Any of such proxies as aforesaid shall be entitled as such proxy to be nominated for and to be elected to and hold any office in the Association. Should such proxy while the holder of any such office be changed he shall be deemed to have and shall vacate such office and his successor as such proxy shall not be entitled ipso facto to hold the office to which his predecessor was elected. No such proxy shall be valid or effecive unless and until the person appointed proxy as aforesaid has been approved as such by a resolution of the member's Branch Committee of Management."


