Defence Act 1903-1953. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, the Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me under Regulation 17 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, do hereby-

 - (3) in the case of parts for goods subject to specific rates of duty and ad valorem rates of duty-that proportion and the ad valorem rate
- 4. (1) Parts, comprising complete or substantially complete goods, imported in one ship or aircraft in an unassembled or partly assembled condition shall, unless the Tariff otherwise provides or the Minister otherwise directs, be dealt with under the Tariff Item or Tariff Items applicable to the complete assembled goods.
- (2) Parts, which in the aggregate comprise complete or substantially complete goods, imported in more than one ship or aircraft may, unless the Tariff otherwise provides or the Minister otherwise directs, be dealt with under the Tariff Item or Tariff Items which would be applicable to the goods had they been imported in one ship or aircraft, provided the Collector is satisfied that-
 - (1) an order for the complete goods was placed overseas; and
 - (2) the complete goods are, in fact, imported; and

provided further that all the parts are dealt with under the Tariff Item or Tariff Items applicable to such goods if they were to be imported in one ship or aircraft in a complete assembled condition.

WHEREAS by section 86 of the Defence Act it is provided that the Governor-General may exercise certain powers in relation to courts-martial:

And whereas by section 87 of the said Act, it is provided that the Governor-General may delegate and revoke any of such

And whereas by an Order-in-Council dated the eighth day of December one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five the officer, not below the rank of Colonel, holding the appointment or performing the duties of Commander, Australian Army Force, Far East Land Forces, was duly delegated—

- (a) the power to convene courts-martial;
- (b) the power to appoint officers to constitute courts-martial;
- (c) the power to confirm the finding or finding and sentence (other than, in the case of an officer, a sentence of death, imprisonment, cashiering or dismissal from Her Majesty's service, or in the case of a soldier, a sentence of death, imprisonment exceeding a term of two years, dismissal, discharge with ignominy or discharge) of any court-martial, or to send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision;
- (d) the power to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or to commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the court-martial; and
- (e) the power to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit.

And whereas it is now desired to revoke the delegation so made and to make a new delegation as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Act 1903-1953 aforesaid and all other powers me thereunto enabling, and acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby revoke the delegation made by the said Order-in-Council dated the eighth day of December one thousand nine hundred and fifty five and do hereby delegate to every office of the Military Forces, not below the rank of Colony who shell of the Military Forces, not below the rank of Colonel who shall at any time during the continuance of this delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of Commander, Australian Army Force, Far East Land Forces the powers—

- (a) to convene courts-martial;
- (b) to appoint officers to constitute courts-martial;
- (c) to confirm the finding, or finding and sentence, of any court-martial (other than, in the case of an officer, a sentence of death, or imprisonment, or to be cashiered or dismissed from Her Majesty's service or from the Defence Force, or in the case of a soldier, a sentence of death or imprisonment exceeding a term of two years), or to send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision;
- (d) to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or to commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the courtmartial; and
- (e) to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit.

THE Commonwealth Public Service Board notifies conditions governing the recruitment training governing the recruitment, training and promotion of Commonwealth Cadets for the various cadetships specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereunder. All previous notifications of cadetship conditions are hereby superseded.

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. Appointment.—Subject to the provisos specified after subparagraph (k) of this paragraph, eligibility for appointment to a position of Cadet is open to-
 - (a) candidates who have passed the examination for appointment to the Third Division of the Commonwealth Public Service as Clerk or Cadet, based on the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation and Schools Board examinations in the various States, with passes in the subjects specified in column 2 of the Schedule; except that, in South Australia, Leaving Honours candidates only will be con-

sidered for cadetships involving tertiary studies; or (b) undergraduates who have completed one or more years of a degree course at an Australian University in the faculty specified in column 2 of the Schedule; or

(c) Technical College students who have completed, except where otherwise specified, one or more years or stages of an appropriate diploma course at a recognized Technical College in the field of study specified in column 2 of the Schedule; or

(d) Technical College students who have completed the diploma course in Engineering at a recognized Technical College, and are qualified for matriculation in Engineering at an Australian University; or

(e) graduates or undergraduates of an Australian University who, preferably, have undertaken or are undertaking

Arts courses; or
(f) graduates of an Australian University who have completed a Bachelor of Science degree, with a major in Geology, and necessary supporting subjects; or

(g) graduates of an Australian University who have completed a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Geo-physics, Physics, Geology or Mathematics, or a Bachelor of Engineering degree with a major in Electronics, Electrical, Radio or Mining Engineering. In either case, the degree course must include Physics and Mathematics to second year standard and, in certain circumstances, Geology to first year standard, as well as the necessary supporting subjects; or

(h) undergraduates who have completed three or more years of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine/ Bachelor of Surgery at an Australian University; of (i) candidates who have passed a State Junior, Intermediate or

Schools Board examination and gained a Diploma in Agriculture from a recognized Agricultural College; or

(j) apprentices in Engineering in a government munitions factory who have served not less than two years of such apprenticeship and are qualified for matriculation

in Engineering at an Australian University; or
(k) candidates who are eligible to undertake the final year of
an honours degree course in the fields of Statistics, Mathematics or Economcis at an Australian University;

provided that the conditions applicable to a particular cadetship shall be as specified in column 2 of the Schedule and that appointees shall have satisfied the essential pre-requisites, including matriculation or entry requirements to a University or Technical College, as specified in column 3 of the Schedule, for the particular courses of study specified in column 4 of the Schedule.

