COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

AIR EFFICIENCY AWARD.

FURTHER REGULATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN AND OVER THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA IN REGARD TO THE CITIZEN AIR FORCE OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALIAN AIR FORCE.

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Sixth, being desirous of signifying his appreciation of long and meritorious service in his Auxiliary and Volunteer Air Forces, by Warrant under his Sign Manual dated the seventeenth day of August, 1942, instituted and created a medal to be available for officers and airmen of those Forces and to be designated the "Air Efficiency Award" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Award") and directed that the therein following Regulations should govern the said Award:

And whereas His late Majesty by further Warrant under his Sign Manual dated the twenty-seventh day of December, 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "the said Warrant") directed that the aforesaid Regulations be annulled and the Regulations set forth in the said Warrant should henceforth govern the said Award:

And whereas His late Majesty by further Warrant under his Sign Manual dated the twelfth day of April, 1951, (hereinafter referred to as "the said further Warrant") directed that the Regulations set forth in the said Warrant be annulled and that the Regulations set forth in the said further Warrant (hereinafter referred to as "the said Regulations") should henceforth govern the said Award:

And whereas by the said further Warrant it is, amongst other things, prescribed that the said Award shall be conferred under such further regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters, in amplification of the said Regulations, as may, with His Majesty's approval, be issued from time to time by the Governors-General, Governors or officers administering the Government, as the case may be, in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces of His Majesty's respective Dominions, Colonies or Territories under His Majesty's protection:

Now therefore I, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting in pursuance of powers conferred upon me by the said further Warrant, do hereby issue, subject to Her Majesty's approval, the following further Regulations.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

Eligibility.

1. Officers and airmen of the Citizen Air Force of the Royal Australian Air Force shall be eligible for the Air Efficiency Award if—

- they are qualified by service calculated under the provisions of regulation 4 of these Regulations; and
- they are certified by the responsible authorities of the Royal Australian Air Force as efficient and in every way deserving of the award.

Recommendations for the Award.

2. An application or recommendation for the Air Efficiency Award shall be submitted to the Air Board which, if it approves, shall recommend to the Governor-General that the Award should be granted.

Citizen Air Force—Meaning.

3. For the purposes of these Regulations, "Citizen Air Force" includes the following elements:—

- Citizen Air Force flying units;
- Citizen Air Force ground units, including auxiliary squadrons;
- the force known as the Royal Australian Air Force Active Reserve; and
- Royal Australian Air Force university squadrons.

Qualifying Service.

4. The following shall count as "qualifying service" for the purposes of regulation 7 of the Royal Warrant, that is to say service in the Citizen Air Force or partly in the Citizen Air Force and partly in one or more of the forces mentioned in paragraphs (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) of this regulation:—

- (a) subject to paragraph (b), service in the Citizen Air Force under an engagement which commenced on or before 23rd September, 1948—
 - (i) in an aircrew mustering, shall count as time and a half; and
 - (ii) in other than an aircrew mustering, shall count as single time;
- (b) full-time service during World War II under an engagement which commenced before 4th September, 1939—
 - (i) in an aircrew mustering, shall count as treble time during that war; and
 - (ii) in other than an aircrew mustering, shall count as double time during that war;
- (c) service in the Citizen Air Force completed after 23rd September, 1948, and not being full-time service in an aircrew mustering in Japan or Korea during the Korean War, or in Malaya or Singapore during the period of the emergency in Malaya, shall count as single time;
- (d) full-time service in the Citizen Air Force or the Air Force Reserve in an aircrew mustering in Japan or Korea during the Korean War, or in Malaya or Singapore during the period of emergency in Malaya shall count as time and a half;
- (e) service in the Citizen Naval Forces or Active Citizen Military Forces of the Commonwealth, not being service rendered pursuant to Part XII. of the Defence Act 1903-1950 or service rendered under the National Service Act 1951-1957, shall count as single time;
- (f) service on the Active List in the Auxiliary Naval, Military or Air Forces of Great Britain or of a British possession or protectorate or in the Territorial Army of Great Britain, including the Officer Training Corps, where there is a liability for training in peace time, shall count as single time;
- (g) service in the Reserve of the Citizen Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth where there is a liability for annual training in peace time—
 - (i) in an aircrew mustering, where the member has completed his required flying, shall count as three-quarter time; and
 - (ii) in other than an aircrew mustering, shall count as half-time; and
- (h) service in the Permanent Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth during the period 3rd August, 1914, to 12th November, 1918, or during World War II, shall count as single time.

Service Already Reckoned.

5. A period of service for which an Efficiency Decoration or Medal or Long Service and Good Conduct Medal has already been awarded shall not count as qualifying service for the Air Efficiency Award.

Continuity of Qualifying Service.

