# Defence Act 1903-1956. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres, or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

# THE SCHEDULE. Broughton, Queensland.

For the period commencing on the fifth day of May, 1960 and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1960.

(a) All those parcels and pieces of land in the Parish of Rishton County of Davenport bounded in the west by a line running south-east along the boundary of Mindoon Holding from the junction Charley Ck-Broughton River to the south-western corner of Mindoon Holding, then bounded in the south by a line running from the south-western corner of Mindoon Holding to the southwestern corner of Lot MHP 9042 thence following the southern boundary to the south-eastern corner of Lot MHP 9042, then bounded in the east by the eastern boundary of Lot MHP 9042 and bounded in the north by a general line commencing from the north-eastern boundary of Lot MHP 9042 and following the Broughton River along the northern boundaries of Lot MHP 9042 and Lot MHP 8916 to the junction Charley Ck-Broughton River.

- (b) All those parcels and pieces of land in the Parish of Rishton County of Davenport bounded in the east by a line following the eastern boundary of Mossvale Holding from a point where the Mossvale eastern boundary is crossed by Cornishman's Creek to the south-eastern corner of Mindoon Holding, then bounded in the north by the southern boundary of Mindoon Holding, then bounded in the west by the western boundary of Mossvale Holding from the south-western corner of Mindoon Holding to the point where the boundary line meets the inter-parish boundary (Rishton-Leyshon), thence bounded in the south by a line running due east from this point to the eastern boundary of Mossvale Holding where it is crossed by Cornishman's Ck.
- (c) All those parcels and pieces of land in the Parish of Sellheim County of Davenport bounded in the west by the eastern boundary of Sellheim Camp, then bounded in the north and the east by a general line following the Burdekin River from the north-eastern corner of Sellheim Camp to the Railway Bridge at Macrossan (excluding the main highway) and bounded in the south by a general line following the Great Northern Railway line from Macrossan Railway Bridge to the south-eastern corner of Sellheim Camp (excluding the main highway).
- (d) All those parcels and pieces of land being Crown Allotments, private property, reserves, roads and otherwise lying within the Counties of Burdekin and Davenport State of Queensland in the vicinity of Charters Towers—

Bounded on the North by a line running along the Southern side Great Northern Railway line to the North West corner of Lot R34 in the parish of Millchester.

# Defence Act 1903-1956.

#### **AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.**

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Force, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regula-tion prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made tion prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regula-tion, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command. which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.
