And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of traveling stock the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of travelling stock and declare that the lands so reserved shall be known as, firstly, Reserve Number 1031, secondly, Reserve Number 1032, and thirdly, Reserve Number 1033.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Force, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands

or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or uses:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulation prescribed the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry, survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, Sir Wiiliam Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manœuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

TOWN LANDS AVAILABLE FOR LEASING—TOWNS OF DARWIN AND NIGHTCLIFF.

To is hereby notified, in accordance with the provisions of the Darwin Town Area Leases Ordinance 1947-1955, that the town lands described in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 hereunder are available for leasing.

The leases will be for a period of ninety-nine years and will be subject to the general provisions of the said Ordinance and to the conditions set out in Schedule No. 7 hereunder.

The annual rentals for the period from the commencement of the leases to the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seventy, shall be at the rates set out in the fourth column of Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

The leases will be offered at public auction at the Town Hall, Mitchell-street, Darwin, at 2 p.m., on Saturday, 21st November, 1959.

The lease of each lot will be offered at the upset price, and if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser of the lease at that price; but if any advance be made the highest bidder shall be the purchaser of the lease at the price bid.

The upset price on each lease offered, except the lease of Lot No. 1766 Town of Darwin, shall be the reserve value as set out in the third column of Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

The upset price on the lease of Lot No. 1766 Town of Darwin, shall be the value of the building thereon.

The building on Lot No. 1766 Town of Darwin is timber framed with corrugated galvanized iron roof and walls having casement windows. One half of the floor is of concrete with the remainder of wood on two feet six inches reinforced ant-capped concrete piers. A 12 feet lean-to verandah is erected on one wall with a corrugated iron lean-to on another side. The

building measures 40 feet by 40 feet overall, is not lined or ceiled and is in fair order generally. The value of the building is £1,300.

The successful bidder for the lease of Lot No. 1766 Town of Darwin shall pay the purchase price of the building on the land to the Collector of Public Moneys, Lands and Survey Branch, Darwin, within seven days of sale or may elect within that time to purchase the said building on terms with a minimum deposit of £250 and the balance of £1,050 payable by six equal annual instalments with interest at the rate of £4 15s. per centum per annum. If the successful bidder elects to purchase the said building on terms he will be required to execute a mortgage in favour of the Commonwealth of Australia to secure the unpaid balance of the purchase price; and to pay the said minimum deposit of £250 within seven days of the sale.

The successful bidder for each lease shall, at the time of auction, pay to the Administrator the amounts mentioned here-under:—

- (1) a fee of £1 10s. for the preparation and registration of the lease;
- (2) a survey fee of £4 10s.
- (3) the first year's rent; and
- (4) the sum representing the difference (if any) between the upset price and the amount bid at auction.

The lease of any block not bid for at auction shall remain open to application and may be allotted by the Administrator subject to the same conditions as herein contained and at such annual rent, being not less than the amount set out in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 as the Administrator determines.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDY OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMONWEALTH OFFICERS.

THE Board notifies the following scholarship opportunities available to permanent officers in 1960:-

A. UNIVERSITY FREE PLACES.

Free Places will be awarded to assist officers to undertake university study at undergraduate level.

I. Part-time free places provide for part-time study in courses leading to a University degree or diploma in specified courses at the universities of-

Adelaide. Canberra University College, Melbourne, New England, New South Wales, Oueensland, Sydney, Tasmania Western Australia.

II. Full-time free places provide for full-time study to plete the final year in any degree course or to obtain a degree with honours. A limited number of full-time free places will be awarded to outstanding applicants.

Eligibility.-To be eligible an officer must-

- (a) have completed at least three months' service;
- (b) be classified in the Third Division, or be qualified for transfer to that Division;
- (c) be qualified for admission to the university in the course which he desires to study.

Holders of Commonwealth Scholarships are eligible for fulltime free places only. Cadets are not eligible for free places.

Officers who have already commenced a course may apply for a free place to complete the course.

Officers applying for full-time free places in 1960 must be able to complete the course during the academic year.

