Defence Act 1903-1953.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manœuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE.

Curries River—Tasmania.

During the period commencing on the seventh day of November 1959 and ending on the fifteenth day of April 1960.

All those pieces and parcels of land enclosed within the following boundary:

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Bankruptcy Act 1924-1958.

- (d) Norfolk Island, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
- (e) the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane;
- (f) the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Perth;
- (g) a place outside the Commonwealth (and not being a place specified above), with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate Commonwealth Public Service Inspector within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal.

The grounds of appeal are:—

- (i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority;
- (ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient where promotion is made to one of these positions: Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female) Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Labourer, Grade 2; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer; Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Phonogram Monitor (Female); Postal Assistant; Postal Assistant (Mail); Postal Clerk in the Fourth Division; Postal Officer; Preventive Officer, Grade 1; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Senior Postal Clerk, Grade 1; Storeman; Storeman, Grade 1; Storeman, Grade 2; Telegraphist in the Fourth Division.

EXAMINATIONS.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING RECRUITMENT, TRAINING AND PROMOTION OF CADETS (NAVAL ARMAMENT SUPPLY), DEPARTMENT OF THE NAVY.

THE Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies the following conditions which will govern the recruitment, training and promotion of Cadets (Naval Armament Supply). Conditions notified for this cadetship in Gazette No. 18 of 12th March, 1959, are hereby superseded.

1. **Appointment.**—Eligibility for appointment to a position of Cadet (Naval Armament Supply) is open to—

- (a) candidates who have passed the examination for appointment to the Third Division of the Commonwealth Public Service as Clerk or Cadet, based on the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation and Schools Board examinations in the various States, with passes in the subjects of English, Mathematics and either Physics or Chemistry, and who are qualified for matriculation in Commerce, Economics or Arts (Economics) at an Australian University; or
- (b) undergraduates who have completed one or more years in a degree course in Commerce, Economics or Arts (Economics) at an Australian University.

Appointees should note that the National Service Act 1951-1957 precludes the employment for more than seven days of persons liable to register under the Act who have failed to register.

2. **Promotion or Transfer.**—Eligibility for promotion or transfer as Cadet (Naval Armament Supply) will be acquired by officers who have—

- (a) passed an examination held under the Commonwealth Public Service Act, 1922-1958, for appointment, promotion or transfer to the Third Division as Clerk or Cadet; or
- (b) passed the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation or Schools Board Certificate examination of an Australian State or an examination which qualifies for matriculation in an Australian University; or
- (c) completed one or more years in a degree course in Commerce, Economics or Arts (Economics) at an Australian University;

provided that in either case of (a) and (b), the officer has passed in the subjects of English, Mathematics and either Physics or Chemistry and has qualified for matriculation in Commerce, Economics or Arts (Economics) at an Australian University.

3. **Period of Eligibility.**—Eligibility for appointment, promotion or transfer will terminate on the candidate attaining the age of 24 years, except where eligibility derives from paragraph 1 (a), when it is limited to the period of eligibility for appointment from the examination. The eligibility of an ex-serviceman will terminate on his attaining the age of 31 years.

4. **Salary.**—The salary range for a Cadet (Naval Armament Supply) will be £385-£903 (s.). On attaining the age of 21 years, he will be paid a minimum salary of £858 (s.) per annum, if a graduate, and £723 (s.) per annum if an undergraduate. Junior officers who are graduates shall be paid the appropriate rate specified in Public Service Board Memorandum 1958/9.

5. **Promotion under Section 53B.**—A Cadet (Naval Armament Supply) will be promoted as Sub-Assistant Armament Supply Officer (£903-£1,353 (s.)) upon—

- (a) satisfactory completion of a period of four years' training as Cadet; and
- (b) passing such examinations for advancement as are determined by the Public Service Board;

provided that the period of training in (a) may be reduced where the officer appointed, promoted or transferred as Cadet has already completed one or more years of the prescribed course.

Promotion is made under the provisions of Section 53B of the Public Service Act, 1922-1958, and is not subject to appeal.

6. **Course of Training.**—Cadets will be required to undertake a full-time University course leading to a degree in Commerce, Economics or Arts (Economics), including studies in Economics, Industrial Relations or such other subjects as may be determined. During University vacations and the final year of the cadetship, cadets will undertake full-time departmental training and prescribed examinations in armament supply duties.

