CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 1332-1342 AND 1365-1367.

I, NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1959, hereby make the By-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

By-law No. 1332.

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1332.
2. The By-laws listed in the Schedule hereunder are amended by inserting immediately following paragraph 1 of each by-law the following paragraph:—

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Denham Henty, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1959, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Limited will, unless cause is shown to the contrary, be struck off the Register and the company will be dissolved.

Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance 1933-1954.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION TWELVE RELATING TO POISONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section twelve of the Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance 1933-1954 of the Australian Capital Territory, I, Donald Alastair Cameron, the Minister of State for Health, hereby amend the notice under that section which was published in the Gazette on the twentieth day of February, 1958, and which, amongst other things, declared certain drugs, chemicals and compounds to be poisons—

(a) by inserting after item 5 in Part I. of the Schedule to that notice the following item:—

“5A β-aminopropylbenzene (Benzedrine), its salts, its N-alkyl derivatives, and their salts; β-aminoisopropylbenzene, its salts, its N-alkyl derivatives, and their salts; but not including those substances, salts or derivatives when absorbed in inert solid material in an appliance for inhalation.”;

(b) by omitting item 14 in Part I. of that Schedule and inserting in its stead the following item:—

“14 Codeine, its salts, and preparations and admixtures containing more than one per centum of codeine.”;

(c) by inserting after item 21 in Part I. of that Schedule the following item:—

“21A Ethyl morphine, its salts, and preparations and admixtures containing more than one per centum of ethyl morphine.”;

(d) by inserting after item 34 in Part I. of that Schedule the following item:—

“34A Phenmetrazine, its salts, and preparations and admixtures of phenmetrazine or its salts.”;

(e) by omitting item 6 in Part II. of that Schedule;

(f) by omitting item 17 in Part II. of that Schedule and inserting in its stead the following item:—

“17 Codeine, namely, preparations and admixtures of codeine or its salts containing one per centum or less of codeine.”;

and

(g) by inserting after item 28 in Part II. of that Schedule the following item:—

“28A Ethyl morphine, namely, preparations and admixtures of ethyl morphine or its salts containing one per centum or less of ethyl morphine.”.

EXAMINATIONS.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF APPOINTMENT EXAMINATIONS.

The Public Service Board hereby notifies under section 34 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, that the following general conditions shall apply to the examinations for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth notified hereunder.

How to Make Application.—Applications must be made on printed forms which are obtainable from, and should be lodged with, the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector—

Sydney—Phillip House, Phillip-street;
Melbourne—Commonwealth Centre, cnr. Spring and Latrobe streets;
Brisbane—Commonwealth Offices, Adelaide-street;
Adelaide—6th Floor, Da Costa Buildings, 68 Grenfell-street;
Perth—Third Floor, Commonwealth Bank Buildings, Forrest-place;
Hobart—First Floor, Farmers and Graziers Building, cnr. Liverpool and Campbell streets;
Canberra—Barton Offices.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

Applicants must be permanently residing in Australia or eligible for entry to Australia for permanent residence.

Non-attendance at Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

Change of Address.—Any change of address must be notified immediately.

Subjects of Examination.—Unless otherwise specified in the notification of a particular examination, the subjects and syllabuses of examination will be—

- (a) Spelling.—To be judged from the candidate's transcription of misspelled and/or incomplete but readily recognizable words and/or from dictation. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 108.)
- (b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations.—The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

Successful candidates who, at the date of application, were not British subjects, must, on request, produce evidence of their British naturalization in the form of a certificate or in such other form as the Board may determine.

Refusal by the Board to Appoint Successful Candidates.—The Board may, upon sufficient evidence of an adverse nature respecting the conduct, character or ability of a successful candidate or upon sufficient evidence that a successful candidate has knowingly made a false statement in respect of his application to sit for an examination for appointment, direct that that successful candidate shall not receive appointment.

Refusal of Appointment.—If a successful candidate declines to accept an appointment, or fails to reply within seven days to a communication from the Board, the Public Service Inspector, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs, or a Department, respecting nomination to the Public Service, the candidate's name may be removed from the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment".

