COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Imperial Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as amended.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as amended, and all other powers me thereunto enabling, I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby authorize the registrar of British ships at the port of Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, or any officer acting under his control authorized by him, to dispense with the production of a builder's certificate in respect of the Yacht "Anthanta III" (formerly "No-Ke-Aloha"), official number 191170, and any bill of sale relating to any sale of that ship, in connexion with the registration of that ship, upon production of a statutory declaration by Lawrence Charles Gruzman showing to the satisfaction of that registrar or that officer that from any reasonable cause any such document cannot be produced.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Northern Territory Supreme Court Act 1961.

SECTION 51.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2.) of section 51 of the Northern Territory Supreme Court Act 1961 it is provided that an indictable offence triable before the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory of Australia shall be prosecuted by indictment in the name of the Attorney-General or of a person appointed by the Attorney-General in that behalf:

And whereas by sub-section (7.) of that Act it is provided that, where a person is under commitment upon a charge for an indictable offence triable before the Supreme Court, the Attorney-General, or a person appointed by the Attorney-General in that behalf, may decline to proceed further in the prosecution and, if the accused person is in custody, may, by warrant under his hand, direct the discharge of the accused person from custody:

And whereas on the thirteenth day of May, 1961, and on the eighteenth day of July, 1961, respectively, each of the following, namely, Ronald John Withnall, the Crown Law Officer in the Northern Territory, and James Boyd Keith Williams, Principal Legal Officer in the Crown Law Office of the Northern Territory, was appointed to prosecute by indictment in his name indictable offences triable before the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory of Australia and to exercise the powers referred to in sub-section (7.) of section 51 of the Northern Territory Supreme Court Act 1961:

And whereas it is desirable that, in addition to the said Ronald John Withnall and James Boyd Keith Williams, the Crown Solicitor and the First Assistant Crown Solicitor of the Commonwealth be appointed to exercise like powers in respect of indictable offences triable before the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory of Australia:

Now therefore, I, Billy Mackie Snedden, the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by virtue of section 51 of the Northern Territory Supreme Court Act 1961, hereby appoint each of the following, namely, Harold Edward Renfree, Crown Solicitor, and Robert Burns Hutchison, First Assistant Crown Solicitor, to prosecute by indictment in his name indictable offences triable before the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory of Australia, and I hereby further appoint each of the said Harold Edward Renfree and Robert Burns Hutchison as a person who may exercise the powers referred to in sub-section (7.) of section 51 of the Northern Territory Supreme Court Act 1961.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS NOS. 7013-7435 UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Denham Henty, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1963, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XIV. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Schedule lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 64/- series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be shipped to Australia for entry for home consumption on arrival or be entered for home consumption (whichever applicable), if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Tariff Item applying to the goods. Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

 - (b) hereby direct, in pursuance of sub-section (5.) of section 29 of the said Act, that sub-section (3.) of that section shall not apply in relation to the alteration of the classifications of the offices specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this instrument.
