#### CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 1564-1566.

NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, Minister of State 1, for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the following By-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

### THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. 1564.

Item 359 (D)(3).

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1564.
- 2. By-law No. 1144, published in Gazette No. 21, dated 7th March, 1963, as amended, is further amended by-

  - (a) deleting from the list of goods in paragraph (3) to which Tariff Item 359 (D)(3) applies, the reference to "Bearings, ball, when not &c.,"
    (b) adding to the list of goods in paragraph (3) to which Tariff Item 359 (D)(3) applies, the following:—
    Bearings, ball, other than precision ground steel, when not fitted to any other component.

#### By-law No. 1565.

Item 449 (A) (1).

  - (a) deleting from the list of goods in Section 2 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Hand Tools, &c.", the reference to "Snips, jewellers'"
  - (b) adding to the list of goods in Section 2 to which Tariff Item 449 (a) (1) applies, under the heading "Hand Tools, &c.", the following:—

    Snips, of the compound leverage type, capable of cutting mild steel sheet of 0.049 inch thickness (sheet

metal-working).

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1566.
- 2. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Foil", the following:—

Aluminium, backed with vegetable parchment paper, for use in the wrapping of butter, under security.

Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961. NOTICE UNDER SECTION 7.

N pursuance of Section 7 of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and In pursuance of Section 7 of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961, I, Norman Henry Denham Henty, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby notify that, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, I am satisfied that Aluminium Foil has been or is being sold to an importer in Australia at an export price which is less than the normal value of the goods at the date of exportation and that injury may thereby be caused or threatened to an Australian industry.

This notice may be cited as "Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 20" and shall have effect in relation to all such goods entered for home consumption on and after 13th February, 1963.
