Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby fix the first day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, as the day on which the Geneva Conventions Act 1957 shall come into operation.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 7.

REVOCATION OF EXEMPTION OF TRADE IN AND WITH THE NORTHERN TERRITORY.

EXEMPTION OF TRADE IN THE NORTHERN TERRITORY.

BY His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

Whereas by section seven of the Navigation Act 1912-1958 it is provided, inter alia, that a ship shall be deemed to be engaged in the coasting trade within the meaning of that Act, if she takes on board passengers or cargo at any port in a State, or a Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, to be carried to, and landed or delivered at, any other port in the same State or Territory or in any other State or other such Territory:

And whereas by the second proviso to that section it is provided that the Governor-General may by order declare that the carrying of passengers or cargo between ports in any Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, or between ports in any such Territory and any other Australian ports, or ports in any other such Territory shall not be deemed engaging in the coasting trade:

And whereas by order dated the twentieth day of December, 1923, the Governor-General did make a declaration under that proviso:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke that order and make other provision in its stead:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- revoke that order; and
- declare that the carrying of passengers or cargo between ports in the Northern Territory of Australia shall not be deemed engaging in the coasting trade.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS.**

**DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF
THE ACT AND THE NATIONAL HEALTH (PHARMA-
CEUTICAL BENEFITS) REGULATIONS.**

FOR the purposes of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953-1958 and the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, Donald Alastair Cameron, Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:—

1. The determination made for the purposes of section 85 of the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations and published in the Gazette on the 26th day of February, 1959, as amended by amending determination 1 of 1959 is repealed.

2. In this determination—

(a) "pensioner pharmaceutical benefit" means a pharmaceutical benefit in relation to a pensioner under paragraph (b) of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953-1958 as affected by this determination;

(b) the abbreviations appearing in the Schedules to this determination have the following meanings:—

"amp." means ampoule.

"cap." means capsule;

"cc." means cubic centimetres;

"Fl. oz." means fluid ounces of 480 minims;

"G." means grammes;

"γ" means microgrammes;

"gr." means grains;

"hypo. tab." means hypodermic tablet.

"I.U." means international units determined in the year 1950 by the Expert Committee on Biological Standardization of the World Health Organization;

3. 4. The following drugs and medicinal preparations being drugs and medicinal preparations that are the subject of monographs in the British Pharmacopoeia are not pensioner pharmaceutical benefits:—

(a) a drug or medicinal preparation that is a medicinal gas;

(b) Subject to sub-paragraph 4(d) of this determination, any drug or medicinal preparation which is specified in the First or Second Schedule to the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations, or any salt, ester, or derivative of a drug or medicinal preparation so specified; and

6. A drug or medicinal preparation specified in the Third Schedule to this determination is a drug or medicinal preparation available to pensioners if the drug or medicinal preparation—

- (a) is in the form indicated in that Schedule in the name or formula of the drug or medicinal preparation; or
- (b) is an ingredient in a medicinal compound which is, subject to the next two succeeding clauses, in any medicinal form and which contains another drug or medicinal preparation that is a pensioner pharmaceutical benefit.

7. A drug or medicinal preparation or a medicinal compound prescribed for supply in the form of a cachet, pill or tablet is not a pensioner pharmaceutical benefit unless the form in which it is prescribed for supply is a form specified in relation to the drug or medicinal preparation, or in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation in the medicinal compound, as the case may be, in the Third Schedule to this determination or in a monograph in the British Pharmacopoeia.

8. A drug or medicinal preparation or a medicinal compound prescribed for supply in capsule form is not a pensioner pharmaceutical benefit unless—

- (a) the form of capsule is specified in relation to the drug or medicinal preparation, or in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation in the medicinal compound, as the case may be, in the Third Schedule to this determination or in a monograph in the British Pharmacopoeia; or
- (b) the Director-General, the Director, or the Commonwealth Director of Pharmaceutical Services, is of the opinion that the drug or medicinal preparation or the medicinal compound is of a particularly nauseous character and authorizes it to be prescribed in capsule form.

