#### EXCISE BY-LAW No. 38.

NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the Excise Tariff 1921-1959 and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following by-law to operate on and from 16th July, 1959.

- 3. The following petroleum or shale products may be delivered under Item 11 (A) (1) of the Excise Tariff 1921-1959, viz.:-
  - (a) Petrol and other petroleum spirit, if produced by condensation process from natural casing head gas from Australian petroleum oil wells.
  - (b) Benzene or other hydro-carbon spirit produced in con junction with nitration grade toluene from light oil stripped from petroleum gas in an oil gas plant, the volume of which is not more than 2.25 times the volume of toluene produced.
  - (c) Toluene, nitration grade, produced from light oil stripped from petroleum gas in an oil gas plant.

- (d) Petroleum or shale products, otherwise classifiable under Excise Tariff Item 11 (a) (2), for use other than as fuel or for admixture with fuel, subject to the following conditions:-
  - (i) Any person wishing to obtain delivery of a petroleum or shale product for use other than as fuel or for admixture with fuel shall make written application to the Collector setting out---
    - (a) the quantity and character of such product required and the purpose for
    - which it is to be used;
      (b) the licensed factory or licensed Customs
      Warehouse from which such product is to be obtained;
    - (c) the location of the premises in which it is intended that the product shall be used.
  - (ii) The making application (hereinafter person called the applicant) in accordance with sub-paragraph (i) shall furnish a security to the satisfaction of the Collector for the protection of the revenue and for compliance with the provisions of this by-law.
  - (iii) When an application for the delivery of any petroleum or shale product for use other than as fuel or for admixture with fuel has been approved by the Collector, the applicant shall make an entry in the manner prescribed for other circumstances by Section 58 of the Excise Act 1901-1958. Such entry shall, inter alia, specify thereon the purpose for which and the premises at which the product is intended to be used.
  - (iv) After the passing of the entry the petroleum or shale product shall be forthwith removed to the premises specified in the entry.
  - (v) Every person to whom any petroleum or shale product is delivered for use other than as fuel or for admixture with fuel shall keep records in the form set out hereunder and at the end of each month shall balance such records and certify to the correctness thereof:-

THE following promotions are provisional and subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and, where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

#### Where to lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram within twenty-one days of the date of this notification. If the promotion is to an office in:-

- (c) the Northern Territory, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane, for a promotion to a vacancy in the Department of Customs and Excise; with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Adelaide, for a promotion to a vacancy in the Department of Civil Aviation or the Postmaster-General's Department; and with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra, in other cases;

(d) Norfolk Island, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
(e) the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane;
(f) the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Perth;

(g) a place outside the Commonwealth (and not being a place specified above), with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra.
