PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. DUNROSSIL Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by virtue of section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1959 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, resume for cultivation purposes any Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine the land described in the Schedule thereto was resumed for cultivation purposes:

And whereas it is necessary that the boundaries of the said land be re-defined:

Now therefore, I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine and resume for cultivation purposes the land described in the Schedule hereto.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1959 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for the purposes of a Forest Reserve, any unalienated Crown Lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of a Forest Reserve, the land described in the Schedule hereto being Crown Land which is unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of a Forest Reserve to be known as Reserve No. 1057.