Where remoteness from a university prevents an officer attending lectures, he may be awarded a free place to study externally at the nearest convenient university. An applicant wishing to study on an external basis must first obtain approval for his course from the University and must present this approval to the Selection Committee.

-Awards will be made by the Public Service Board after considering the recommendations of Selection Committees in each State.

Benefits.—A free place covers fees for lectures, practical work and examinations. An officer awarded a part-time free place will, subject to departmental convenience, be permitted to attend lectures, practical work and examinations in the subjects of his course up to five hours per week without loss of pay. An officer awarded a full-time free place will receive full pay during his period of study and will be granted leave from his official

Conditions.—A full-time free place holder will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth to remain in the Service for a period of three years after completion of his studies.

Officers will be required to pay the fees for any supplementary or deferred examinations or for any subjects being repeated.

Applications.—Application forms are available from Public Service Inspectors in each State or from the Secretary, Public Service Board, Canberra. Application forms should be lodged with the Public Service Inspector in the State in which the officer is employed or, if the officer is employed in Canberra, with the Secretary, Public Service Board, Canberra, on or before 30th November, 1959.

B. ASSISTANCE WITH STUDIES (OTHER THAN FREE PLACES).

- I. Time-off Concessions.—Leave with pay up to five hours a week to attend lectures and practical work essential to the completion of their courses may be granted, subject to departmental convenience, to—
 - (a) holders of Commonwealth Scholarships;
 - (b) permanent Third Division officers in the Clerical and Administrative group who have successfully completed the first year subjects of an appropriate degree or diploma course currently being pursued at a University;
 - (c) Permanent Third Division officers studying a course in accountancy, who have completed the first stage of their course:
 - (d) permanent officers in the Technical and Professional groups who have completed the first stage of a University or Technical College course appropriate to their broad line of advancement.

Permanent officers are also entitled to apply for up to five days' leave per annum to enable them to contest examinations.

Applications for leave, giving details of the course being studied, subjects already completed, the proposed course for 1960 and a timetable of essential lectures, should be forwarded to the Chief Officer before the beginning of the 1960 academic year.

II. Financial Assistance—

- (1) Short Courses.—(a) Where an officer undertakes a short course of a special nature at the request of the Department for departmental purposes, the full cost of the course may be met by the Department provided the cost does not exceed £20 for any one person and the time off involved does not exceed five hours per week.
- (b) Where an officer undertakes a short course of study in his own time which the Department considers would substantially increase his efficiency in the performance of his existing duties. consideration will be given by the Board to a refund of half of the fees, provided the cost of the course does not exceed £20. Cases which fall outside this limit may be represented as special cases to the Board.

Accountancy, personnel management, and ordinary degree and diploma courses are not included in the provisions. However, they may be applied to short courses in management which are of direct benefit to a department and in circumstances in which the department sponsors officers to attend the courses. A course should not normally exceed six months.

(2) Study Projects.—The Board will consider the granting of financial assistance to officers proceeding on leave without pay to undertake post-graduate work, where the emoluments otherwise available are inadequate. In determining any grant of financial assistance, the Board will have regard to the value of the proposed study to the Public Service, and the availability of funds. For this type of assistance application forms for Post-graduate Scholarships should be used. The project to be undertaken and the emoluments received from other grants should be set out in detail. Applications should be forwarded through the officer's department to the Secretary, Public Service Board, where possible, before 15th December, 1959.

C. POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS.

Public Service Board Scholarships provide opportunities for officers to undertake post-graduate studies in Australia or overseas for periods up to two years. The study may consist of formal courses at universities or other institutions or for observation, discussions and general experience.

Eligibility.—Applicants should normally hold a University degree and be capable of successfully undertaking a definite course of post-graduate study or research with the aim of improving their efficiency as officers of the Service. Selection will be conditional upon the officer obtaining entry to the course he proposes to undertake.

