Defence Act 1903-1956.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, William Shepherd Viscount Dunrossil the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE.

Wingello, New South Wales.

During the period commencing on the seventh day of November, 1960, and ending on the tenth day of December, 1960.

All those pieces and parcels of land in the Parish of Maraulan, County of Argyle and the Parishes of Bumballa, Caoura and Meryla, County of Camden. Bounded in the West by a line commencing at the junction of the Shoalhaven River with the Joarimma or Barbers Creek. Thence North along this Creek to its junction with the South West corner of portion 266 Parish of Wingello, County of Camden. Bounded in the North by a line from the South West corner of portion 266 Parish of Wingello, East along the Northern boundaries of the Parishes of Bumballa, and Caoura, County of Camden, to the junction of this boundary with Bundanoon Creek. Thence North East along this Creek to its junction with Deep or Colyers Creek. Bounded in the East by a line from the junction of Bundanoon and Deep or Colyers Creeks, South along the Eastern boundaries of portions 174 and 191 Parish of Meryla to its junction with a road, thence South along this road to the South West corner of portion 143 Parish of Meryla, thence East along the Southern boundary of portion 143

to its junction with Crankey Creek, thence South along this Creek to its junction with Yarrunga Creek, thence South along this Creek to its junction with the Kangaroo River. From this junction South West along the line of the Kangaroo River to its junction with the Shoalhaven River. Bounded in the South by a line from the junction of the Kangaroo River with the Shoalhaven River West along the River to the point of commencement.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS Nos. 20401-20800 UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Denham Henty, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1959, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109.

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram within twenty-one days of the date of this notification. If the promotion is to an office in:—

- (a) a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State;
- (b) the Australian Capital Territory, with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra, unless the promotion is to a vacancy in the Department of Civil Aviation or the Postmaster-General's Department, when the officer should lodge his appeal with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;

EXAMINATIONS.

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS AT THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY FOR COMMONWEALTH OFFICERS.

APPPLICATIONS are invited from permanent officers of the Commonwealth Service for three Research Fellowships in 1961. The Fellowships will entitle Fellows to spend one year in a Department of the Australian National University.

Eligibility.—Fellowships will be available to senior officers of substantial experience who would benefit from a period of reading and supervised writing on a research topic. The primary purpose of the Fellowships is not to enable officers to obtain a higher degree, but to provide them with the opportunity to make a

worth-while contribution to a particular field of research. The field of research, chosen by the Fellow in conjunction with his Department and the University, must be of interest and benefit to both the University and the Commonwealth Service.

Selection.—Applicants for Fellowships must first obtain sponsorship from their Departments. By sponsoring an officer, Departments indicate their willingness to release him for the period of the Fellowship, and pay him full salary during that period. Departments will then submit their nominations which will then be considered by a selection committee, comprising representatives of the University, Treasury and the Board.

Benefits.—Fellows will receive full salary for the period of the Fellowship. The University will pay cost of the Fellow's travel to Canberra, and will provide accommodation at normal charges for Fellows not resident in Canberra. Single Fellows will live at University House, and married Fellows with families will be provided with furnished houses or apartments. Where sickness or other reasonable causes prevent an officer bringing his family to Canberra, consideration will be given to payment of an allowance similar to that payable under Regulation 97. Fellows engaged in research are entitled to attend seminar groups and discussions within the University in their general fields of interest. Successful officers will take up the Fellowship at the beginning of the academic year in March, 1961.

Conditions.—A Fellow will be expected to produce a written paper on his year's work at the University. He will be required to enter into a bond to remain in the Commonwealth Service for a period of three years after completion of the Fellowship.

Statistics (Professor Moran): Time series analysis; problems of storage and queueing; population theory; theory of genetics; information theory. (Bureau of Census and Statistics, Bureau of Meteorology, general.)

Political Science (Professor Webb and Mr. Parker): Historical development of a selected function of the Commonwealth Government; modes and problems of Commonwealth-State participation in one of the concurrent functions of government; possible scope for greater mobility between Government and private employment in the administrative field; how the Statutory Corporation form affects policy making, and administration in any corporation; the formulation and administration of Australian tariff policy; legal problems of "extra-Constitutional" activities of the Commonwealth, e.g. in research, education, civil aviation control and facilities, regional development, labour relations, e.g. implementing of I.L.O. conventions, employment and vocational guidance services; public health policy; regional structure and administration of selected Commonwealth Departments, e.g. is the State unit the most convenient? possible scope for delegation to Departments of staffing functions under the Public Service Act; administrative problems arising from Public Service Arbitration. Economics (Professor Swan): A suitable research project in many instances would be to take some episode or problem of public policy from the recent past or the present and to analyse its background and implications. (Various departments.)

Economics (Professor Sir John Crawford): This new department is being devoted to the study of economic growth in under-developed areas, with particular reference to South-East Asia. Although the department is interested primarily in building up systematic empirical knowledge of this area, scope exists for studies relating to the development of Australia's economic relations with these regions. Anthropology and Sociology (Professor Barnes): Studies such as "Native Administration in New Guinea and Papua"; the position of aborigines in the Northern Territory and in the States.

Political and economic development in Indonesia and Malaya. (Department of External Affairs.)

International Relations (Mr. Burns): International relations in areas of policy interest to Australia—specifically, South and South-East Asia, the Far East, as regions of principal concern; also (not yet highly developed) N.A.T.O., Britain and the West European powers. Another important field of concern is theory of the international system, and strategic-political questions, e.g. disarmament. (Department of External Affairs, general.)

Biochemistry (Professor Ennor): (1) Biochemistry and the guanidines and their phosphorylated derivatives; (2) Peptide Bond Synthesis; (3) Folic Acid and Thymidine Synthesis.
