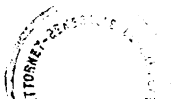

EXAMINATIONS.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE RECRUITMENT, TRAINING AND PROMOTION OF TRAINEE ENGINEERS, DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL AVIATION.

1. **Eligibility.**—Persons eligible to apply for selection as Trainee Engineer are officers of the Third and Fourth Divisions of the Commonwealth Service who—

- (a) have the necessary pre-requisite qualifications for admission to the approved course of study shown in Table I. and have passed the appropriate subjects shown in Table II. (or possess exempting qualification); and
- (b) (i) have had at least four years satisfactory technical or drafting experience and/or training; or
- (ii) have progressed to the stage of the course shown in Table III. or hold exempting qualifications up to that stage;

provided that the qualifications referred to in Tables II. and III. were obtained within a reasonable period preceding the closing date of applications.

An officer who has previously been selected for training for an office of Engineer or Draftsman and whose course of training has been terminated because of unsatisfactory progress will not be eligible for selection.

2. **Conditions of Transfer or Promotion.**—(a) Upon selection, officers of the Commonwealth Service will be transferred or promoted as Trainee Engineer (£400-£968) (S) Third or Fourth Division, Engineering Division with head-quarters at the capital city of the State in which they are to receive their training.

(b) The promotion of an officer to an office of Trainee Engineer, Third or Fourth Division, is subject to the right of appeal under section 50 of the Public Service Act 1922-1960. The transfer of an officer to an office of Trainee Engineer, Third or Fourth Division, shall be subject to a right of appeal in the same manner as if section 50 applied.

Note.—The office of Trainee Engineer shall, while occupied by an officer who has qualified for transfer to the Third Division, be included in that Division and while not so occupied shall be included in the Fourth Division.

3. **How to Apply for Selection.**—Applications should be made in response to a notice published in the Commonwealth Gazette.

4. **Selection.**—The following factors will be taken into account when selections are made:—

- (a) academic qualifications;
- (b) relevant experience, including technical or drafting experience; and
- (c) aptitude for the position of Engineer, Grade 1.

Course of Training.—The period of training will be determined by the stage of entry to the approved course and the minimum time ordinarily required for completion of the course, subject to the conditions in paragraph 14 hereunder. During vacations trainees will be given departmental training.

Where a trainee's rate of salary falls within two or more of the above ranges in a calendar year, the percentage of fees to be refunded will be that shown in relation to the rate of salary received for the greater portion of the year.

8. **Fares.**—Excess fares which are involved in attending the university, technical college or other educational institution will be paid by the department.

9. **Meal Allowance.**—While attending the university or technical college, trainees will be eligible for meal allowance in accordance with the approved conditions.

10. **Salary while in Training.**—Officers will be paid the appropriate salary within the range £400-£968 (S.) An officer whose salary before transfer or promotion was more than £968 (S.) will be paid an allowance to bring his salary as a Trainee Engineer to that which he was receiving at the time of transfer or promotion, provided that the total of such salary and allowance does not exceed the maximum salary of the position of Engineer, Grade 1. Any higher duties allowance which trainees were receiving prior to commencing the course will continue throughout the course subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) The trainee would have continued acting in the higher position had he not been required to undergo full-time departmental training;
- (ii) The total remuneration received, that is, salary and allowance by way of higher duties, shall not exceed the maximum salary of the position of Engineer, Grade 1; and
- (iii) Service during the training period shall not be credited for higher duty incremental purposes.

11. **Hours of Duty.**—Hours of duty of trainees shall be the hours of duty observed at the establishment where they are currently undergoing training.

12. **Promotion under Section 53a.**—Upon satisfactory completion of the required examinations, a trainee will be promoted as Engineer, Grade 1, on 1st January immediately following the final year except that, where supplementary examinations are incurred in the final year, the date of promotion will be 1st April. Promotion will be at the salary payable for the qualifications obtained, except that an officer whose remuneration during training was in excess of this salary will receive the next sub-division within the range above the remuneration he received during training.

Qualified officers may be required to take up duty as Engineer, Grade 1, in any State or Territory.

Promotion is made under the provisions of section 53a of the Public Service Act 1922-1960, and is not subject to appeal.

13. **Contract of Service.**—Each trainee will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth and to be guaranteed by an approved or personal surety for £500 that he will pursue to completion the approved course of training (including examinations) unless permitted by the Board to relinquish it, and continue in the employment of the Commonwealth for a period of three years after completing the training course.

14. **Unsatisfactory Progress.**—If a trainee obtains unsatisfactory results at examinations, or if his progress during the course is otherwise unsatisfactory, the Public Service Board will, unless the officer is dismissed from the Commonwealth Service, decide whether the traineeship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate, or whether the traineeship will be continued under modified conditions.