9. Subject to the next succeeding clause, the maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may be prescribed for each supply of the benefit is—

- (a) in the case of a general pharmaceutical benefit—the quantity or number of units specified in the First or Second Schedule to this determination, as the case may be; and
- (b) in the case of a pensioner pharmaceutical benefit—such quantity or number of units as is specified in relation to the form of the benefit in the Fourth Schedule to this determination.

10. Where a medical practitioner who writes a prescription for the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit is satisfied that—

- (a) the maximum quantity or number of units specified in this determination in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is insufficient for the medical treatment of the person for whom the prescription is written;
- (b) that person is suffering from a chronic illness or is residing in a place remote from the approved pharmaceutical chemist nearest to that place of residence; and
- (c) that person could not, without great hardship, obtain that pharmaceutical benefit on separate occasions, the medical practitioner may, in the prescription, direct that there be supplied at the one time a specified quantity or number of units of the pharmaceutical benefit, not exceeding the total quantity or number of units that could be supplied if he had directed that the supply of the benefit be repeated the maximum number of times allowable and the original supply and repeated supplies were to be supplied at the one time.

11. For the purposes of the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations, the maximum number of times, if any, the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may be repeated is—

- (a) in the case of a general pharmaceutical benefit—the number specified in the First or Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the benefit; and
- (b) in the case of a pensioner pharmaceutical benefit—the number specified in the Fourth Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the benefit.

12. This determination shall come into operation on the first day of August, 1959.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. Advice of the examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. Appointment Subject to Conditions.—A successful candidate from outside the Service must, upon appointment, produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. She should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to her health and physical fitness for appointment. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Commonwealth Superannuation Act.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates who, at the date of application, were not British subjects must, on request, produce evidence of their British naturalization in the form of a certificate or in such other form as the Board may determine.

Refusal by the Board to Appoint Successful Candidates.—The Board may, upon sufficient evidence of an adverse nature respecting the conduct, character or ability of a successful candidate or upon sufficient evidence that a successful candidate has knowingly made a false statement in respect of her application to sit for an examination for appointment, direct that that successful candidate shall not receive appointment.

Results of Examinations.—The results of this examination, showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment or transfer to the class, will be published in the Commonwealth Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers.—A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of this examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney, of the sum of seven shillings and six pence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon her examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of her paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which she asked for a report.

Refusal of Appointment.—If a successful candidate declines to accept an appointment, or fails to reply within seven days to a communication from the Board or the Public Service Inspector respecting nomination to the Public Service, her name may be removed from the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment".

Order of Promotion or Transfer as Accounting Machinist (Female), Grade 1.—In pursuance of the Board's determination under section 53 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, trainees who

complete the prescribed course of training and pass the proficiency test will be eligible for promotion or transfer to an office of Accounting Machinist (Female), Grade 1.

In pursuance of section 53A of the Public Service Act 1922-1958 the Public Service Board hereby determines that candidates who pass the end-of-course proficiency test specified in the previous paragraph shall be eligible for promotion or transfer to an office of Accounting Machinist (Female), Grade 1, in accordance with their order of merit at that test.

In addition to the foregoing rates an officer shall be paid an allowance at the rate of £60 per annum upon passing the test determined by the Board for this purpose.

"Service" means service in any of the positions of Accounting Machinist (Female), Grade 1, Typist (Female) or Typist (Female), Grade 1, and proved accounting machining and/or typing experience prior to placement in a position of Accounting Machinist (Female), Grade 1.

An officer may be promoted to more important positions of Accounting Machinist carrying higher rates of salary.

Contract of Employment.—Each trainee will be required to undertake to complete the approved course of training (including examinations) unless permitted by the Public Service Board to relinquish it, and to remain in the employment of the Commonwealth for a period of at least three years thereafter. When any breach of the agreement is established, the Board will decide the amount of the liability up to a maximum of £50.
