CUSTOMS PROCLAMATION No. 994.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1959 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation, amongst other things, appoint wharfs and fix their limits:

And whereas it is desirable to appoint New Bundaberg Wharf, at the port of Bundaberg, in the State of Queensland to be a

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby

- (a) appoint that wharf to be a wharf within the meaning of that Act;
- (b) fix the limits of that wharf in accordance with the description set out in the schedule to this Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Limits of New Bundaberg Wharf, at the Port of Bundaberg, Queensland.

Commencing at the southernmost corner of Section 20 of Sub-division 1 of Portion 4 County of Cook, Parish of Barolin, in the State of Queensland; thence by the right bank of the Burnett River downstream to a point being 4 chains 43.6 links bearing 244 degrees 5 minutes from the easternmost corner of Section 27 of that Subdivision; thence bounded on the south-east by the southdegrees 16 minutes for 3 chains 14.5 links; thence bounded on the south-west by the outside edge of the wharf fenders being a line bearing 337 degrees 16 minutes for 3 chains 90.6 links; thence bounded on the north-west by the north-western end of the wharf, being a line bearing 67 degrees 16 minutes for 3 chains 14.5 links; thence by the right bank of that river downstream to the junction of its affluent, Saltwater Creek; thence by the left bank of that creek to a point being on the prolongation of the south-west

No native customary rights were retained at the appointed date in relation to any of the pieces of land listed above.

Non-attendance at Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

Subjects of Examination.—Unless otherwise specified in the notification of a particular examination, the subjects and syllabuses of examination will be-

(a) Spelling.—To be judged from the candidate's transcription of misspelled and/or incomplete but readily recognizable words and/or from dictation. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 108.)
(b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, Sub-

traction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations.—The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence. that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board.