7. **Failure at Examinations.**—Where a Cadet fails to obtain satisfactory results at the annual or prescribed departmental examinations, the Permanent Head of the Department will report to the Public Service Board as to the general efficiency and aptitude of the officer, and his fitness to continue the cadetship. Upon receipt of such report, the Board will decide whether the cadetship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate (in accordance with the provisions of Section 67 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958) or whether the cadetship will be continued under modified conditions.

8. **Fees.**—Refund of fees in accordance with the following scale will be allowed to Cadets in respect of subjects studied as part of their approved course of training—

When two or more of the above rates of salary are received by the Cadet in a calendar year, the percentage of fees to be refunded will be that shown in relation to the rate of salary received for the greater portion of the year.

9. **Post-Cadetship Training.**—Cadets who have been promoted as Sub-Assistant Armament Supply Officers on successful completion of their cadetship will be required to undertake a further period of twelve months training in armament supply duties in the United Kingdom.

10. **Contract of Service.**—Each Cadet will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth, and to be guaranteed by an approved surety for £1,000 that he will pursue to completion the approved course of training, including examinations, unless permitted by the Public Service Board to relinquish it and continue in the employment of the Commonwealth for a period of at least five years after completing the cadetship. The amount of liability and the period of service to be fulfilled may be reduced if two or more years of the course have been completed prior to the commencement of the cadetship.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE ADVANCEMENT OF AERONAUTICAL INSPECTORS, GRADE 1 (£1,263-£1,533), DEPARTMENT OF AIR, BEYOND THE SALARY OF £1,353 PER ANNUM.

THE Public Service Board hereby notifies the following conditions in pursuance of section 32 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958.

Examinations as above will be held as required.

2. **Persons Eligible to Enter.**—Officers and temporary employees who are in receipt of, or within twelve months at the date of examination of receiving, £1,353 per annum, and who are employed as Aeronautical Inspector, Grade 1.

(Notes.—(1) Success at an examination under these conditions will not entitle temporary Aeronautical Inspectors, Grade 1, to permanent appointment. (2) An officer, who on 10th December,

1954, permanently occupied an office of Assistant Inspector, Grade 1 (£908-£956), or Assistant Inspector, Grade 2 (£764-£860), in the Aeronautical Inspection Directorate, will not be required to pass the examination to qualify for advancement in salary beyond £1,353 per annum.)

To qualify for advancement, the candidate must pass in each of the required subjects.

4. Exemption Provisions.—A candidate who passes in two of the three subjects in the group selected may claim exemption from these subjects at the following examination. Should the candidate fail to pass the remaining subject at the following scheduled examination the exemption will lapse.

5. Period of Eligibility.—Successful candidates will remain eligible to advance in salary until such time as they comply with the conditions set out in the following paragraph.

6. Advancement.—An Aeronautical Inspector, Grade 1, who qualifies for advancement beyond £1,353 per annum will, subject to the provisions of section 31 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, be advanced in salary to £1,398 from the first day of the month following the month in which the examination commences if, on that date, he has been in receipt of a salary of £1,353 per annum for at least twelve months; otherwise, advancement will be from the date of completion of twelve months' service with salary at the rate of £1,353 per annum.

Aerodynamics.

Basic principles and knowledge connected with the phenomena of aircraft and flight.

The atmosphere, its composition, properties and appropriate laws; density and pressure variation with altitude temperature lapse rates.

Lift and Drag, factors affecting these forces, aerofoil section characteristics, pressure distribution and differential, induced and parasitic drag, lift/drag ratio and its significance. Typical aerofoil sections and their merits.

Aerodynamic forces acting in flight, axes of aircraft movement, stability and control, effects of power "on" and "off" flying control surfaces, the assessment and correction of abnormal flight characteristics.

Weighting of aircraft and centre of gravity determination.

Aircraft.

The construction, overhaul and servicing of airframes, accessories and systems. Procedure and processes associated therewith.

