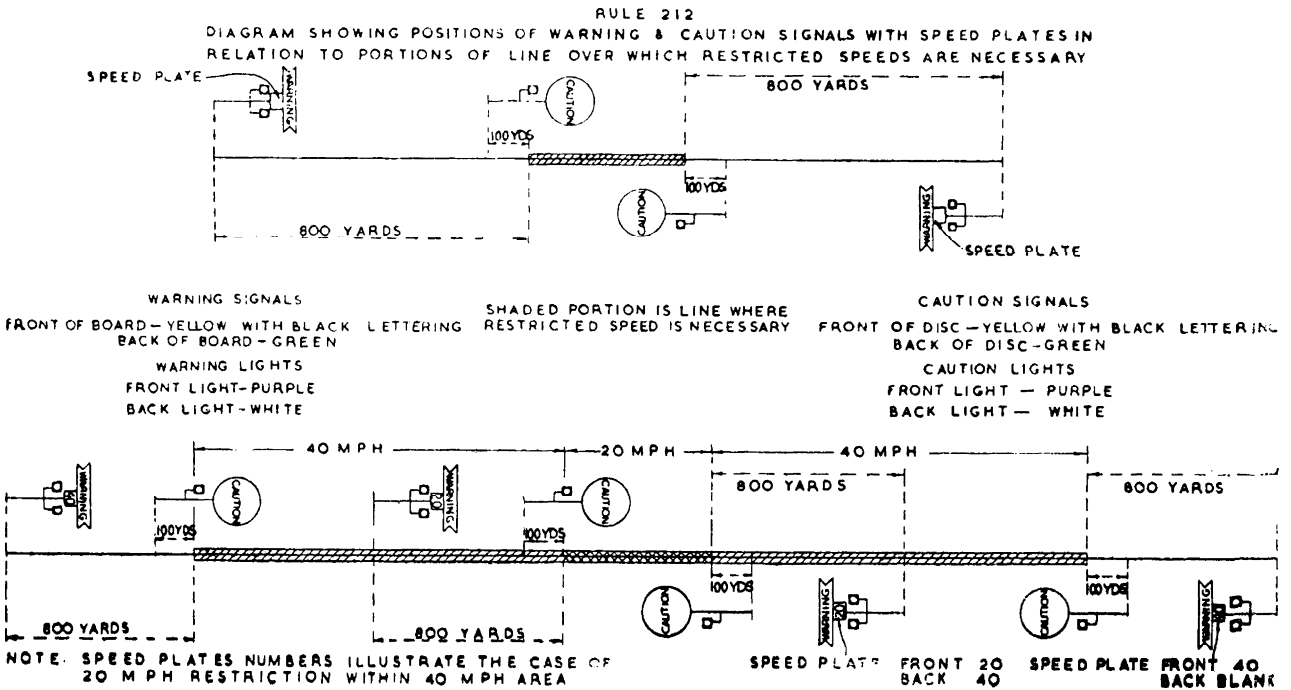
By night—One lamp, fixed approximately one foot below the caution disc. When lighted, the lamp will exhibit a purple light to the front and a white back light.

The warning signals must be placed in each direction, at a distance of not less than 800 yards, or as much further as the circumstances necessitate, from the nearer end of the portion of the line over which restricted speed is necessary (see diagram).

The caution signals must be placed in each direction, at a distance of 100 yards from the nearer end of the portion of the line over which restricted speed is necessary (see diagram).

When one temporary speed restriction is followed immediately by another temporary restriction of lower speed, the second restriction must be indicated by warning and caution boards as for a separate speed restriction.

Rule 212 (e), inserted by By-law 47, is amended by deleting the word "green" (the last word in the thirteenth line) and inserting in its stead the word "warning".



Rule 222 is amended by deleting the concluding sentence, reading: "Fettlers are required to look for the signals referred to in Rule 112".

Rule 228 (e) is amended by altering the word "building" in the last line to read "buildings".

