APPOINTMENT OF COMMANDS.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is provided that the Governor-General may, among other things, appoint any part of Australia to be a Command:

And whereas by an Appointment made the tenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five certain parts of Australia were appointed to be Commands:

And whereas it is now desired to revoke the Appointment so made and to make a new Appointment as hereinafter appears:

Now therefore, I, William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council do hereby revoke the said Appointment made on the tenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and do hereby appoint the following parts of Australia to be Commands:-

Northern Command-

The State of Queensland.

That part of the State of New South Wales consisting of the Counties of Rous and Buller and the Municipality of Casino.

The Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea.

Eastern Command-

The State of New South Wales, other than the parts of that State included in Northern Command, Southern Command or Central Command.

The Australian Capital Territory, including the territory accepted by the Commonwealth under the Jervis Bay Territory Acceptance Act 1915.

Norfolk Island.

Southern Command-

The State of Victoria. The State of Tasmania.

That part of the State of New South Wales consisting of the Shires of Holbrook, Culcairn, Lockhart, Urana, Jerilderie, Conargo, Windouran, Wakool, Hume, Coreen, Berrigan and Murray, the County of Caira, other than the part of that County which is included in the Shire of Waradgery, the Counties of Taila, Wentworth, Tara and Windeyer and all cities, municipalities and towns situated on the Murray River within that State.

Central Command-

The State of South Australia.

That part of the State of New South Wales consisting of the Counties of Menindee, Yancowinna and Farnell.

Western Command-

The State of Western Australia.

Northern Territory Command-The Northern Territory of Australia.