- Flight and ground forces acting on aircraft structures. Tensile, compression, shearing, bending and torsional stresses and their combination.
- Types of airframe construction such as Triangulated Truss, Monocoque, Semi-Monocoque, Integral, Cantilever, &c., and the recognition of signs of excessive loads and incipient failures.
- Workshop processes and procedures relating to airframe construction, reconditioning and repair with particular reference to—
 - The manipulation and fabrication of aircraft materials and structures.
 - Rivets and riveting practice, welding, cable splicing and swaging, plumbing, heat-treatment, plating, anodizing, forgings, castings, extrusions, adhesives, joint sealings, protective treatments and finishes.
 - Non-destructive testing, including the application of X-ray, Electro-magnetic, Ultrasonic, Anodic Oxidation and Surface Penetration methods.
 - Drawing and lofting, template forming and jig production, inspection and maintenance.
 - Inspection planning.
- The principles and application of hydraulics, pneumatics and mechanics to systems and components associated with—Control surfaces, undercarriage shock absorption and retraction, wheel and air brakes, armament, air-conditioning, pressurization, fire prevention and control, anti-icing and oxygen supply.
- The survey of aircraft undergoing overhaul and repair, the assessment of damage or deterioration and the work required to restore serviceability.
- Elementary electricity and magnetism. Theory of alternating and direct current generation. Practical appreciation of resistance capacity and inductance and arrangements of bridge circuits, construction of batteries and basic circuit components. Circuit requirements control and voltmeter, ammeter, bridge megger high rate discharge meter and hydrometer. The reason for and the means of bonding and screening.
- The principles and operation of mechanical and electrical instruments such as Air Speed Indicator, Altimeter, Rate of Climb Indicator, Tachometer, Pressure Gauges, Fuel Content, Thermometer, Mach Meter, Automatic Pilot Equipment, Navigation Instruments, &c.
- The installation and operation of aircraft safety equipment and systems.
- Commonly used ferrous and non-ferrous aircraft specification materials including their heat-treatment, working and forming characteristics, strength value, defect susceptibility, protective treatments and special processes. Commonly used organic, synthetic and processed materials as used in the manufacture of parts, structures, equipment finishes and adhesives.
- Methods of determining and an appreciation of tensile and compression strengths, proof stress, yield point, elongation, reduction in area, impact value, hardness density and moisture content.
- Recognized British, American and Australian Aircraft Specifications and Standards Authorities. Aircraft Standard parts and their uses in structures and systems.

Note.—This Syllabus is to be regarded as a guide containing the more important facets of knowledge required by an Aircraft Inspector and is framed around those principles and practices of aircraft engineering and inspection with which candidates should be conversant. It is expected that candidates will also have taken an intelligent interest in current literature, and appreciate the characteristics, limitations and problems associated with modern aircraft and current developments.

Power Plants.

Sound theoretical knowledge and practical knowledge of aero engines, accessories and propellers as applied to construction, maintenance and servicing.

- (a) The principles and construction of "constant volume" cycle internal combustion engines, viz., two and four stroke spark and compression ignition, sleeve and poppet valve, air and watercooled, in line and radial types. The principal construction of "constant pressure" cycle engines, viz., turbo jet, centrifugal and axial compressor types.
- (b) An appreciation of gas laws, heat balance, engine torque, inertia and pressure forces, altitude and temperature effects on engine performance supercharging, heat rejection and thrust augmentation.
- (c) The interpretation of power consumption and operation charts and the use of formulae relating to Brake Horse Power, Brake Mean Effective Pressure and Static Jet Thrust and associated calculations.
- (d) Workshop practice in relation to the manufacture, overhaul and repair of gas turbine and piston type aero engines and propellers.
- (e) Workshop processes and procedures relating to aero engine and propeller construction, reconditioning and repair with particular reference to:—
 - (i) The manipulation and fabrication of ferrous and non-ferrous materials.

- (g) The principle and operation of power plant electrical accessories and instruments such as magnetos, generators, starters, ammeters, voltmeters, torch igniters and control switches.
- (h) Engine testing and test house equipment, procedure and records.
- (i) Fuel and oil systems and accessories for piston and gas turbine types and aero engines. The principles, operation, calibration, adjustment and test.
- (j) Aircraft fuels and lubricants, including such aspects as physical properties, performance characteristics, anti-knock value and method of testing, additives and their uses.

- (k) Commonly used ferrous and non-ferrous aircraft specification materials including their heat treatment, working and forming characteristics, defect susceptibility, protective treatment and special processes.
- (l) Methods of determining and an appreciation of tensile and compression strengths, proof stress, yield point, elongation, reduction in area, hardness and impact value.