Rule 240 is amended by omitting the first sentence, reading:

"Gangers or foremen should stand on the driver's (left hand) side of passing trains, and the other employees of the gang on the opposite side . . ."

and inserting the following sentence in its stead:—

"The ganger or foreman should stand on the driver's side of passing trains, and the other employees of the gang on the opposite side . . ."

EXAMINATIONS.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING RECRUITMENT AND PROMOTION OF TEACHERS-IN-TRAINING, DEPARTMENT OF TERRITORIES, NORTHERN TERRITORY ADMINISTRATION.

THE Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern recruitment and promotion of Teachers-in-training. These conditions amend those which appeared in Gazette, No. 75, dated 11th December, 1958.

1. **Appointment.**—Eligibility for appointment to a position of Teacher-in-training will be acquired by—

- (a) candidates who have passed the examination for appointment to the Third Division of the Commonwealth Public Service as Clerk or Cadet, based on the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation and Schools Board Certificate examinations in the various States and including a pass in English; or
- (b) graduates of an Australian University in an appropriate field.

Appointees should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the act and who have failed to register.

2. **Promotion or Transfer.**—Eligibility for promotion or transfer as Teacher-in-training will be acquired by officers who have—

- (a) passed an examination held under the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1958 for appointment, promotion or transfer to the Third Division as Clerk or Cadet;
- (b) passed the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation or Schools Board Certificate examination of an Australian State or an examination which qualifies for matriculation in an Australian University; or
- (c) graduated at an Australian University in an appropriate field;

provided that in either (a) or (b) the officer passes in the subject of English.

3. **Period of Eligibility.**—Applicants should be at least 17 years of age and eligibility for appointment, promotion or transfer will terminate on the candidate attaining the age of 30 years, except where eligibility derives from paragraph 1(a) when it is limited to the period of eligibility for appointment from the examination. The eligibility of an ex-serviceman will terminate on his attaining the age of 31 years.

4. **Salary.**—The salary range of a Teacher-in-training will be £385-£903 (S.). On attaining 21 years of age he will be paid a minimum salary of £858 (S.) per annum if a graduate and £723 (S.) per annum if a non-graduate. A female Teacher-in-training will be paid a minimum adult salary of £704 (S.) per annum, if a graduate, and £569 (S.) per annum if a non-graduate.

5. **Promotion under Section 53B.**—A Teacher-in-training will become a Teacher £903-£1,353 (S.) upon successful completion of training which entails—

- (a) satisfactory completion of a period of at least two years' training as Teacher-in-training, or such lesser period as the Board may determine; and
- (b) passing such examinations for advancement as are determined by the Public Service Board.

Promotion is made under the provisions of Section 53B of the Public Service Act 1922-1958 and is not subject to appeal.

6. **Course of Training.**—Under the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the Board has approved an appropriate course of teacher-training at a New South Wales Teachers' College, together with special training to meet Department of Territories requirements, including lectures by the staff of the Australian School of Pacific Administration. The usual course will be two years, but graduates may take a one-year Diploma of Education course with special study of Primary School methods. In addition, arrangements will be made during the course and during long vacation for orientation courses to be undertaken in preparation for the work in the Northern Territory.

7. **Failure at Examinations.**—Where a Teacher-in-training fails to obtain satisfactory examination results, the Permanent Head of the Department will report to the Public Service Board as to the general efficiency and aptitude of the officer and his fitness to continue the course of training. Upon receipt of such report, the Board will decide whether the traineeship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate, in accordance with the provisions of Section 67 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958.

8. **Fees.**—Refund of fees in accordance with the following scale will be allowed to trainees in respect of subjects studied as part of their approved course of training:—

When two or more of the above rates of salary are received by the trainee in a calendar year, the percentage of fees to be refunded will be that shown in relation to the rate of salary received for the greater portion of the year.

9. **Contract of Service.**—Each trainee will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth and to be guaranteed by an approved surety of £500 that he will pursue to completion the approved course of training, unless permitted by the Public Service Board to relinquish it, and continue in the employment of the Commonwealth for a period of at least three years after completing the traineeship.
