PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM. Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown W Lands Ordinance 1931-1959 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided that, subject to that Ordinance, the Governor-General may at any time by Proclamation revoke, wholly or in part, any reservation or dedication of lands made in pursuance of any law in force in the Northern Territory at any time prior to the commencement of that Ordinance:

And whereas the Acting Administrator of the Northern Territory, by Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty under the Aboriginal Ordinance 1918, reserved the land described in the said Proclamation for the purposes of a Reserve for Aboriginals:

And whereas it is desirable that the reservation of parts of the said land be revoked:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the reservation of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

Firstly all that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia being part of a Reserve for Aboriginals: commencing at the intersection of the parallel of latitude 26 degrees south with the meridian of longitude 129 degrees east, thence north to the parallel of latitude 24 degrees 10 minutes south, thence south-easterly to the meridian of longitude 130 degrees 40 minutes east, thence south to the parallel of latitude 25 degrees 25 minutes south, thence east to the meridian of longitude 131 degrees 22 minutes 14 seconds east, thence south to the parallel of latitude 26 degrees south, thence west to the point of commencement.

Secondly all that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia being part of a Reserve for Aboriginals: commencing at the intersection of the parallel of latitude 23 degrees

52 minutes 43.17 seconds south with the meridian of longitude 130 degrees 45 minutes east thence east to the meridian of longitude 131 degrees 22 minutes 14 seconds east, thence south to the parallel of latitude 24 degrees 50 minutes south, thence west to the meridian of longitude 130 degrees 45 minutes east, thence north to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this fourteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers .-- A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment a successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Observer-in-Training Course.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from persons not less than 21 years of age and preferable and preferab A of age and preferably not over 36 years of age to undergo training in the position of Observer (£858-£1,038), Fourth Division, Bureau of Meteorology, Department of the Interior. The training course is scheduled to commence in February, 1960.

The duties of Observer include the preparation of meteorological surface and aerological observations, meteorological reports for aircraft, coding of same and of meteorological messages, plotting of meteorological synoptic charts, maintenance of meteorological equipment, performance of radiosonde and radar observations and general duties in a meteorological office as required.