6. Except as provided in regulation 9 of these Regulations, or as the Governor-General shall otherwise direct, the periods of service which taken together make up a qualifying period shall be continuous.

Actual Service.

7. Service in the Citizen Air Force shall count as "actual service" under regulation 7 of the Royal Warrant.

Definition of World War II, the Korean War and the period of the Emergency in Malaya.

8. For the purpose of these Regulations—

- (a) "World War II" means the war which commenced on 3rd September, 1939, and which for the purposes of these Regulations is deemed to have ceased on 23rd September, 1948;
- (b) "the Korean War" means the warlike operations which commenced on 25th June, 1950, and ceased on 27th July, 1953;
- (c) "the period of the emergency in Malaya" means the period which commenced on 18th June, 1948, and ceased on 31st July, 1960.

Break in Service.

9. For the purposes of regulation 6 of these Regulations, the service of a member shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding any break in that service where the break—

- (a) occurred while the person was in the Royal Australian Air Force Reserve, and did not exceed one year;

- (b) occurred between the date of demobilization or discharge from full-time service during World War II and 30th November, 1951;
- (c) occurred during the full-time service of the member with any of the Permanent Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth during World War II;
- (d) occurred between qualifying service in the forces of any two of the following, that is to say, Great Britain, the Commonwealth, a Territory, a British possession or Protectorate, and did not in any case exceed one year;
- (e) occurred between qualifying service in any Citizen Force of the Commonwealth and did not exceed one year, and in the opinion of the Air Board was excusable; or
- (f) occurred while the member being a member of the Permanent Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth was called out for full-time duties with a United Nations Force during a time of hostilities.

Clasps.

10. The Governor-General on the recommendation of the Air Board may grant a clasp to the Air Efficiency Award for each additional ten years service by a person who has—

- (a) received the Award; and
- (b) completed a further ten years qualifying service as computed in accordance with these Regulations.

Emblem.

11. A rose emblem denoting the award of each clasp shall be worn on the ribbon when the ribbon only is worn.

Register.

12. A register of persons on whom the Air Efficiency Award and clasps thereto have been conferred will be maintained at the Department of Air.

Cancellation of Award.

13. The Governor-General may by order under his hand cancel or annul the grant to any person of the Air Efficiency Award and clasp thereto.

Restoration.

14. The Governor-General may, upon the recommendation of the Air Board, restore an Air Efficiency Award or clasp after the cancellation of a grant thereof.

Notification.

15. A grant, cancellation, annulment or restoration of the Air Efficiency Award or clasp shall be notified in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 72A.

Commonwealth of

Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1.) of section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia—

- (a) of any articles likely, in his opinion, to introduce any infectious or contagious disease, or disease or pest affecting persons, animals or plants; or
- (b) of any animals or plants or any parts of animals or plants;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (2.) of that section that the power of prohibition under that section shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas, by Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A published in the Gazette on the twentieth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, the importation into Australia of certain articles (including animal fodder the importation of which is not prohibited under any proclamation relating to plants, being hay, chaff, straw, cereal grains and pollard derived from wheat) was prohibited either absolutely or with limitations as to places and subject-matter or subject to specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas, by Quarantine Proclamation No. 71A published in the Gazette on the tenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, the importation into Australia of hides and skins of cattle was prohibited subject to the conditions or restrictions specified in that proclamation:

And whereas it is desirable to vary Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A by revoking the prohibition of the importation into Australia of those animal fodders and also to revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 71A, and to make other provision in their stead:

Now therefore I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council—

- (a) vary Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A by revoking the prohibition of the importation into Australia of animal fodder the importation of which is not prohibited or restricted under any proclamation relating to plants, being hay, chaff, straw, cereal grains or bran and pollard derived from wheat;
- (b) revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 71A;
- (c) prohibit the importation into Australia by aircraft—

(i) of any hides and skins of cattle; and

(ii) of any animal fodder derived from plants or parts of plants;
- (d) prohibit the importation into Australia, by means other than aircraft, of hides and skins of cattle from a country other than Canada, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Hebrides, New Zealand, Norfolk Island, the Republic of Ireland, the Territory of Papua, the Territory of New Guinea, Tonga, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America or Western Samoa;
- (e) prohibit the importation into Australia, by means other than aircraft, of hides and skins of cattle from a country specified in the last preceding paragraph unless the importer produces to a Chief Quarantine Officer a certificate certifying that the hides or skins were obtained from cattle slaughtered in that country for the purpose of providing meat for human consumption, being a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon employed

by the Government of that country or by another person employed by that Government who is, in the opinion of a Chief Quarantine Officer, qualified to give the certificate;

- (f) prohibit the importation into Australia, by means other than aircraft, of animal fodder derived from, or containing, plants or parts of plants the importation of which, as plants, is prohibited or restricted under any other proclamation in force under the Quarantine Act 1908 or under that Act as subsequently amended; and
- (g) prohibit, except with the consent of the Minister, the importation into Australia, by means other than aircraft, of animal fodder derived from plants or parts of plants the importation of which, as plants, is not so prohibited—

(i) unless the fodder has been derived from the leaves or stalks or leaves and stalks of the plants and is exported to Australia by those means from New Zealand; or

(ii) unless the fodder consists of cereal grains, or bran and pollard derived from cereal grains, and is exported to Australia by those means from Canada, New Zealand or the United States of America.

