Defence Act 1903-1956.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reasons of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE.

New South Wales.

Jervis Bay/Tianjara.

During the period commencing on the 5th day of September 1964 and ending on the twenty sixth day of October 1964.

Those pieces and parcels of land described hereunder:—

1. That area in the Parish of Bherwerre, County of St. Vincent, commencing at the junction of Hyam's Beach Road and Jervis Bay Road, near the north-west corner of Portion 8; bounded in the north by Hyam's Beach Road for a distance of about one half mile, in the east by a line bearing 180 degrees for a distance of 1600 yards, in the south by a line bearing 270 degrees to Jervis Bay Road and in the south-west by that road to the point of commencement.

2. That area in the Parishes of Nowra and Yerrinong, County of St. Vincent, bounded in the north by portion 1, Parish of Nowra, in the east by Portions 145, 282 and 284 in the Parish of Nowra, thence by the defence property known as HMAS "Albatross", thence by the New Braidwood Road; in the south by the road running west from Portion 30, Parish of Yerrinong, in the west by Portions 13 and 14, Parish of Yerrinong, thence by Saltwater Creek to the point of commencement.

3. That area being portion of a strip of country extending 2000 yards either side of the Braidwood Road from the Commonwealth Proof Range in the Parish of Tianjara, north easterly to a line extending east and west through the Yerrinong Trig Station (795) in the Parish of Yerrinong, County of St. Vincent.

The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.
