Evidence Act 1905-1963.

ORDER UNDER SECTION FOUR.

WHEREAS by section four of the Evidence Act 1905-1963 it is enacted, amongst other things, that all Courts shall take judicial notice-

- (a) of the official signature of any person who holds or has held any office to which the Governor-General, by order published in the Gazette, declares that section to apply;
- (b) of the official seal of every such person; and (c) of the fact that such person holds or has held such office,

if the signature or seal purports to be attached or appended to any judicial or official document:

And whereas it is desirable to declare that that section shall apply to the offices specified in this Order:

Now therefore, I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do, by this Order,

- (a) revoke (except in relation to signatures or seals purporting to have been attached or appended before the date of this Order) the order made under section four of the Evidence Act 1905-1956 on the thirty-first day of January, 1963, and published in the Gazette on the seventh day of February, 1963, on pages 509 to 510;