Aircraft Equipment.

Sound knowledge of the construction and principles of the operation of the various types of aircraft equipment of an aeronautical and non-aeronautical nature, employing electrics, electronics and instrumentation techniques and the respective systems involved.

- (a) Electrical installations in modern aircraft involving D.C. and A.C. primary and secondary power sources, methods of regulation, control and distribution, screening, bonding and suppression of interference to radio reception; the operation of ignition systems and auxiliary electrical equipment, and the relevant testing procedures involved.
- (b) Fixed ground and mobile A.C. and D.C. power installations, control and distribution systems; an appreciation of the regulations issued by electric supply and other recognized authorities.
- (c) Construction and operation of current types of electronic equipment of an aeronautical nature for communication, navigation, armament, and other special services and the relevant testing procedure involved.
- (d) Electronic installations in aircraft; procedures adopted for the suppression of various types of interference to radio reception internal and external of aircraft. Factors governing the layout of installations as affecting transmission and reception of electro-magnetic energy, and the proximity of other equipment.
- (e) Construction and operation of various types of instruments employed in the instrumentation of current aircraft, for metering, control, navigation and other special purposes, and the relevant test procedures involved.
- (f) Instrument installations in current aircraft; the importance of layout, and the protection of magnetically operated instruments for stray fields. The procedure for the swinging of magnetic and electronic type compasses and the importance of corrections in relation to other navigation devices.
- (g) Construction and operation of telemetry equipment and the application to metering from sources remotely connected by wire or radio link.
- (h) The techniques and standard practices involved in the manufacture and overhaul of aircraft equipment generally. An appreciation of the practices applicable to the manipulation and fabrication of various materials and the respective test procedures involved.
- (i) Approved procedures relating to the type approval of aircraft equipment and components, and the relation to aeronautical procedures generally.

Metallurgy—Metrology.

Structures and Properties of ferrous and non-ferrous metals and alloys. Chemical analysis, mechanical testing and metallographic examination. Radiological examination and non-destructive testing. Engineering precision instruments and gauges, setting and re-calibration. Screw thread measurements and the testing and re-setting of gauges.

- Mechanical properties of metals and alloys. Effects of deformation and heat-treatment on the structure and properties of alloys. The casting, forging, rolling, joining, deep drawing, extrusion and surface treatment of metals and alloys, with special reference to modern developments for service use. Pyrometry.

THE Public Service Board hereby notifies the following conditions in pursuance of section 53 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958:—

An examination as above will be held as required.

2. Officers Eligible to Enter.—Officers who, at the date of examination,

- are at least nineteen (19) years of age, or
- have had at least three (3) years' satisfactory service as Telephonist (permanent or exempt).

3. Subjects and Pass Conditions.—**(i) Written Section—**

(ii) Practical Test

To pass in the Written Section, a candidate must pass in Part A and Part B.

A candidate who fails at the Written Section will not be eligible to undergo the Practical Test.

4. Exemption Provisions.—An officer who passed a previous examination for Monitor but has not received promotion or transfer may claim complete exemption from this examination provided the Superintendent, Telephone Service Branch, certifies that the officer has, in the full-time performance of appropriate duties in the Telephone Service Branch within the three years immediately preceding the date of examination, given satisfactory evidence of retention of the requisite qualifications.

An officer who passed in both parts of the written section of a previous examination for Monitor may claim exemption from the written section of an examination under these conditions provided that the Superintendent, Telephone Service Branch, certifies that the officer has, in the performance of appropriate duties in the Telephone Service Branch within the three years immediately preceding the date of examination, given satisfactory evidence of retention of the requisite qualifications.

An officer may claim exemption in the Practical Section of this examination provided the Superintendent, Telephone Service Branch, certifies that he or she is proficient in all duties of the position of Monitor. A proficiency certificate will be issued to an officer provided one of the following conditions has been fulfilled:—

- The officer has acted as Monitor for a period of at least twelve months within the three years immediately preceding the date of examination and the Superintendent, Telephone Service Branch, has certified that his or her conduct, diligence and efficiency are such as to warrant incremental advancement of the higher duties allowance, provided that in cases where an officer has ceased to act as Monitor, the Superintendent, Telephone Service Branch, is satisfied that he or she has retained the necessary qualifications; or