WHEREVER SPECIFIED HEREUNDER THESE CONDITIONS MUST BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE CONDITIONS NOTIFIED FOR PARTICULAR EXAMINATIONS.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR PROMOTION OR TRANSFER AS POSTAL CLERK, SENIOR POSTAL CLERK OR POSTMASTER.

THE Public Service Board hereby notifies the following conditions in pursuance of Section 53 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958:—

An examination as above will commence annually on the second Saturday of March and September, and on other occasions as approved.

2. Officers Eligible to Enter—

- (a) Officers (Male) of the Third Division (to secure or extend eligibility for transfer or promotion as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk and Postmaster, Grade 2 and higher).
- (b) Officers (Male) of the Fourth Division (to secure or extend eligibility for transfer or promotion as Postmaster, Grade 1, or to secure or extend partial qualifications for transfer or promotion as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk and Postmaster, Grade 2, and higher).

3. Subjects and Pass Conditions—

Subject.	Duration.
Manipulative Test	—
Technical and Traffic (written)	2 ½ hours
General Postal and Counter Duties (written)	1 hour
Money Order Duties (written)	1 hour

To pass this examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects.

Note.—To complete their qualification for promotion or transfer as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster, Grade 2 and higher, candidates must also pass, or have passed, one of the following:—

- (a) The examination held in June each year to enable officers in the Fourth Division to qualify for inclusion in the Third Division as Postmaster, Senior Postal Clerk, Postal Clerk, &c., or
- (b) The examination held in October, each year to enable officers in the Fourth Division to qualify for inclusion in the Third Division as Clerk, or
- (c) An examination prescribed by the Board for appointment, promotion or transfer as Clerk.

4. Exemption Provisions.—(i) The following may claim exemption from the Manipulative Test, and Technical and Traffic Test:—

- (a) A Telegraphist, Supervisor (Telegraph), Traffic Officer (Telegraphs) or an officer qualified for these positions.
- (b) A Principal or Instructor, Postal Training School who was formerly a Telegraphist, Supervisor (Telegraph) or Traffic Officer (Telegraphs).
- (c) A Clerk, Telegraph Service Branch who was previously designated Telegraphist, or who has passed an examination for promotion as Telegraphist, provided that he produces a certificate of proficiency from the Superintendent, Telegraph Service Branch.

(ii) On officer who passes in any of the subjects listed in Section 3 above may claim exemption from re-examination in that subject at the next five succeeding examinations. If, during this period of eligibility, he performs for not less than three months continuously as a temporary occupant, the duties of Postal Clerk, he may claim exemption from re-examination in the subject(s) concerned for a period of two years from the date he ceased to act in that position.

(iii) An officer who passed in any of the subjects as notified in the Gazettes shown below may claim exemption from re-examination in the equivalent subject under these conditions, as follows:—Part IV. of Conditions in Gazette No. 32 of 6th June, 1957—at the September, 1959 and March, 1960 examinations of this type.

(iv) An officer who was designated Telegraphist, Supervisor (Telegraph) or Traffic Officer (Telegraphs) within three years immediately preceding the date of a manipulative test under these conditions may claim exemption from that test.

(v) An officer who passed in any of the Telegraphy Tests of conditions as notified in the Gazettes shown below may claim exemption from re-examination in similar tests under these conditions, as follows:—Parts II. and III. in Gazette No. 32 of 6th June, 1957—as for (iii) above.

(vi) An officer eligible for promotion as Postal Assistant who qualified by passing the written examination, or a Postal Assistant who passed such an examination, may claim exemption from re-examination in General Postal and Counter Duties and Money Order Duties.

(vii) An officer who, during the currency of exemptions from re-examination in any of the subjects under these or previous conditions, performs for not less than three months continuously as a temporary occupant the duties of Postal Clerk, may claim exemption from re-examination in the equivalent subject(s) for a period of two years from the date on which he ceased to act in that position.