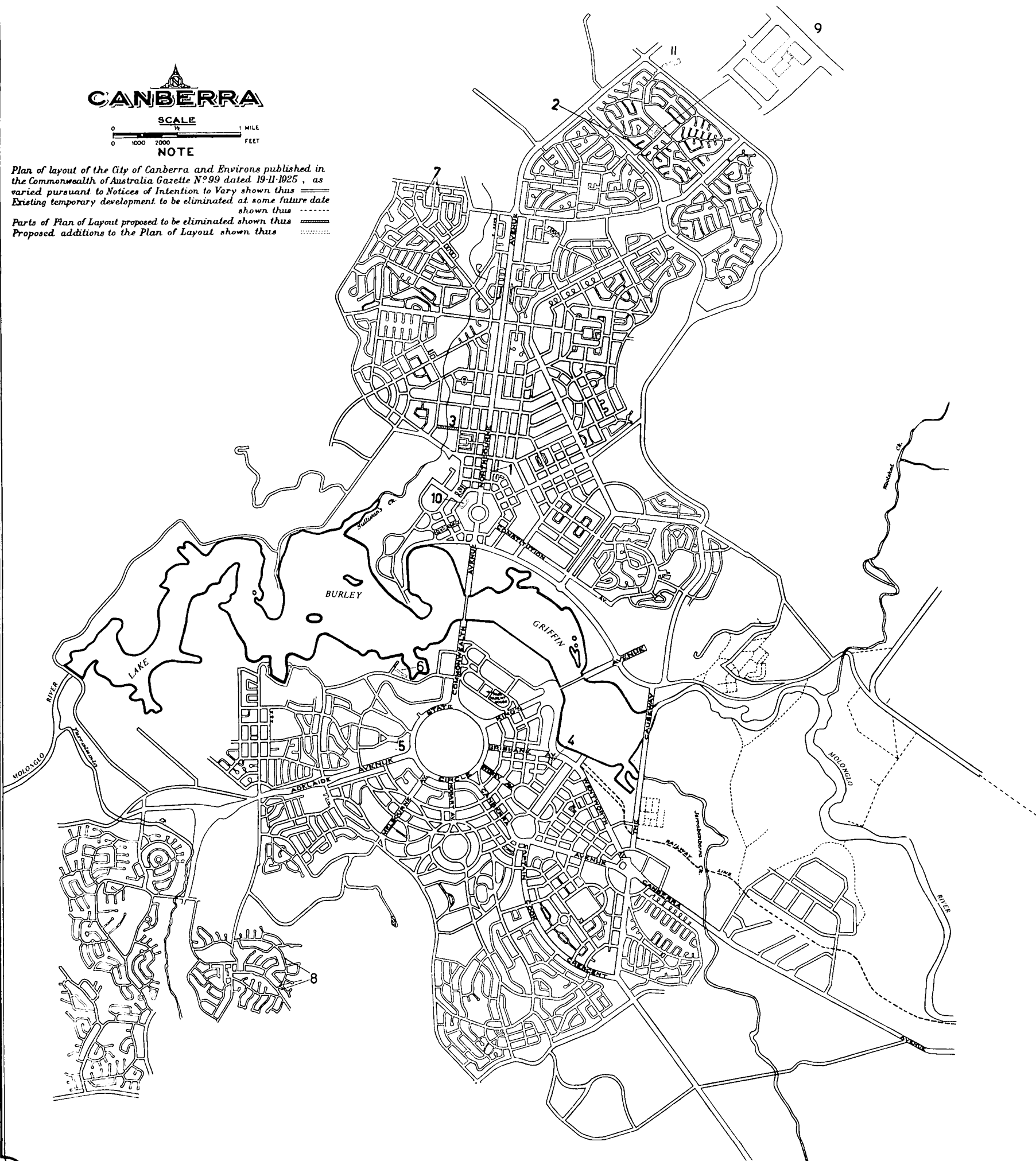

3. Subjects and Pass Conditions.—The examination will comprise a series of suitability tests. Candidates will be required at the examination centre for approximately one and a half hours.

4. If a candidate claims exemption from re-examination in a section or sections of a particular examination, he will not be permitted to contest the same section(s) at that examination.