- 2. Promotion or Transfer.—The minimum conditions of eligibility for promotion or transfer as Cadet will be satisfied by officers who have
 - ssed an examination held under the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1958 for appointment, pro-motion or transfer to the Third Division as Clerk or (a) passed Cadet; or

(b) passed the Leaving, Senior, Matriculation or Schools Board Certificate examination of an Australian State, or an which qualifies for matriculation in an examination Australian University;

provided that such officers shall have satisfied the minimum requirements prescribed in paragraph 1 above for appointment to a particular cadetship; and provided further that the conditions applicable to a particular cadetship shall be as specified in column 2 of the Schedule.

Promotees or transferees must have satisfied the essential prerequisites including matriculation or entry requirements to a University or Technical College, as specified in column 3 of the Schedule, for the particular courses of study specified in column 4 of the Schedule.

- 3. Period of Eligibility.—Eligibility for appointment, promotion or transfer will terminate on the candidate attaining the age of 24 years, except where eligibility derives from paragraph 1(a), when it is limited to the period of eligibility for appointment from the The eligibility of an ex-serviceman will terminate on his attaining the age of 31 years.
- 4. Salary.—The salary range for all cadetships shall be £385-£903 (S.). On attaining the age of 21 years, a cadet will be paid a minimum salary of £723 (S.) per annum; provided that
 - (a) upon completion of a period of three years training, if an adult, he shall be paid not less than £813 (S.) per annum, subject to evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that the diligence, conduct and progress of the officer during the period of training have been satisfactory and warrant such payment;
 - (b) Cadets Architect, Biochemist, Chemist, Defence Science, Engineer, Examiner of Patents, Meteorologist, Quantity Surveyor, Surveyor and Veterinary Officer shall be paid not less than £858 (S.) per annum if qualified for a diploma, or have obtained such other appropriate qualifications of a Technical College or other institution specified by the Board; and not less than £903 (S.) per annum if qualified for a degree in an appropriate course at an Australian University;
 - (c) Cadets Geologist and Geophysicist, recruited at graduate
 - level, shall be paid not less than £903 (S.) per annum; (d) Cadet Education Officers, Cadets (Statistics) and Cadets (Naval Armament Supply), on attaining 21 years of age, shall be paid a minimum salary of £858 (S.) per annum, subject to having obtained graduate standard. Junior officer attaining graduate standard shall be paid the appropriate rate specified in P.S.B. Memorandum 1958/9.

(Note.-Salaries quoted above are male rates. Equivalent female rates should be substituted as appropriate.)

- 5. Promotion under Section 53B.—A Cadet designated in column of the Schedule shall be promoted to the position specified in column 6 of the Schedule upon-
 - (a) satisfactory completion of the period of training as a Cadet, as specified in column 5 of the Schedule; and
 - (b) passing such examinations for advancement as are determined by the Public Service Board;

provided that the period of training in (a) may be reduced where the officer appointed, promoted or transferred as Cadet has already completed one or more years of the prescribed course, gained such experience or qualifications as is deemed appropriate.

Promotion is made under the provisions of Section 53B of the Public Service Act 1922-1958, and is not subject to appeal.

- 6. Course of Training.—Under sub-paragraph (b) of the preceding paragraph, the Board has approved of examinations and/or training as specified in column 4 of the Schedule.
- 7. Failure at Examinations.—Where a Cadet fails to obtain satisfactory results at the annual or prescribed departmental examinations, the Permanent Head of the Department will report to the Public Service Board as to the general efficiency and aptitude of the officer, and his fitness to continue the cadetship. receipt of such report, the Board will decide whether the cadetship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate (in accordance with the provisions of Section 67 of the Public Service Act 1922-1958), or whether the cadetship will be continued under modified conditions.

- 9. Employment in Department.—Cadets will undertake full-time University or Technical College courses, where prescribed, and will work in the Department or other approved establishments during long vacations and for such additional periods as may be required fulfil the conditions specified in column 4 of the Schedule. Where full-time courses are not provided, Cadets will undertake such part-time courses as may be prescribed.
- 10. Contract of Service.-Each Cadet will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth, and to be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will pursue to completion the appropriate course of training, including examinations, specified in column 4 of the Schedule, unless permitted by the Board to relinquish it. The maximum amount of liability and maximum period of service to be fulfilled on completion of cadetship training shall be as specified in columns 7 and 8 of the Schedule, subject to the proviso that the Board may approve reduction of the specified amount or period where two or more years of the course have been completed prior to the commencement of the cadetship or where special experience and/or qualifications have been obtained.
