WHEREAS by section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1950 it is enacted, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, declare any ports in Australia to be ports where imported animals or any particular kinds of imported animals may be landed, and appoint places on land or sea to be quarantine stations for the performance of quarantine by animals:

And whereas by Quarantine Proclamation No. 42A published in the Gazette on the twenty-third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, the Governor-General declared certain ports in Australia to be ports where imported animals may be landed and appointed places to be quarantine stations for the performance of quarantine by animals:

And whereas by quarantine Proclamation No. 59A published in the Gazette on the seventeenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven, the Governor-General declared the port of Townsville in the State of Queensland to be a port where certain particular kinds of imported animals may be landed:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 42A and Quarantine Proclamation No. 59A and to make other provision in lieu thereof:

Now therefore, I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 42A and Quarantine Proclamation No. 59A;
- declare the ports set out in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be ports where imported animals may be landed;
- declare each of the ports set out in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation to be a port where only the particular kinds of animals set out in that Schedule opposite to that port may be landed; and
- appoint the places set out in the Third Schedule to be quarantine stations for the performance of quarantine by animals.

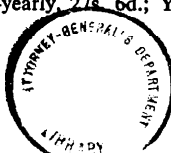

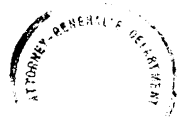
