Defence Act 1903-1956.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, William Shepherd Viscount Dunrossil the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander

of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE.

Wingello, New South Wales.

During the period commencing on the seventh day of November, 1960, and ending on the tenth day of December, 1960.

All those pieces and parcels of land in the Parish of Marulan, County of Argyle and the Parishes of Bumballa, Caoura and Meryla, County of Camden. Bounded in the West by a line commencing at the junction of the Shoalhaven River with the Joarimma or Barbers Creek. Thence North along this Creek to its junction with the South West corner of portion 266 Parish of Wingello, County of Camden. Bounded in the North by a line from the South West corner of portion 266 Parish of Wingello, East along the Northern boundaries of the Parishes of Bumballa, and Caoura, County of Camden, to the junction of this boundary with Bundanoon Creek. Thence North East along this Creek to its junction with Deep or Colyers Creek. Bounded in the South by a line from the junction of the Kangaroo River with the Shoalhaven River West along the River to the point of commencement.

(iv) section sixty-one and sub-section (3.) of section sixty-nine of the Judiciary Act 1903-1960;

(v) section two hundred and eight, two hundred and sixteen and two hundred and twenty-two of the Bankruptcy Act 1924-1959;

(vi) the Commonwealth Police Act 1957 and the Regulations made under that Act;

(vii) sections thirty-two and seventy of the Companies Act, 1936, of the State of New South Wales, as applied to the Australian Capital Territory and modified by the Companies Ordinance 1954 of the Australian Capital Territory made under the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1959;
