WHEREAS by instrument dated the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven Brigadier Donald George McKenzie, O.B.E., A.D.C., Australian Staff Corps, was appointed to be a Trustee of the Australian Military Forces Relief Trust Fund and to be Chairman of Trustees of the said Fund:

And whereas it is now desired to revoke the said appointment and to appoint Brigadier John Stafford Andersen, O.B.E., Australian Staff Corps, to be a trustee of the said Fund and to be Chairman of Trustees of the said Fund:

Now therefore, I, Field Marshal Sir William Slim, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., D.S.O., M.C., the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 5 of the Services Trust Fund Act, 1947, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, hereby revoke the appointment of the said Brigadier Donald George McKenzie, as a Trustee of the Australian Military Forces Relief Trust Fund and Chairman of Trustees of the said Fund and appoint Brigadier John Stafford Andersen, Australian Staff Corps, to be a Trustee of the said Fund and to be Chairman of Trustees of the said Fund:

Defence Act 1903-1953.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1953 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or

air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, Sir William Joseph Slim, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE.

Gordonvale, Queensland.

During the period commencing on the first day of February, 1960. and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1960.

All those parcels and pieces of land being Crown allotments lying within the Parish of GADGARRA, County of NARES, State of QUEENSLAND in the vicinity of GORDONVALE, described as follows:-

Bounded on the North by an east-west line from mouth of UHR CREEK WEST to GILLIES HIGHWAY. On the UHR CREEK WEST to GILLIES HIGHWAY.