Fares for Overseas Travel.—A scholar is provided with first class air travel to and from his place of study. Sea travel may be permitted provided the scholar meets costs in excess of first class air fare. Salary will not be paid during the period of the sea voyage which is in excess of the time taken to travel by air, but the scholar may apply for recreation or other leave to cover this period. Where the scholar is married and his period of study is less than two years free travel is not provided for his wife or children. However, he may elect to travel tourist class—(a) by air and use the difference between first class air fare and tourist air fare towards the cost of fares for his wife and children, or, (b) by sea and apply the saving thereby effected between the sea fare and first class air fare towards the cost of fares for his wife and children up to a maximum of the amount permitted under (a).

Where the period of study is not less than two years return fares for the scholar's wife and children are provided.

Benefits.—Scholars will be paid their normal salaries (not acting rate) during the period of the scholarship. Travelling and living allowances according to the special circumstances in each particular case will be provided for scholars while abroad.

These special travelling and living allowances which apply to scholars are not based on the allowances normally provided for officers on duty at overseas posts.

Conditions.—Scholars will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth to remain in the Service for up to five years depending upon the duration of the scholarship. The bonded term of service commences on resumption of duty.

Applications.—Application forms are obtainable from Public Service Inspectors in each State or from the Secretary, Public Service Board, Canberra. Application forms should be lodged with the Public Service Inspector in the State in which the officer is employed, or, if the officer is employed in Canberra, with the Secretary, Public Service Board, Canberra, on or before 30th November, 1959.

D. RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS AT THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY.

Applications are invited from permanent officers of the Commonwealth Service for nomination for three Research Fellowships in 1960. The Fellowships will entitle Fellows to spend one year in a Research Department of the Australian National University.

Eligibility.—Fellowships will be available to senior officers of substantial experience who would benefit from a period of reading and supervised writing on a research topic. The primary purpose of the Fellowships is not to enable officers to obtain a higher degree, but to provide them with the opportunity to make a worth while contribution to a particular field of research. The field of research, chosen by the Fellow in conjunction with his Department and the University, must be of interest and benefit to both the University and the Commonwealth Service.

Selection.—Applicants for Fellowships must first obtain sponsorship of their nominations from their Departments. By sponsoring an officer. Departments indicate their willingness to release him for the period of the Fellowship, and pay him full salary during that period. Departments will then submit their nominations to a selection committee, comprising representatives of the University, Treasury and the Board. Not more than one officer in any Department will receive a Fellowship in any year unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Benefits.—Fellows will receive full salary for the period of the Fellowship. The University will pay cost of the Fellow's travel to Canberra, and will provide accommodation at normal charges for Fellows not resident in Canberra. Single Fellows will live at University House, and married Fellows with families will be provided with furnished houses or apartments. Where sickness or other reasonable causes prevent an officer bringing his family to Canberra, consideration will be given to payment of an allowance similar to that payable under Regulation 97. Fellows engaged in research are entitled to attend seminar groups and discussions within the University in their general fields of interest. Successful officers will take up the Fellowship at the beginning of the academic year in March, 1960.

Conditions.—A Fellow will be expected to produce a written paper on his year's work at the University. He will be required to enter into a bond to remain in the Commonwealth Service for a period of three years after completion of the Fellowship.

The Public Service Board hereby notifies under section 34 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, that the following general conditions shall apply to the examinations for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth notified hereunder.

How to Make Application.—Applications must be made on printed forms which are obtainable from, and should be lodged with, the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector-

Canberra—Barton Offices.

Applications for some examinations are received by Directors, Posts and Telegraphs, and Postmasters, from whom forms are obtainable. See under individual examinations.

Applications received after the date applications close will be rejected unless the applicant has advised the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector by letter or telegram which reaches him not later than that date that an application has been forwarded before or on that date.

Applications will not be formally acknowledged. examination arrangements issued to candidates will serve this purpose. pose. If a candidate has not received this advice at latest five days before the date of the examination he should immediately notify the person to whom he sent his application.

Applicants must be permanently residing in Australia or eligible for entry to Australia for permanent residence.

Non-attendance at Examination.—Candidates who for any reason are prevented from attending the examination must advise this at the earliest possible date before the examination.

Change of Address.—Any change of address must be notified immediately.

