PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Lustralia to wit. DUNROSSIL Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

THEREAS it is provided by section six of the Snowy Mountains Hydro-electric Power Act 1949-1958-

- (a) that, for the purposes of that Act, the Snowy Mountains Area shall be an area or areas of land in the south-eastern portion of the State of New South Wales and the north-eastern portion of the State of Victoria defined in accordance with that section;
- (b) that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, define the boundaries of the Snowy Mountains Area and may, from time to time, by Proclamation, vary the boundaries as so defined;
- boundaries as so defined;

 (c) a proclamation under that section does not operate to vary the boundaries of the Snowy Mountains Area so as to include land which was not included in that area on the Sixth day of November One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight unless that variation is made with the prior approval of the Governor-in-Council of the State of New South Wales and the Governor-in-Council of the State of Victoria;

And whereas

- (d) in accordance with that section the boundaries of the Snowy Mountains Area were defined on the Twenty-eighth day of April One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four;
- is desirable to vary the boundaries of the Snowy (e) it
- Mountains Area;

 (f) the variation of the said boundaries hereinafter defined includes land which was not included in the area on the said Sixth day of November One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine; and
- (g) the Governor-in-Council of the State of New South Wales and the Governor-in-Council of the State of Victoria have approved of the variation of the boundaries of the Snowy Mountains Area hereinafter defined.

Now therefore I, William Shepherd Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby vary the boundaries of the Snowy Mountains Area by adding to that area an area the boundaries of which I define as follows:-

From a point commencing at the South Western corner of Portion 2 Parish of Cooleman County of Cowley in the State of New South Wales being a point on the North Eastern boundary of the Parish of Gurrangora and the Snowy Mountains Area as proclaimed in the Commonwealth Gazette No. 30 1954 thence Northerly and Easterly by the Western and Northern boundaries of the said Portion to its North Eastern corner thence Northerly by part of the Eastern boundary of R.14800 to a point on the Southern boundary of the Parish of Bimberi thence generally Easterly by that boundary to its junction with the Parish of Fergus thence generally Southerly by part of the Western boundary of the Parish of Fergus to its junction with the Parish of Cotter thence generally Southerly by part of the Western boundary of of the Parish of Fergus to its junction with the Parish of Cotter thence generally Southerly by part of the Western boundary of the Parish of Cotter to its junction with the Parish of Yaouk thence South and West by part of that Parish boundary to its intersection with part of the Eastern boundary of the Parish of Gurrangora and the proclaimed Snowy Mountains Area aforementioned and thence generally North Westerly by that boundary to the point of commencement to the point of commencement.