5. Period of Eligibility—

A. Indefinite.

(i) A Principal, Senior Instructor or Instructor, Postal Training School who was formerly a Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster, or who has qualified in accordance with these conditions or those which were previously in operation for those designations.

(ii) An Inspector, Post Offices Branch or a District Postal Inspector.

(iii) An officer who has previously qualified for transfer or promotion as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk and Postmaster, provided the Assistant Director-General (Postal and Transport Services) or the Assistant Director (Postal and Transport Services) as the case may be, certifies he has, in the full-time performance of appropriate duties in the Postal and Transport Services Division, given satisfactory evidence of the retention of the requisite qualifications.

However, if he qualified at telegraphy tests under earlier conditions and did not pass in teleprinter manipulative tests, he may be required to undergo a special course of training in manipulative telegraphy if transferred or promoted as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster.

B. Limited Period.

(i) In the case of an officer as specified in (A) above, and who is transferred or promoted to a position not requiring the qualifications of a Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster—three years from the date on which duties of the position mentioned in (A) above were last performed.

(ii) In the case of an officer who passes, or has passed, one of the examinations shown in the Note to Section 3 above, and

- (a) who obtained his qualifications in the Departmental subjects at one examination—three years from date of gazettal of examination results.

- (b) who obtained his qualifications in the Departmental subjects over more than one examination—three years from date of gazettal of the results of the earliest of these examinations.

- (c) who, during the currency of his eligibility has performed for not less than three weeks continuously, as a temporary occupant of the position, the duties of Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk, Postmaster, or of Clerk attached to a District Inspector's Office (other than Staff Clerk)—three years from the date on which he ceased to act in that position.

- (d) who is transferred or promoted from Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster to a position not requiring such qualifications—three years from the date on which those duties were last performed.

- (e) who has obtained his qualifications by more than one examination and who has extended the duration of some of his qualifications by higher duties service—three years from the date on which he ceased to act in such position for not less than three months continuously.

(Note.—If an officer is prevented, by illness or any other reason accepted by the Board, from attending an examination to preserve the continuity of his eligibility for transfer or promotion in accordance with these conditions, the Board may extend the period of his eligibility until the completion of the next succeeding examination.)

6. Promotion of Transfer.—The promotion or transfer of officers who qualify under these or the conditions previously in force, will be effected in accordance with the provisions of Section 50 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958.

7. Syllabus.

Manipulative Test.

The candidate will be required to demonstrate ability to—

- (a) transmit in the standard manner by teleprinter or teletype keyboard or, if this is not practicable, type on a typewriter, in each of two periods of 30 minutes each on one day with a minimum intervening period of one hour, 32 typical telegrams averaging 15 words per telegram.

- (b) attend to the telegraphic reception of telegrams by teleprinter or teletype by checking and treating in 30 minutes in accordance with the approved procedure, 32 telegrams averaging 15 words per telegram.

Telegrams selected will be typical in every respect of those dealt with under actual working conditions, and the texts of approximately 5 per cent. of the telegrams contain secret language groups.

In arranging the tests, due allowance will be made for the preamble and for the prescribed miscellaneous operations associated with traffic disposal.

Marks will be deducted for any incompleted portion of the test, corrected and uncorrected errors, operating faults and traffic irregularities.

(Note.—(1) Where it is impracticable to carry out locally the test under (b) above, a candidate will be tested in the procedures involved in the receipt of telegrams sent by teleprinter or teletype.

(2) An officer who qualified as Postal Clerk under earlier conditions, but who did not qualify in the teleprinter manipulative tests, may be required to undergo a special course of training on teleprinter manipulation.)

Note.—A candidate at an examination for promotion or transfer as Postal Clerk, Senior Postal Clerk or Postmaster under conditions notified in this issue of the Gazette will also be regarded as a candidate for the written examination under these conditions held at the same time. His name will be included in the list of successful candidates at this examination, if he passes in General Postal and Counter Duties, Money Order Duties and Technical and Traffic, but is unsuccessful in any or all of the remaining subjects.