Subjects of Examination.—Unless otherwise specified in the notification of a particular examination, the subjects and syllabuses of examination will be-

(a) Spelling.—To be judged from the candidate's transcription of misspelled and/or incomplete but readily recognizable words and/or from dictation. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 108.)

(b) Arithmetic.—First four "rules"—that is Addition, traction, Multiplication, Division, including (a) British standard weights, measures, and moneys, (b) Prime numbers, Factors, Highest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, (c) Vulgar and Decimal Fractions (excluding recurring and circulating decimals), (d) Simple Proportion (Unitary Method) and Proportionate Division, (e) Simple Problems on Rates, Taxes and Bankruptcy. These topics are adequately treated in any elementary text book used in Australian secondary schools. (Maximum marks 180, pass marks 105.)

To pass the examination, a candidate must pass in each of the subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic.

If two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit respectively will be determined by marks obtained in (a) Spelling, and where those marks also are equal, (b) by lot, with the exception that, if two or more successful candidates obtain identical marks in Spelling and Arithmetic and one of those candidates dates is employed in a temporary or exempt capacity in the position to which permanent appointment is sought at the examination centre, preference will be given to such a person. Should there be two or more candidates with identical marks who are so employed, preference will be given to the person with the longest period of current employment.

Text-books.—No text-books are prescribed, but papers set at a previous examination will be supplied free on request by the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector.

Exclusion of Candidates from Examinations.—The Board may determine that a person shall not be allowed to sit for an examination if it is satisfied, after consideration of the available evidence, that a person is not a fit and proper person for appointment to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Results of Examinations.—The results of examinations showing the order in which successful candidates are eligible for appointment shall be published in the Gazette.

Marks.—The marks allotted by the examiners for each subject or part of a subject shall be final.

Reports on Examination Papers .- A candidate may at any time within three months of the date of publication in the Gazette of the results of an examination, upon payment to the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector with whom he lodged his application of the sum of seven shillings and sixpence for each subject upon which a report is desired, obtain reports upon his examination papers showing the detailed allotment of marks in respect of each subject and a statement as to the merits and defects of his paper in respect of the subject(s) upon which he asked for a report.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment successful candidate must produce evidence of date of birth and undergo a medical examination as required by the Board. Successful candidates should not undergo the medical examination until instructed to do so. The Board will be required to be satisfied from the report of the examination as to the candidate's health and physical fitness for appointment to the particular office. Upon the confirmation of appointment, an officer will also be required to become a contributor under the Superannuation Act 1922-1956.

Qualified candidates who on appointment are already temporarily employed, or who take up duty within twenty-eight days of the date of issue by the Chief Officer of notification of appointment and request to report for duty, will be regarded for seniority purposes as having entered the Commonwealth Service on the date of the Public Service Inspector's appointment certificate.

Successful candidates should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act and who have failed to register.

Successful candidates who, at the date of application, were not British subjects, must, on request, produce evidence of their British naturalization in the form of a certificate or in such other form as the Board may determine.

Refusal by the Board to Appoint Successful Candidates .-Board may, upon sufficient evidence of an adverse nature respecting the conduct, character or ability of a successful candidate or upon sufficient evidence that a successful candidate has knowingly made a false statement in respect of his application to sit for an examination for appointment, direct that that successful candidate shall not receive appointment.

Persons Eligible to Apply.—Permanent officers and temporary employees between 17 and 40 years of age designated Hospital Assistant, Grade 1. Applications should be addressed to the Deputy Commissioner, Repatriation Department in the Capital City of the State in which the training course is to be held.

Publication of Selections.-The names of persons selected by the Department to commence training will be notified in the Gazette in two groups; one showing officers of the Service and the other temporary employees. Eligible officers have the right to appeal, within 21 days of the publication of selections in the Gazette, to the Public Service Inspector in the State in which the training course is to be held against non-selection for training.

The Training Course will not commence until the results of all appeals are determined by the Board.

Training Course.—The course of training is of twelve months duration and has been designed to provide approximately 75 per cent. on-the-job training and 25 per cent. lectures and practical administration.

End-of-Course Examination.—An examination will be held at the conclusion of the training period.
