KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for 1, Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the Customs Tariff (Primage Duties) 1934-1958, hereby add, as from the seventeenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, to the list of goods upon which primage duty at the rate of five per centum ad valorem is imposed such of the goods as are specified in the Schedule to this Order as are not, at that date-

(i) exempt from primage duty; or

# Customs Act 1901-1963.

## CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 1648-1650.

KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the following By-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

## THE SCHEDULE.

By-law No. 1648.

Item 178 (B) (3).

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1648.
- 2. Item 178 (B) (3) of the Customs Tariff 1933-1964, as proposed to be altered, applies to Internal combustion piston engines, as follows:-

Exceeding 8 brake horse-power, for incorporation in or the manufacture of tractors (other than of the crawler or creeper type) of the type not covered by Tariff Item 177 (B)(2) incorporation in or the manufacture of crawler or creeper tractors, under security.

# By-law No. 1649.

Item 178 (B) (3) (b).

- This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1649.
   By-law No. 794, published in Gazette No. 63 of 26th July, 1962, is revoked.

## By-law No. 1650.

Item 449 (a) (1).

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1650.
- 2. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by-
  - (a) deleting from the list of goods in Section 1 to which
    Tariff Item 449 (A)(1) applies, under the heading
    "Miscellaneous machines and appliances—Engines,
    internal combustion—Parts—" the reference to "First
    set of spare parts for crude oil engines which are
    admissible, etc."
  - (b) deleting from the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, the reference to "Instruments, drawing and mathematical, etc."

(c) adding to the list of goods in Section 1 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Miscellaneous machines and appliances—Engines, internal combustion—Parts—" the following:—

First set of spare parts for crude oil engines which are admissible under Tariff Item 177 (B) (1) (a) or 178 (B) (3) provided such parts are imported with and sold with the engine to the actual user, under

(d) adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, the following:

Instruments, drawing, marking-out, mathematical cal-

culating or measuring, as follows:-

Precision compasses

Precision dividers

Sets thereof, otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item 433, containing precision compasses or precision dividers.
